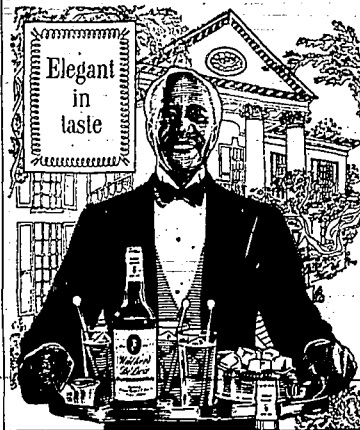

"ORIENTAL HORDES"
The major military development of the war in Korea, according to no less an authority than the commanding general of the United States Eighth Army, has been the emergence of Asiatic armies as hard-hitting, professional fighting forces.

At the outbreak of the war and previously, the outstanding characteristic of an Asiatic army was its almost total reliance on man-power. Battles were mainly by force of numbers, with the oriental commander often willing to spend 10 lives to kill one United Nations soldier.

But the Korean conflict has brought a stark changeover to modern tactics based on cunning and improved use of firepower. The American-trained South Korean army is now considered a first-rate fighting force, far superior to the South Korean army that so often proved unreliable in the early stages of the war. And the Chinese and North Korean army is only slightly less proficient.

The communists have learned much by observing and successfully imitating western war methods. They have shown an amazing ability to capture weapons, no matter how complicated. And equally important, they've also been able to produce the necessary ammunition to turn our weapons against us.

A striking result in enemy tactics has been great increases in volume and accuracy of mortar and artillery fire. The Reds have caught on quickly to the value of massed firepower. And when massed firepower is complemented by massed and expendable manpower, the threat is serious.

Defensively, the enemy's ingenuity has enabled him to continue his military supply build-up despite the fact that United Nations firepower has been so effective. The Chinese and North Korean economies enables the enemy to scatter his repair yards and small factories in the hatched huts of rural villages, thus avoiding centralized groups that could be severely damaged in one large bombing attack.

And second, vast slave manpower makes it possible for the Reds to maintain 5,000- and 6,000-man labor battalions which can be immediately mobilized for repairs.

As added insurance against air attacks, as well as atomic warfare, the communists have turned North Korea into a veritable hive of elaborate trenches and underground tunnels, where guns, ammunition and spare parts can easily be hidden.

In short, the modernization of warfare in the far east, begun by the Japanese, is rapidly reaching a climax. As yet, we can still outfight the best that the communists have been able to throw at us. But the day when we conquer Asiatic hordes—as mere "oriental hordes" is long past.

TUCKER'S NATIONAL WHIRLIGIG

WASHINGTON—Diplomatic analysis of Stalin's schemes as foreshadowed at the recent communist Congress in Moscow provides a picture of the man for whom the embattled West is watching.

The conduct of the red carnival has dispelled any belief that Stalin intends to relinquish control of the party or government, though he has advanced Malinikov as the top communist politician and Molotov as the polemic spokesman for the party.

It is significant that the Soviet press had made no mention about Anglo-American speculation on the possibility of a communist success. In Russia, editors don't dare to speculate on this subject.

STALIN DOES — Stalin remains as boss, wisest or ironclad. His slender ambitions for world-wide expansion of Russia's totalitarian and authoritarian system stand as the permanent marching order. He will wait upon circumstances to determine whether he shall seek to achieve his goal by continued cold wars or by hot wars.

Regardless of which avenue toward world domination he chooses, he looks on in parade. So long as his world war II ally and benefactor stands as a "stronghold" and inspiration, he will not be a Stalin dream.

This is the bad news as such students of Russia's behavior as Ambassador George F. Kennan and Secretary Acheson-revise Russia's latest demonstration of her aim.

WAR IN RUSSIA—Details of Stalin's program for war in Russia are being discussed and world congress encourage western experts to believe he is talking through his hat, as if frequently has before. He is so sure of himself that he wants to prepare his people for further hardships and sacrifices.

HOW THINGS APPEAR FROM PEGLER'S ANGLE

WASHINGTON—The Republican national committee has been quick to welcome Joe McCarthy to go up and Massachusetts

even if Joe could pull him through there are a number of those specimens of political degradation such as Mr. Smith, Maine; Irving H. Park, Oregon; Truman H. Hays, California, and of course, Tom Dewey.

The fact is that Joe McCarthy is one of the most popular Republicans in the country, with his own bad wagon capable of cutting far beyond the border of his own Wisconsin. Other Republicans need his help and have more claim on his side and energy than Lodge.

These notes on the Republican side of the senate in the years ahead would be of the same intrinsic importance and much more reliable than Lodge's have been in the past. Jenner and Kern and Cain are good Republicans with a legitimate place in the national committee, which seems determined to run the Eisenhower campaign on the "I" would rather be wrong than President!"

The committee wants McCarthy's help but the yellow bums don't want to be seen with him.

Of course, Joe Kennedy, as a former Democrat, must cope with prejudice and traditions of regularity which sometimes put a man in a nasty fix, as when Jack thought he had to join the official roster of the government or anywhere else.

And they don't quibble about "methods" in fighting them. The best Joe McCarthy could get out of such a foray, then, would be a slight loss of prestige in fronting for a loser who has built up his own trust in his weakness.

Why should McCarthy inject himself into a situation in which the best he can get personally is the worst of it, to try to carry a man who would ruin him?

The same criticism would apply to a foray into Massachusetts by Joe

McCarthy on behalf of Senator Lodge. Every Republican voter there will remember that Lodge was one of the foremost four-fifths of the hypocritical-Dewey crop at Chicago which sent loud-wagons through the streets scolding him.

Why doesn't he yell for Tom Dewey to come up and save him from the yellow bums? Why does he want a man who uses the wrong "methods" against voters?

Kennedy wouldn't put on a gamut of a globe-trotting, if Joe McCarthy should offer to go up there and strike a few blows in his name.

Kennedy is anti-red, though a Democrat, which is possible to a real American, and he will agree with anyone who argues, as Joe McCarthy does, that you can't tangle with a stunk and come out of it smelling like a barber-shop.

Kennedy would be glad to exhort McCarthy on a platform in South Boston and the only consideration that prevents that is Joe McCarthy's loyalty, not any hypocrisy on Jack's part.

Lodge's trouble is that he lacks the manhood to be a real Republican. To be a Republican, a man must endorse the constitution and carry the fight to all those who would wreck it whether by constitutional fraud known as civil rights, the withholding law, the important means and means known as the labor movement, or the United Nations.

That's the most approximate Republican we have and the Republican senators under the worst attack may be in the worst danger are the men who have refused least to the clamor of the important means of water.

The experience is not unique, but I find it hard to be honest in these political problems and loyal to my political ideals at the same time.

Being a Democrat, Kennedy respects everything that I detest and the field of union monopoly over labor, union treason expressed in

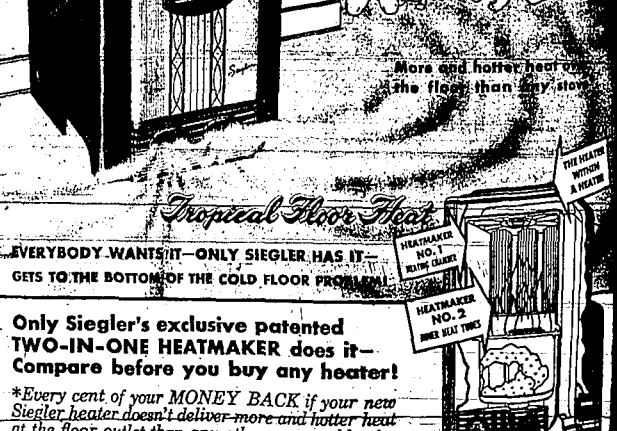

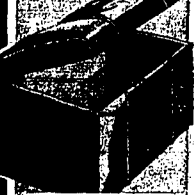

U. S. Ready to Hit Reds With Atom Devices

WASHINGTON, Oct. 10 (AP)—The military is getting ready to hand the Chinese reds an atomic clubbing any time it gets the word. Whether that word will be sought or given cannot, as of today, be forecast. But America did some atomic muscle-flexing yesterday that can hardly be ignored either by the communists already warring against the United Nations in Korea or by any others plotting similar aggression. Military Prepared A high defense official said the military is prepared to recommend use of atomic weapons in Korea when and if the right sort of target develops. The army publicly demonstrated a battery of atomic cannon and announced it also is perfecting atomic missiles for "close support" of ground forces on the battlefield. The U. S. military has relied solely on the air force for delivery of its atomic bombs since the atomic bombing of Hiroshima and Nagasaki. It is now on record as saying it, too, can give an atomic force to ground forces.

Plans Use First If atomic violence should be looked upon as the start of a new phase in the form of a bomb dropped by planes. This country has a lot of atomic bombs in its arsenal. But the defense official made it clear the military has not yet produced atomic warheads for use in the Korean war, the official said. The military will be hesitant to ask a presidential okay.

Nixon Assails Adlai for His Aiding of His

EN ROUTE WITH NIXON, Oct. 10 (AP)—Sen. Richard M. Nixon criticized Gov. Adlai B. Stevenson today for characterizing his opposition to Alger Hiss as the vice-presidential candidate's campaign special interest. "When Adlai Stevenson testified under oath concerning the Hiss case, he said that Hiss, there was far more than a reasonable doubt in the American mind that that soon-to-be-convicted traitorous spy," Nixon said.

Repeated Blasts In a tour of six cities across southern Illinois yesterday, the GOP vice-presidential candidate repeatedly referred to the "character question" and the statement of 20 prominent attorneys of both political parties. Stevenson should not be "criticized or probed" for his action. Other lawyers refused to testify for Alger Hiss, Nixon said. "And some took the witness stand against him, among those... was John Foster Dulles."

Twisted Impression The lawyers' statement in behalf of Stevenson, later criticized by a New York law firm, said Nixon's assertion that Stevenson "testified voluntarily" was "entirely untrue because the Illinois governor 'did what any good citizen should have done under the circumstances.'"

Fall Injuries Are Fatal to Prisoner

BOISE, Oct. 10 (AP)—Lee Cantfield, who was suffering 10 years of voluntary manslaughter, died Wednesday night of injuries received at the Idaho state penitentiary earlier in the day. He was 42. Warren L. E. Clapp said Cantfield fell 25 feet from a concrete floor while attempting to put in a window at a cell block. Cantfield collapsed a year ago last spring to shooting James Coughlan, 46, Yakima, Wash., and leaving his body slumped in the Paradise-Caldwell highway. A motorist who stopped when a firecracker crashed into the windshield of his car found Coughlan's body six weeks later. The serial hunter on a broken whiskey bottle found near his body was the clue that led police to Cantfield's arrest in Pasco, Wash., April 11, 1949.

He said the increase would be used to defray cost of a new \$10 million teamsters headquarters building in Washington, D. C., expand the union's organizing program and pay for research salaries to union executives which have been approved.

Prolonged Fall Proving Boon To Highway Maintenance Jobs

BOISE, Oct. 10 (AP)—Road maintenance crews are taking advantage of Idaho's prolonged Indian summer to get highway work in good condition for winter. Earle V. Miller, state highway engineer, said today. "Oiling crews already have worked two weeks longer than anticipated and have about completed their scheduled work," he said. Maintenance men are now repairing shoulders and ditches, opening drainage systems and preparing highways for the winter months. "Generally the roads are in very acceptable condition," Miller said. "There is no evidence of broken stretches that haven't been repaired." Miller said the state's experiment with contracting for maintenance work in eastern Idaho had proved successful and similar contracts probably would be let next summer. The continued good weather has made it possible for construction work to continue longer than normal also, he said. "The department programmed about eight million dollars worth of road construction for this year and contracts have been let for only four contracts," Miller said. The department hoped to call for bids on these before the end of the year. They are replacing two narrow bridges over Rock creek just west of Twin Falls on U. S. 30, construction of one and three-fourth miles near Cole creek just west of Boise on U. S. 30, 2 1/2 miles of new road on the Pine Creek-Smelterville road just west of Kellogg which will be paid the Smelterville business district and eight and one-half miles of new road between the Utah state line and Malad City. Miller also explained some new ideas being created saying "Temporary asphalt surface—a state construction step to stretch your road dollars."

"That means," he said, "the road is only an asphalt surface treatment which isn't expected to be permanent." "A lot of people regard the surface treatment as a permanent pavement, and can't understand why they crack up the next year," he said. Miller said that by giving a thin surface to the base, the department can detect weak spots in the sub-grade and repair them before applying the permanent pavement. Also, it's much cheaper and sometimes lasts as long as five or six years with additional seal coating. Many roads are completed too late in the summer to give a permanent pavement.

Hollywood Calls Off Yule Parade

HOLLYWOOD, Calif., Oct. 10 (AP)—Santa Claus, filmland style, isn't coming to Hollywood boulevard this year. The Hollywood Merchant's Association has called off the famed Santa Claus lane parade because it felt the \$20,000 cost could be used better for other things. For 25 years the street's biggest stars participated in the Santa Claus lane parade on Nov. 28 when the boulevard's Christmas lights were turned on. As many as 100,000 persons watched the first parade, followed by similar parades with film personalities for the month preceding Christmas. Thomas H. Smoot, president of the merchant group, said the boulevard would be decorated at a cost of \$30,000 as usual but the parade was off. Ceremonies, however, will be held Nov. 28 when the lights are turned on. "Santa Claus" and the surface treatment prevents the base from being damaged by winter weather.

Plot Is Foiled by Indo-China Police

"The raiders, acting on a tip from an unidentified source, also seized two 625 gun, nine homemade grenades and a revolver."

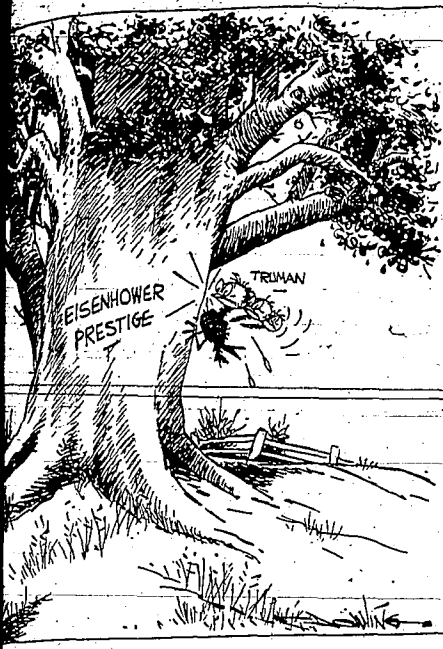

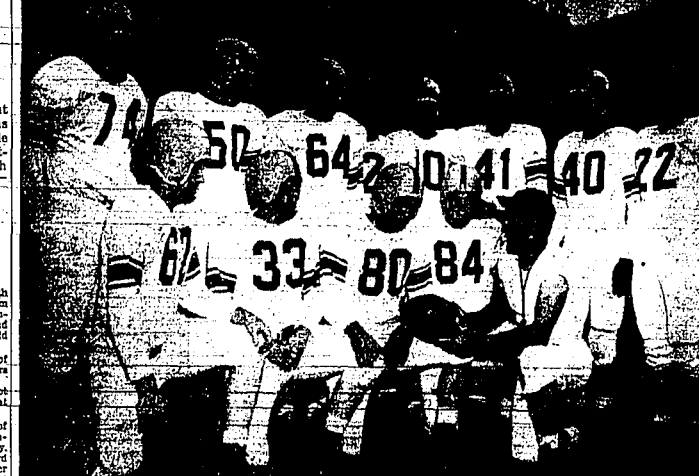

The Idahoan said he has been asked to speak at Jacksonville Oct. 21 and at another Florida city before flying to South Carolina and then to New Orleans.

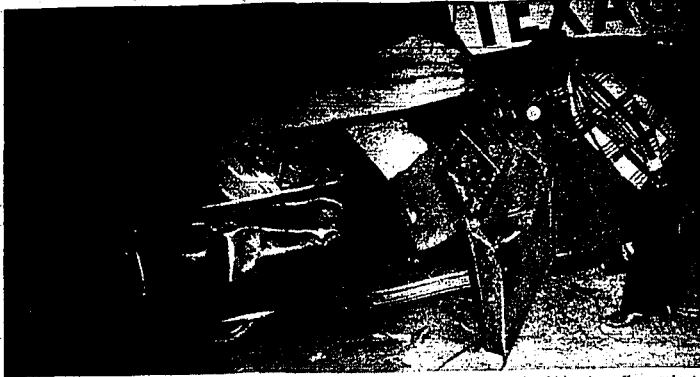
"We have a definite chance of capturing Florida and South Carolina," the senator declared. "And we have a possibility of winning in Tennessee and Virginia."

Wyland Brooks, Republican national committee chairman from 1924 to 1928, has acknowledged he received money from a special fund to pay off expenses during the entire eight years he served in the U. S. senate. Brooks recently demanded that Gov. Alden Stevenson withdraw from the presidential race because of the special fund he used to help promote state officials he considered underpaid.

Brooks served as senator from this state from 1920 to 1928. He refused to say how much money he received from the special fund. He said it came from the "Republican citizens finance committee of Illinois."

Acknowledge Report He acknowledged he had told the St. Louis Post-Dispatch the amount he received was "considerably less" than \$200,000. "It sounds more than the way I felt it," Brooks said. "They asked me how much. I told them specifically. So they asked me was it less than \$200,000. I said yes. It was considerably less."

The Post-Dispatch said Brooks had "admitted" receiving help from the fund.

Explained Fund "I don't know where they got that admitted," he said. "I told at the time the fund in special funds." Brooks read from a speech he said he had delivered on Oct. 8 at a meeting of Chicago's third ward Republican organization.

In the speech, Brooks criticized the Democrats for an "unfair attempt to discredit" the Republican presidential nominee by disclosing the \$17,000 fund which paid part of Richard M. Nixon's office expenses.

Nevada Voters Still Amazed at Upset by 31-Year-Old Aspirant

RENO, Nev., Oct. 14 (AP)—Nevada voters still are incredulous that a 31-year-old "political upstart" who upset the state's strongest political machine a month ago and now is trying to shove Oreste W. Malone out of the U. S. senate on Nov. 4.

Nevada also has a hot contest for its single seat in congress before Rep. Walter Haring 41 seeks his third term on the Democratic ticket, and Republican Cliff Young, a 31-year-old Reno attorney seeking his first office. Both are veterans of World War II.

This contest has followed the national trend. Haring stresses his support of the administration's more popular programs and Young makes bitter attacks upon President Truman and his administrators, the corruption issue and the Korean fighting.

But most of the attention is focused upon Thomas B. Meachling, a young Washington newsmagazine victor who has been in Nevada for eight months ago.

Tom Meachling, as he calls himself, is a likeable young man with a ready grin. He amazed the nation in September by beating Governor Alan Gibb for the Democratic senate nomination by 41,000 votes.

Bible, one of the most popular Democrats in Nevada, held the position of the state senate until the death of Sen. Pat McCarran and his nomination had been believed a certainty.

Meachling achieved his victory by ringing doorbells and talking with more than 80,000 of Nevada's 91,028 registered voters. He appeared in public to answer any question anyone wanted to ask and he made a blistering attack upon what he called "the McCarran machine."

Malone won his senate seat six years ago largely because of a nationwide anti-union fight within Democratic ranks and many observers believe Meachling's upset primary triumph was so bitterly resented by McCarran supporters that Malone may benefit again in November.

McCarran has refused bluntly so far to discuss Meachling although he has been endorsed by the regular state Democratic organization.

Numerous Republicans have said they plan to vote for Meachling, explaining they are displeased with Malone's voting record.

There are 33,028 registered Democrats and 30,091 Republicans in the state but Nevada frequently crosses party lines and votes for personalities.

Today, for example, Nevada has a Republican governor and an attorney and a Democratic senator and congressman.

Meachling is engaged in a hard-hitting attack upon Malone, a World War II veteran with ODS service, he has dared Malone—World War I veteran with overseas service—to reveal his income since he entered the senate. The challenge has not been answered.

He has his particularly hard act when he calls Malone's "17th century viewpoint" as shown by his voting record—and at the frequent criticisms made of Malone's habits and actions on the senate floor.

To date, Malone has ignored Meachling completely. Instead, he has concentrated mainly on the argument his senatorly coup with a GOP victory in November would mean a Republican return and again with vituperous attacks upon President Truman's administration.

He also has stressed heavily his opposition to being federal power Nevada from neighboring California and to bring the state the first commercial atomic power plant.

Arco Aid Seen

BOISE, Oct. 16 (AP)—H. G. Clark, sanitary engineer with the state public health department, reports the village of Arco may receive about \$48,000 in federal aid for improvements to its water system.

The village has completed applications for the aid but has deferred any request for federal assistance for construction of a sewer system until his needs are determined by further study.

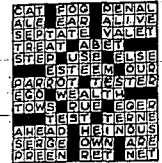

Hints on FREEZING & WRAPPING
Follow these suggestions developed by the Department of Agriculture to help you use the "right" packaging material. Outer paper wrapping is too thick to turn your meat dry and rancid. High laminated papers make good wrapping. You shop in a Safeway equipped with a service meat department, you may freeze meats just as you buy them already wrapped in plastic.
