REACTORARY "LIBERALS"

With practically everybody from the National Association of Manufacturers to Henry Wallace clanking in upon the term "liberalism," it wouldn't be easy to come up with a satisfying definition of it.

We're not going to try here, except to suggest it has something to do with a willingness to experiment, to embrace change, to keep mentally flexible, to seek new solutions 'a la mat. at a national banquet.

It ought to be clear that if liberalism has any such meaning, it can't be properly applied to many groups which now appropriate the label. In this editorial we'll examine just one of those groups.

The people who rightfully belong in this particular group profess to serve humanity, to support measures for the uplift of ordinary folk everywhere. This suggests an attitude of tolerance toward frilly, and a generous acceptance of many human viewpoints in considering a problem.

Yet, in truth, a prime characteristic of the "liberals" we now have under the microscope is an attitude almost the exact opposite. These are the people who say they are for humanity, but who believe only one set of solutions—their own—is right. That there is only one good national health program, and if you are not for it, then, clearly, you are not of humanity.

The man who dares to oppose is measured by that fact alone, and excommunicated from the society of liberals. There is no real examination of his motives, no real recognition that a man may oppose for many reasons—some of them possibly sound.

There is really not a great gap between this kind of thinking and the scorn the Russian communists regularly heap upon the "bourgeois." This is called "liberalism," and it does much prating about the patness of other peoples' thinking. Actually, they themselves treasure conformity dearly.

Inflexibility of mind, the very reverse of the mark the genuine liberal bears, is the chief of the liberals' traits. There is no real examination of his motives, no real recognition that a man may oppose for many reasons—some of them possibly sound.

With their minds held rigid by the plaster cast of conformity, these people proceed naturally to the assumption that all good resides in one political party. They extol the two-party system, but they never want any body to vote for the other party. Theirs is the party of purest principle, while the opposition has succumbed totally to expediency.

To people like this, the vote of the American electorate on Nov. 4 was just short of a disaster. They are clearly one-party mentality in a two-party country.

Are they liberals? Obviously not. They are really reactionaries—in this case, the reactionaries of the left. And they are no more help to us than the other kind.

NAZISM LOOMS AGAIN
Once again, this time in relatively limited local and state elections, Nazism has reared its ugly shape in Germany. The last chief of staff Hitler's storm troops were sent on town and county council, riding on the "Refugee Party" ticket. A few other neo-Nazi scored.

"The latest batch of Eisenhower's appointments is but a continuation of pining reactionaries in complete control of his administration. We don't know the meaning of "reactionary," but to our way of thinking, Senator Morse tops them all."

Divided CIO Bosses Seek OK on Chief

ATLANTIC CITY, N. J., Nov. 25.—Divided CIO officials made a final attempt today to agree on a new president and avert a showdown convention fight that could split the ranks.

Ten CIO vice presidents were scheduled to meet in executive session for another effort at settling on CIO Executive Vice President Elmer E. Wood of Pennsylvania as P. W. Reuther of the CIO United Auto Workers to succeed the late Philip Murray. When the union chiefs first discussed the presidency last Monday, they split into rival Wood and Reuther camps.

The meeting was a prelude to the annual CIO convention opening Monday. If the officials are unable to agree on a new president, the issue will go to the convention.

The union chiefs were striving to avoid such a convention fight. They agreed to either open a new convention or create such a convention. The CIO would be left open to raids by rival organizations or case some might be unable to bolt the parent CIO. There was no advance indication, however, that Reuther or the rival camps were ready to back down to achieve the hoped-for harmony.

Election Law Probe Slated

WASHINGTON, Nov. 25.—Spokesmen for the Republican and Democratic national committees and for the press and radio and television industries have been invited to testify next week in congressional study of the nation's "antiquated" election laws.

The investigation will get under way Monday and will be conducted by a special house committee headed by Representative Charles McNichols of California. A similar committee functions each election year, its job being to study campaign expenditures and the accuracy of election laws.

After this year's hearings, Democrats said the committee will make "sound and constructive recommendations" for changes in the "antiquated" election laws.

Under present laws, national committees can nettle more than \$3 million dollars apiece. But much more than this can be spent for a party by dividing the spending up among a number of committees.

Democrats estimate the cost of the recent campaign range from \$60 million to \$100 million dollars, with from \$200 to \$250 million in national committee active in the campaign.

Gain in Cold War Is Seen

WASHINGTON, Nov. 25.—Top American officials said Thursday that the cold war is being won around Berlin to effect West Germany's expected approval of membership in the proposed European defense army.

These weary officials with western intelligence reports that Russia has nearly doubled the size of the East German communist "police force" in the past five months.

Nearly 100,000 East Germans are now mobilized in Russian-style units, officials said, with every indication that more are to be added.

Russian military equipment for this force includes small arms, machine guns, mortars, and anti-tank guns. Reliable reports, however, indicate Moscow is planning to add artillery, howitzers and tanks in the near future.

Most officials believe Moscow at this time will not use force to drive the west from Berlin. Nor do they foresee any outright blockade of the western zones such as occurred in the spring of 1948.

But responsible officials told a reporter it is entirely possible the East German "police force" under Russian direction may step up their existing campaign of harassment.

Seoul Festive Air-Fading as 'Tke' Delayed

SEOUL, Korea, Nov. 25.—The city of Seoul got ready a little too soon for the visit of President-Elect Eisenhower and today the festive air was wearing off.

The decorated streets took on a lustered aspect. The colors on paper American flags hanging outside homes and shops ran together in last night's rain.

Welcome posters pasted on walls curled and began working loose. Posters put up nearly a week ago depicting a smiling Eisenhower on an American flag background had faded, leaving Eisenhower featureless.

Safety Doubled

Although government officials are planning to plan for giving Eisenhower a royal welcome, the feeling was growing that they had not convinced U. S. secret service that Seoul was safe.

Secret services were alerted to learn that plans called for a full regiment of armed ROK troops—about 3,000 men—to greet Eisenhower when he lands at the Seoul airport, if he does.

They were hurried to learn the ceremonies included a 21-gun salute which could hide an assassin's shot.

Arrival Cite Soapbox

Government officials who were confident two days ago that Eisenhower would spend Thanksgiving in the Korean, produced nervous today as the general's arrival.

Police patrolled the street night and day and the drive to Seoul of "suspicious persons" continued. A few more suspects were added to the 400 previously arrested and jailed incommunicado.

The arrests were made without warrants and the suspects were not permitted to consult attorneys or talk to their families.

"Until General Eisenhower leaves Korea, we are holding all prisoners incommunicado," a detective chief said.
