

THE LABOR "SITUATION"

Cyrus S. Ching is retiring as head of the
ederal mediation and conciliation service.

trangely enough, he isn't at all pessimistic.

First of all, he doesn't think there is any First of all, he doesn't think there is any labor situation," the way most people think

Two hundred and fifty thousand labor contracts are signed in the United States every year. Mr. Ching observed. Nearly all are signed without a line of them ever getting in the papers.

All labor disturbances, Mr. Ching believes, are part of the American tradition of free-dom.

Although freedom is the important thing in it, it necessarily is inefficient at times. The United States government, because it is used to the inefficient in the world, he declares. Mr. Ching goes on to explain his philosophy aging that it is this very freedom that has een responsible for the growth and the declapment of this country. If metters were no arranged that there

If matters were so arranged that there ere no labor disturbances, if all strikes were appreased, then he would want to start taking the system apart to see what was the atter with it. ng the system apart to see what was the natter with it. Having spent over 30 years in labor relations

Having spent over 30 years in labor relations— most of it on management's side as an exe-cutive of the U. S. Rubber company—Mr. Ching thinks things are a lot better than they used to be. He remembers the dark days of 1934 to 1937, when almost anybody could start a labor union.

start a labor union.

A lot of people became union officials then
who would make old Sam Gompers, father
of the American union labor movement, after
over in his grave. And the people in management who had to deal with labor relacions, knew no more about it than the union.

tions, when he do deal with most relations, where no more about it than the unionbouse.
Today Mr. Ching believes there is more maturity on both sides. But neither labor union
officials nor management know how to use
mediation, asy a knowledge and the representatives
that that mediators have to be on their
side all the time to be any good. And that
he considers wrong.

There is a number of fabor problems to
which Mr. Ching says he does not know the
solution, in spite of all his experience in this
field. One of these problems involves the
blig industrial unions—steel, coal, rubber
workers, auto workers and the like.
By their size, these unions have the power
of industry-wide bargaining on their side,
though there is no similar power in industry-wide bargaining on their part of management. This situation, says Mr. Ching, tends
to squeeze out the little fellow in abor and
the little fellow in business. This condition
in the halthful, but what to do about it,
Mr. Ching says he does not know.

He thinks the General Motors cost-of-living escalator clause and its annual productivyl increase were excellent—for General
Motors. But they are not applicable to all
industries, and they are not applicable to all

iution fo all labor problems.

It is time to take a good look at all our labor laws, Mr. Ching declares. He does not hink the Tait-Hartley law is as bad as lator thinks it is, nor as good as management thinks it is. But a new approach—looking at all labor questions as problems in human relations—might do some good.

LOW VOTE IN U. S.

The National Conference on Citizenship which held its seventh annual convention in Washington made a great point about the need for getting out the vote in the November election.
