State Help to Counties for Relief Urged

BOISE, Nov. 14 (UP)—The legislative relief committee on Monday has recommended that the 1933 legislative appropriation funds to the state department of public assistance to handle the relief load in counties needing help.

The committee, headed by Rep. Arthur Wilson, R., Washington, also recommended legislative action of a further study to determine revision of poor laws to bring about a more uniform and effective relief program.

The report was submitted to Gov. Len Jordan for presentation to the 1933 legislature. It is clearly evident that the burden of care for 10 unevenly distributed among counties. In those counties where the burden is extremely heavy some revision to the relief system is indicated in order to enable basic needs to be met in a humane fashion," the report says for presentation to the legislature.

The committee found that the 1933 poor laws "do not give any relief upon which local governments may base policies for administering care of poor, or upon which they may determine their legal privileges.

"Much inefficiency and lack of effectiveness result from the informal method of administering care of poor in many counties," the report says. "The cost of direct bearing on the evaluation of need and the determination of adequacy of funds.

Idaho law permits counties to levy up to 3 mills for county poor relief and the report said 16 counties expended more than that during 1936.

The committee said \$1,426,484 was spent by Idaho counties for poor relief in 1936. Expenditures for direct poor relief and for security in care, hospitalization, medical care, transportation of indigents and burial expenses—figures at the county level—totalled \$1,426,484, or 92.28 per cent in power county.

The poorest counties in terms of power ranged from 18 cents in Teton county to \$607 in Camas county with a statewide average of \$44.00 per year.

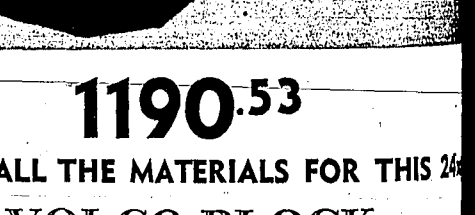

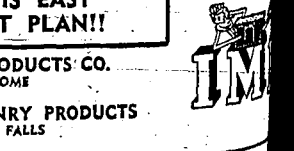
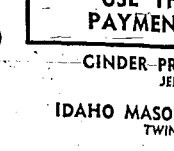

Bureau Chief Evaluates Work on Fire Prevention, Reports on October Drive

Fire prevention seems to be doing some good, concludes Fred J. Higgins, head of the fire department's fire prevention bureau, as he reports on October's fire prevention work. Higgins, especially on the work of the bureau during fire prevention week. During October, two fire prevention films were shown a total of 20 times to an aggregate of 4,100 students and adults. One hundred fire prevention posters were put up in the city. A total of 3,000 homes inspected, blankets were distributed to homes through the schools, and 25,000 pieces of fire prevention literature were distributed to 4,200 homes. Fire inspection was held in all schools as well as fire drills. The inspection department checked 28 complaints, issued 40 weed burning permits and five notices of fire hazards which resulted in four corrections. Most of the hazards noticed were weed patches which had not been cut or burned. Up to Nov. 1, the fire department had answered 131 calls in 1952 as compared with 215 calls in 1951. Last year was the first year of active fire prevention. Fire loss totaled \$110,387 as compared with the 1950 record high loss of \$1,272,214, largely caused by several large warehouse blazes. The 1951 figure was \$190,785, as compared with a low of \$1,500 in 1943. According to Higgins, the results of fire prevention can be noted by a decrease in the number of fire calls. He says fire prevention gets people more conscious and cuts down the number of calls as well.

TUCKER'S NATIONAL WHIRLIGIG

WASHINGTON—Dwight D. Eisenhower will inherit such a youthful and healthy majority of the nine members of the highest judicial tribunal, even if he serves only a few years in the White House.

It is this body, in the belief of Franklin D. Roosevelt and Harry Truman, that would present the most desirable deal for reforming social and economic, even under the impact of a Republican President in your hands.

This reliance on judicial back-stopping for a long period was rejected by Truman's selection of an attempt, and for Truman's selection of an attempt and political cronies when scandals occurred.

SUPREME COURT SEIZURE

Justice Brandeis will be 70 years old tomorrow, the age when members may retire at full salary, if they have also had to undergo a physical examination to qualify on both counts, the former Harvard professor and sponsor of so many "hot dogs" in key government posts friends he has "too tricky" even to think of retirement.

Justice Brandeis and Black are 68 and 67, respectively, and Eisenhower consequently might call them "old men" if he were to take no steps of stepping down, however, although Roosevelt's resignation is a possibility. Similarly, in view of the New Deal's more extreme Truman doctrines, it is expected that a majority will reflect the decision at the ballot-box.
