**One of Nation's Hottest Races For Senate Noted in Montana**

HELENA, Mont., Oct. 17 (AP)—One of the nation's hottest senatorial campaigns features this year's election in Montana. The senatorial battle is between incumbent Republican Sen. N. E. McFall and the oil farmer from Manhattan, Mont., and his Democratic opponent, William E. Frazer, a former history professor at Montana State university.

McFall is seeking his second term in the senate. He went there in 1946 after being left Erikson, Helena, who had defeated Sen. Burton K. Wheeler in the 1946 Democratic primary.

Manstfield coasted to five easy victories as one of Montana's representatives in congress. But he was running in the state's first congressional district which has in traditionally Democratic western Montana.

He may find it tougher sailing in the senatorial battle where voters in eastern Montana will have to be considered. That section of the state usually sends Republican representatives to congress.

McFall is the only Republican ever elected to the United States senate by direct vote of the people of Montana. His predecessors were named by the state legislature under the old system of choosing senators.

McFall has been a member of the house foreign affairs committee for almost 10 years. In 1949 he turned down a chance to become assistant secretary of state for public affairs.

McFall was elected to the state legislature in 1926. He received an appointment as assistant attorney general after his legislative tour and served in the army in World War II. He has held the supreme court associate justice in 1946.

McFall is a veteran of World War I and served as Montana's attorney general from 1921 to 1925. He also served on the state supreme court, being appointed to the high

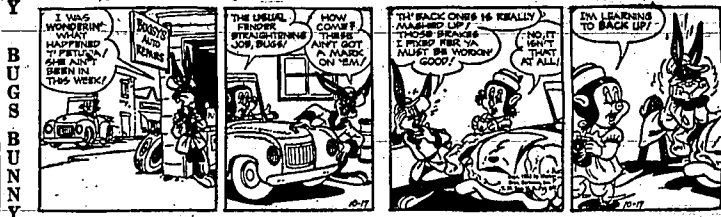

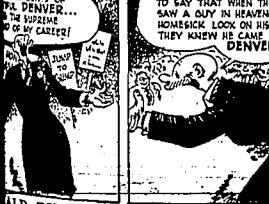

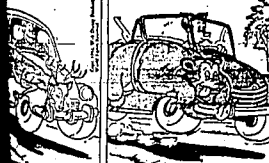

### Texas Demos Assail Threat Of 'Reprisals'

AUSTIN, Tex., Oct. 17 (AP)—Hints of reprisals against Texas Democrats by the national party chairman brought angry retorts from two top officials Thursday as he urged the national campaign thrust into the state.

Blasts by Gov. Allan Shivers and U. S. Rep. James D. Daniel answered a statement Wednesday by Democratic National Chairman Stephen Mitchell.

Scotts at "Reprisals"

Daniel, mentioned by name in Mitchell's statement, is that only in Russia one needs to fear political reprisals. He said there's nothing the chairman can do that would make him stop supporting Republican Presidential nominee Dwight D. Eisenhower. He wired his reply to Mitchell.

Shivers, who also has announced support of Eisenhower last week, said Mitchell is the ones he hopes to remove from high government position by plugging in the Republican.

Go In Book

### State Benefits Hike Effective

BOISE, Oct. 17 (AP)—Idaho public assistance recipients are getting increased benefits, effective with their October check, on the basis of a new cost study.

Bill Child, commissioner of public assistance, said the new study will average about 45% a case.

The new public assistance benefits are based upon the actual price of the recipient with food, clothing and household expenditures considered as necessary costs. Child said the varying conditions of each recipient will result in differences in the amount-of-increase received.

Child said the state's cost-study completed the latter part of August, and a 3 per cent increase in the amount of living in Idaho since last March. When reviewing the assistance benefit payments in the future cost of living increase is taken into consideration, he explained.

The public assistance benefit payments to recipients also receiving social security benefits also are being revised. Child said the increase amended the social security act to increase the benefits under old age and survivors insurance. The social security primary benefit was increased about 45%.

### Navy Cosmic Tests Return Wanted Data

WASHINGTON, Oct. 17 (AP)—The navy announced last night it has launched rockets from giant balloons, high above the north geomagnetic pole, and sent them to altitudes of about 60 miles—literally above the top of the world.

The instruments-laden balloons, built as 10-story buildings, were released from the coast guard cutter Zerkow in the Tinian bay, west of northern Greenland.

The soaring rockets radiated cosmic radiation measurements at the one point on the globe where the earth's magnetic field has the least influence on incoming cosmic ray particles.

Lengthy Task

It will take scientists months to tabulate and interpret the information obtained.

The 40 miles is the greatest height known to have been reached in these latitudes," the navy said.

The navy also sent photographic "nuclear emulsion" plates about the balloons to altitudes of about 30,000 feet, or 17 miles.

Photo Taken

The valuable photographic plates carried in the balloons were seen to parachute safely to earth. One set landed on a small island west of Greenland and the other on the Greenland icecap within 10 miles of the geomagnetic pole.

Fourteen balloons, ranging in diameter from 55 to more than 100 feet, were launched from a flight deck on 60 feet square. It was the first time this has been done from a vessel as small as an icebreaker.

The rockets were suspended beneath the balloons and were fired almost vertically after they had been lifted "up through most of the earth's atmosphere."
