Lodge to Get Major Policy Shaping Role

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y. Dec. 10.—As the American delegation to the U. N. Gen. Assembly Cabot Lodge will have a key role in shaping the foreign policy of the country.

And just as important, he will become the front-man for the state department. In the year-round U. N. debates which will pit him against Russia's foreign minister.

Big Job Ahead
As U. S. ambassador to the U. N. he also will have a heavy administrative task in keeping the American mission—sometimes called the "little state department"—running smoothly. The mission has approximately 150 members, including doctors, clerks, secretaries and official workers.

Recently Lodge would serve, as Warren R. Austin now does, as U. S. representative on most U. N. bodies that deal with political questions. These include the security council, disarmament commission, collective security committee, general assembly and little assembly.

Task Easier Now
He will have many headaches, but he will not have to face the major one that confronted Austin when the Vermont senator first went to the most six years ago. That was the job of unifying and consolidating all of this country's U. N. activities under a single head.

Originally, the late Edward R. Brooke came to the U. N. as representative on the security council only. The representatives on other bodies dealt directly with the state department. This led to confusion and duplication and was one of the factors which caused the state's tenuous liaison.

Before Austin accepted the post, he had a clear understanding of the President Truman that all U. S. activities at the U. N. would be combined under the mission under his direction.

Austin had another battle to fight to establish the role of the mission in policy making. In the beginning, there was a tendency for the state department to hand the dispatches here ready-made policies without giving them very much of a voice, if any.

The mission now plays a major part in forming policy. There is constant consultation between the mission and the state department before any decision is reached.

Knows Mission
Lodge knows how the mission works. He had a delegation to the U. N. in 1930. So does John Foster Dulles, President-Elect Eisenhower's designee as secretary of state who also is a former delegate. This should help toward smooth relations between the mission and the state department.

One problem Lodge and Dulles will have to face quickly is addition to the big political questions—the selection of men to fill key spots. It is taken for granted that several of the top-level representatives will depart with the Truman administration.

Mrs. Franklin D. Roosevelt already has announced that she does not expect to be reappointed by Eisenhower.
