

These are the people win say they are for humanity, but who believe only one act of solutions—ther, own—is right. Thus there is only one good national health program, and if you are not for it, then, clearly, you are no friend or humanity.

The man who dares to oppose is measured by that fact alone, and excommunicated from the society of liberals. There is no real examination of his motives, no real recognition that a man may oppose for many reasons—some of them possibly sound.

There is really not a great gap between this kind of thinking and the scorn the Russian communist regularly heaps upon the deviationist." These so-called liberals of other peoples' thinking. Actually, they themselves treasure conformity dearly.
