Crime Spree Is Ended for Florida Man

BARTOW, Fla., Oct. 31—The crime spree of James Hill, a so-called "madman," came to an end today when he and a convict he freed from guards at a point were captured after an all-night manhunt.

The sheriff's office announced that Hill and James Douglas surrendered without firing a shot in Nassau county, where they had fled in a succession of commandeered automobiles.

The pair had for hours eluded an 8-man dragnet directed by 20 agents flown in by the FBI, holding up a private residence and two couples to obtain three getaway cars in succession.

A huge posse, meanwhile, captured three fugitive convicts Hill left behind after swooping down on a prison work detail and freeing four captives from their guards at a point.

Sheriff Hagan Parish said Hill, 31-year-old self-proclaimed "thru-gun maniac," was "heavily armed and dangerous" but surrendered without firing his pistol or sawed-off shotgun.

Hill was sought in 20 rob-kidnap-killings staged last week in Florida, Georgia and Tennessee. Douglas was serving 49 years, 20 of them for slaying a fellow inmate at the Florida state prison.

MILWAUKEE, Wis., Oct. 31 (AP)—Rep. Joseph R. McCarthy blasted Gov. Adlai E. Stevenson in a well-timed and in less than a week was met by boos and catcalls, as well as the usual "McCarthyism" epithets.

About 150 spectators walked out on the controversial Wisconsin senator's speech last night.

McCarthy said the mass walkout was engineered by "members of the opposition planned in the fall."

Use 10 Minutes

The disturbance used up about 10 minutes of the 30 minutes of radio and television time allotted to McCarthy for his speech.

The speech was carried by 31 Wisconsin radio stations and the state's only television station, McCarthy broadcast before an overflow crowd of some 500 persons gathered in the American Legion ballroom.

McCarthy repeated much of his speech in Chicago last Monday, attacking the record of Stevenson, the Democratic presidential candidate.

McCarthy said Bernard DeVoto, a Harper's magazine editor, and Adlai Stevenson, Jr., a Harvard university history professor, had fled to answer charges he made against them.

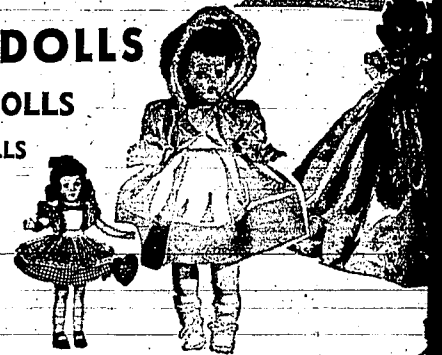

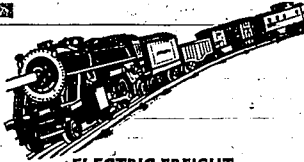
