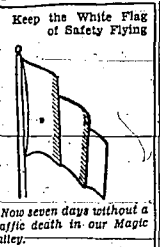



### MORE "SUBSTITUTES"

Synthetic cheese, synthetic milk and synthetic ice cream... made from vegetable oils.

National Milk Producers' federation officials from the dairy states have been meeting in Washington to plan their strategy in the new trade war.

The Institute of Shortening and Edible Oils, which is the trade association for the vegetable fat industry, will say nothing for the record.

The principal arguments advanced in favor of the vegetable oil substitutes, synthetics and imitations of the dairy products is that they are from a third to a half cheaper.

At the present time there are federal laws and regulations setting these standards. Any cheese made from vegetable oils...

Filled milk is also under federal law. Filled milk is ordinarily made by the addition of cheaper vegetable fats to the milk.

There are at present only limited federal standards for ice cream, and this is the opening which milk producers in the vegetable oil industry wish to take for more active competition to win the market.

So far, the vegetable oil industry has made no move to get federal authority in the new standards for the use of their products in synthetic dairy products.

"LOW COST" KILLING We got small social and no pleasure whatsoever from a report on the doings of a particular British scientist.

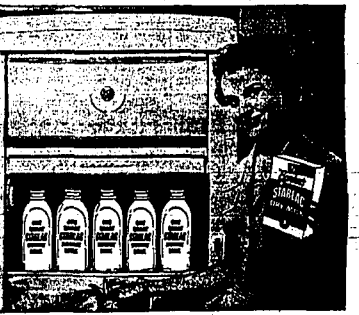

PCC Begins to Show Pride In Three High-Ranking Teams, All Still Unbeaten

LOS ANGELES, Oct. 21 (AP)—The Pacific Coast conference, not much given to chest thumping in recent years, is slightly puffed up—perhaps pardonably—over its three all-winning teams, California, Southern-California, and UCLA.

Trouble is, at the end of next Saturday's play there may be no perfect records in the PCC.

California and SC travel here in an important game that could wind up a tie; UCLA travels to Madison to meet Wisconsin, one of the Big 10's best.

All of the coast's Rose bowl contenders have played five games without the slightest slip. California, the most impressive, is currently, has led by 177 points to its opponents. SC has scored 126 to a mere 19 for the opposition. UCLA somewhere in between, has a 77 second place record.

The Trojans of SC, who apparently have been trying to prove the point that defense can be a potent offense have allowed one touchdown apiece to Washington State, Oregon Navy and Oregon State and blanked Northwestern and Army. Their most effective weapon has been the intercepted pass.

Sparked by Jim Sears, the Trojans showed signs of getting the running game started in Oregon State last week, but hardly enough to compete with California's roughed game of back-of-the-field. Led by Johnny Olson, the Bears have allowed out 174 yards in their five games.

Even Jess Hill, Bob Cochran, who will have to score five times to beat the Bears, is a confident. The massive Trojan line can halt the Bears at any time. UCLA's stock rose with its 24-14 win over Stanford. The fact that the Bears are leading the conference in scoring is a reflection of UCLA's opposition—Oregon, TCU, Washington and Rice. The Bears might be a shade stronger than that faced by Cal or SC.

The Bruins, like SC, have shown themselves a recalcitrant bunch, quick to convert breaks into touchdowns. But unless Pat Cameron, who is able to score the UCLA offense is not exactly smashing. Alting Cameron, who pitched three first half touchdowns against Stanford, is again a doubtful quantity for the Wisconsin test.

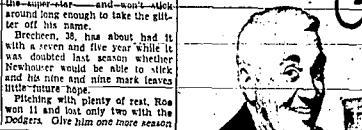

### Korea Points Are Changed For Soldiers

WASHINGTON, Oct. 21 (U. P.)—Army officials said Monday the number of points needed for a soldier to complete a tour of duty in Korea has been increased but the basic points system has not been changed.

The number of points needed for rotation home from the far east has been increased from 36 to 38 for October but officials said the total may change again next month.

It has remained at 35 with little change since the system was first set up in August, 1951. The purpose of the system is to send home first those troops with the longest or toughest foreign service.

Troops earn points at a rate based upon their closeness to combat. The highest rate, four points a month, is for service in the actual combat zone.

Eighth army officials in Korea when the system was set up said the number of troops returned to the United States each month would depend upon the number of replacements available and upon other factors. Rotation credit requirements would be changed according to the number of having the personnel in needs, they said.

While the rotation system applies to servicemen in Korea, it has nothing to do with the length of service required for discharge. By law this is set at not more than 24 months.
