## Tripling of State Patrol Urged by Governor's Panel

Dec. 4 (AP)—The governor's safety coordinating committee has recommended that Idaho triple its highway patrol in the next two years.

The panel, named by Gov. Len Jordan to sift recommendations from a safety conference, recommended that 100 additional patrolmen be added to the force in 1953 and an additional 100 in the following year.

The Idaho legislature followed Jordan's recommendation in setting the state patrol from 40 to 25 men, and those at ports of entry.

### Continuance of Western River Projects Seen by GOP Solons

WASHINGTON, Dec. 4 (AP)—Senate Republican members today introduced a new measure which would authorize the harnessing of western rivers for power and irrigation projects to be continued under the new administration, though perhaps on a smaller scale.

Gov. Douglas McKay recently proposed by President-Elect Dwight Eisenhower to be interior secretary, if considered an advocate of river development projects.

As a state legislator he backed the Willamette valley project and Willamette river basin commission, but as governor he opposed the Columbia valley authority proposed by President Truman.

An interior secretary he will direct policies of the reclamation bureau, which for 20 years has been building and proposing power projects controlled by the federal government.

Rep. Elliot Barry, Goldwater, R., Ark., believes his views on river development are similar to those held by McKay.

McKay says help-for-government construction of projects too big to be handled by private enterprise or states. But he doesn't want the projects to be owned and operated by the federal government.

Sen. Arthur V. Watkins, R., Utah, predicts the new congress will authorize construction of new projects and spend enough money to finance advance planning. The projects that can be built, he said, "when there is a letup in foreign and defense spending."

Watkins favors "grass roots" ownership of the projects.

The Utah senator hopes to outline in a letter to McKay a plan which would permit interstate water and power users' associations to contract with the federal government for construction of projects.

Under the plan, two or more states would form associations which would repay the government for construction work and retain ownership of the projects.

Watkins believes valley authorities, like those proposed to put the government in the power production business along the Missouri and Columbia rivers, won't have "a ghost of a chance" under Republican administration.

Utah's four-member delegation comes to be expected to pass Oregon for authorization of the billion-dollar upper Colorado river project.

"And we'll get help from the Arizona delegation and others along the Colorado river," said Watkins, who introduced a bill which unsuccessfully sought authorization of the project this year.

The project includes 10 big dams in the Colorado and its tributaries.

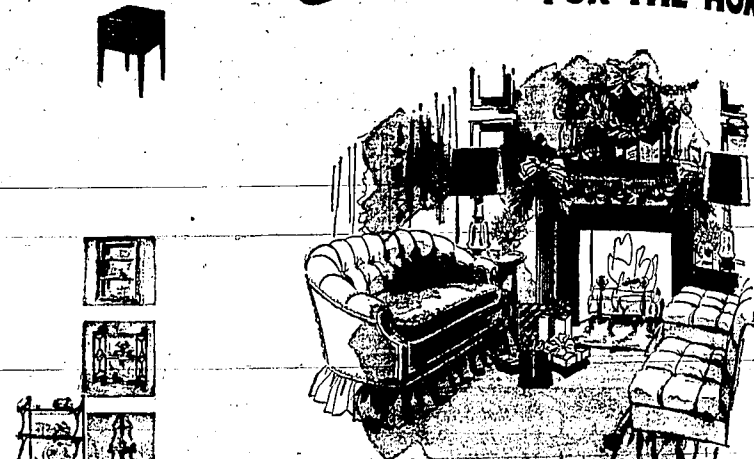

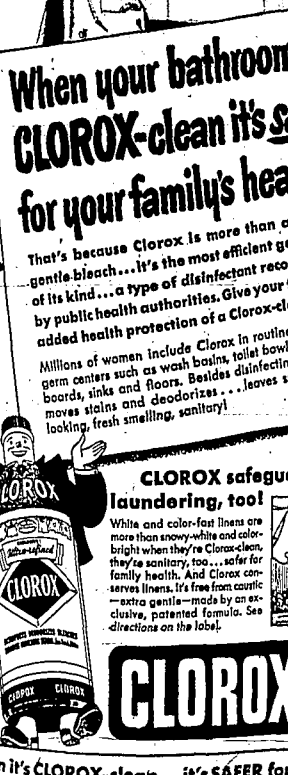

### GOP Bosses See Blunder in Selection

WASHINGTON, Dec. 4 (AP)—Key Republicans agreed today that Eisenhower's appointment of Taft as secretary of labor was a "blunder in his top job."

They denied, however, that an open split had occurred between President-elect Eisenhower and the Ohio senator.

General Agreement

The word "blunder" used by Taft in blasting Eisenhower's appointment of Taft, was handed about in GOP circles in a different context. There was general agreement the Eisenhower camp should have given Taft notice he was being handed a bitter pill to swallow.

One result of the Taft blow-up, according to several Republicans who did not want to be quoted by name, was to make it more probable that Sen. Styles Bridges, New Hampshire, will grab the senate Republican floor leadership to head off a battle for the post between Taft and pro-Eisenhower Republicans.

Brownell Is Target

There was a good deal of finger-wagging, started by Taft himself, in the direction of Herbert Brownell, Jr., Eisenhower's attorney general-designate and a close adviser on cabinet appointments.

Even staunch Eisenhower men said the usually suave Brownell should have passed advice to Taft that an AFL official, and a Democrat to boot, was being named secretary of labor.

### Wintry Weather Curbing Operations at Palisades Dam; Flurry Due in Summer

IRWIN, Dec. 4 (AP)—Wintry weather has cut into operations at the Palisades dam site but the boss of the huge construction project says: "If anyone thinks we were busy this year, just wait until the dirt starts flying next year."

William J. Kennish is general project superintendent for the prime contractors, J. A. Jones Construction company, Charlotte, N. C., and Charles H. Tompkins company, Washington.

Under steady pushing from the 40-year-old superintendent, workmen are ahead of schedule in the work of building the huge earth-fill structure that will store water of Snake river's south fork.

Work of digging two diversion tunnels, however, is slightly behind schedule and Kennish said it will be impossible to get the concrete lining of the two bores poured this year.

Deadlines for completing the project is July 30, 1957.

During the winter crews can continue the work of drilling the tunnels with completion of one expected within a few days. Work also can continue for a time on construction of a new road that will carry state highway 26 around the dam. The road now runs along what will be the bottom of the reservoir when the dam is finished.

**Man With Hoe Is on March in Bloodless Agrarian Revolution**  
**ROME, Dec. 4.**—Around the world, the man with the hoe is on the march in a bloodless agrarian revolution. It is the most important of the U. N. food and agriculture organizations here think mark the 20th century as the industrial revolution marked the 19th. In many countries, men whose fathers tilled their own fields are getting their own plots. Bushels of rice are being spent to help the hungry. Shiny tractors, in some places, are replacing hoes to help them.  
 King Farouk is gone from ancient Egypt where—thousands of years ago—Joseph interpreted the Pharaoh's dream of seven fat and seven withered ears of corn. Joseph warned they forecast seven years of plenty followed by seven of famine—and for that was given one of the world's first major crop control jobs.  
 Today, the presidents of the Nile valley are getting land. But Zuyg's agriculture reform program—like that of many other countries—has a siphon-like riddle: Where to get land for a population that has leaped from three to 20 millions in 100 years and still growing?  
 Generally, world population, more than doubled in the past 100 years, poses the highest hurdle to land reform. There's not enough land for all who need it.  
 In Japan where war and foreign occupation altered the concept of a god-emperor, land reform has made big strides. Where to get land?  
 In Italy, Kingless for the first time since it became a modern, united nation, land reform is a major issue.

Billions are being spent in land reform, described by India's delegate to a FAO conference here as "fundamental to the democratic future of the world."  
 Some of the problems that must be solved include unconsciousness of land distribution, insecurity of tenure, high taxes, perpetual indebtedness, lack of clear titles, lack of markets, and opposition—both open and undercover—from big landowners.  
 In Japan, Egypt, Haiti, Korea, Indonesia, Lebanon, Indo-China, Ceylon, India, Bolivia, Colombia and Peru there is less than one arable acre per person. This means many land holdings in those countries are under a subsistence minimum.  
 Isador Lubin, U. S. delegate to

FAO conference here, stated tersely why the United Nations is pressing for land reform.  
 "Without it, the life of the millions of human beings are a harsh, bleak tragedy played out between birth and death. It is the duty of the United Nations to focus the world's attention upon land reform."  
 Struggles were formerly fought on the American Atlantic coast, but the number of the fish has been reduced so sharply it no longer pays to fish for them commercially.

**141,525 Chest X-Rays Taken**  
**In State by TB Association**

BOISE, Dec. 4 (Special)—Pratt Goodwin, executive director of the Idaho Tuberculosis Association, announced today that Idaho's mobile chest X-ray unit had taken 141,525 X-rays since it began operation in February, 1951.

Of these 141,525 were found to have suspicious signs of tuberculosis, 934 suspicious signs of cardiac abnormalities and 1,091 suspicious signs of miscellaneous diseases such as tumors, cancer of the lung, silicosis and other lung abnormalities.

"Although figures are not available for the number of actual cases of tuberculosis found in the total number of X-rays taken, 72 cases of TB previously unknown have been found so far, since time must elapse between the time the X-rays are taken until the individual can be diagnosed definitely as having tuberculosis."
