Heavy Snow is Dumped on Parts of South Idaho

It may have taken winter weather a long time to reach Idaho this year but when it arrived it left no doubt as to its intent to stay awhile. Many parts of the state, including portions of Magic Valley, were given a dose of real winter—including winds and deep snow. So far as the valley is concerned, much of it escaped the heavy storm but areas to the north, south, east and west were blanketed with snow.
Blizzard conditions were reported near Ashton Friday as eastern Idaho bore the brunt of the storm. The storm was not severe in any part of southern Idaho but snow plows were called out to open roads and clear away drifts. The weather bureau expects the skies to remain clear and lower temperatures are forecast.
Hardest hit in Magic Valley areas were the mountains north of Hailey and around Strevell on the Utah-Idaho line. Skies cleared Saturday over the Big Wood river valley after a heavy snow storm dumped on Galena Sunday. The 18 inches precipitated problems and confusion. Private Jimmie Hunter experienced difficulty in crossing the summit. State snowplows were sent out for the first time in the valley and the highway was cleared Saturday.
One truck load of hay tipped over in the heavy snow near Hailey were reported. Mrs. Pearl Barber, Galena, said she had been advised to leave her car in the snow. She called three and Galena noon. On Saturday there were 12 inches of snow in the valley. The Ketchum and four at Hailey. Rain late Friday night settled much of Hailey snowing.

Life in MAGIC VALLEY

The usually quiet community hall at MILLNER showed much more activity than usual on election day when the Parsons precinct turned out to vote. As near as can be determined all of the people eligible to vote were registered and all were voted. Seventy-seven people registered to vote and 67 voted were cast.

Parsons were Republican. Judges for this election were Edna Webb Mooreman, Mrs. Regina Vanant and Mrs. John White. Endors Edger and Mrs. Brown. The judges were the clerk and John White acted as constable.

The Miller Community hall was built in 1927 and was used as a school until 1928 when the children were transferred to BURLY for their education. Many of the young married people in the community remember attending school in Miller. They recall every day buttons, Thanksgiving and Christmas programs, halloween parties, and of course, bow and arrow contests.

Among the many teachers at the school were Kate Mae Beane, now Mrs. Orville Wright, with school in MURTAUGH, Mrs. Wright is teacher as well as mother and is school. Next was Jeanne Hayes, now Mrs. Allen-TWIN FALLS. They own a farm in the Millers area. Mrs. Verma Belle Blakely was teacher the last year before the students were transferred to Burlly. She now is teaching in Burlly.

Korean Trial Scheduled for New Uniform

WASHINGTON, Nov. 15.—The army will issue 3,000 sets of its revolutionary new plastic "cold-war" uniforms to troops in Korea this winter.

Another 200 sets of the new jackets and trousers have already been made and the army called "another service" — apparently the marines — for issue to combat men in the far north amphibious maneuvers in the far north this fall.

The army announced previously it did not have general issue of the new uniform in Korea except for testing.

Vapor-Barrier Principle

The "cold-war" uniform, developed in several years of research by army quartermaster corps and field tested in the United States, works on the vapor-barrier principle of trapping warm air between the wearer's body.

It uses no cloth but is made from a synthetic resinous fabric except that it repels water. Millions of tiny air cells in the uniform will repel water, but will let warm air pass through them as well as keep him warm whether his skin is wet or dry.

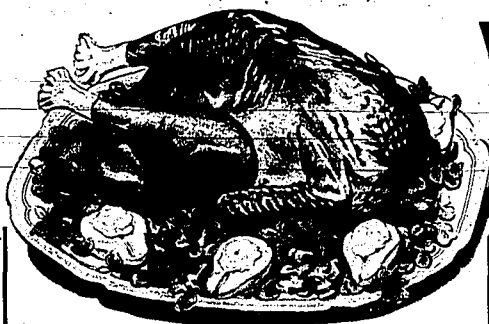
