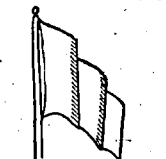

Cloud-Seeding Tries Overlap In Basin Area

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 8—So many cloud seeders are at work in the Pacific northwest no one can tell whether they are making any rain, the Oregon Wheat Growers' league has been advised.

A league committee reported that state control over cloud-seeders is needed. The committee urged the legislature to support an Oregon legislative interim committee studying the problem.

The committee recommended a law to stop overlapping of rain-making efforts and to set up areas free of cloud-seeding activity. That would afford some comparison with seeded areas.

Some members said the recent summer and fall were the driest in years, and caused some farmers to lose enthusiasm for rain-making efforts.

Members in a tri-county experiment in Morrow, Gilliam and Sherman counties will meet Friday at Condon to decide whether to keep cloud seeders at work the rest of the crop year.

Crime in N. Y. Docks Tied. Worst in U. S.

Unbridled crime, racketeering and corruption on the 80-mile waterfront of the port of New York is the worst in any other American port, a United Press survey showed today.

When the sprawling docks, organized racketeers annually "plunder" estimates at some 100 million from the docks, which are near comparable. In most cases, their individual longshoremen make more money a year. The employers, it appears, pay out less.

The bottom of New York's evil picture is yet to be found, but its perpetuation, many believe, is rooted in the ship-up-hiring system. The ship-up-hiring system, which longshoremen "line up" at shift time to be picked for longshore gangs by a time boss, is used in other ports but with no comparable patterns of lawlessness and graft rule. It has been replaced in other ports and in some Gulf ports with hiring halls which appear to remove much of the possibility of corruption.

In San Francisco and Los Angeles, central hiring halls estimate average annual wages for longshoremen are about \$3,000, a New Orleans man says. The longshoremen make more than \$4,000.

West coast hiring halls are run mainly by the International Longshoremen's and Warehousemen's union (I.L.W.U.) and the Pacific Maritime Association. Hiring halls control the number of hours an available man has worked during the week and the time he checked into the hall that day.

The PMA collects from all stevedores and dockworkers a fee of 10 cents a week, which is collected from the stevedores weekly by check. Gangs formed on one hiring call remain with a job until it is finished.

New York employers have testified this system would prevent them from hiring men who had been "blacklisted" in experience and efficiency as it would consider as a unit, "blacklisted" men who had been "blacklisted" by one of the other ports, went through a bloody strike in 1924, when Harry Bridges, I.L.W.U. leader, had been blacklisted.

The PMA says it has no plan to set up his own union-report that the unions are peaceful, free from racketeering and have only minor pilferage.

Mt. Everest's Cold Defeats Swiss Efforts

NEW DELHI, India, Dec. 8 (AP)— Mt. Everest's "murderous" winds and below zero cold have defeated a courageous Swiss mountain climbing expedition reported last month to have reached a point only 150 feet from its un conquered peak.

Advice received from Katmandu, capital of neighboring Nepal, said the climbers abandoned their attempts Nov. 30 and returned to Everest Base Camp, a village at Everest's base.

Peak Unconquered
The heroic effort was the 10th carefully planned attack on the snow-covered mountain towering more than 29,000 feet, whose summit no one has reached and returned to tell about it.

But if previous reports prove correct, the Swiss got higher than any previous expedition.

The Swiss Alpine Research foundation in Zurich, Switzerland, said the climbers were forced to turn back because of the "murderous" winds, which were so strong that it is not yet known what height they reached.

Led by Doctor
The latest expedition was led by Dr. Gabriel Chouveau, a 32-year-old Geneva surgeon who climbed for a hobby. In 16 he was six Swiss mountain guides and seven Nepalese porters and seven Nepalese porters made their final camp Nov. 19. A few days later that this camp was 150 feet from the summit.

Chouveau's report said they planned to make the last desperate try for the peak the next day, but 20-foot winds, which hurried snow around like baseballs, forced them to surrender.

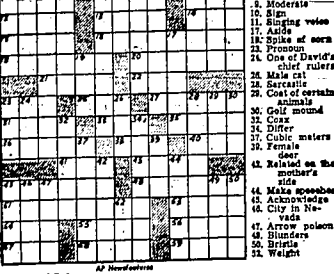

Banker Sees U. S. Danger Of Recession

BOISE, Dec. 8 (AP)—John A. Schoonover, president of Idaho First National bank, has voiced a warning that the United States should prepare for a business recession within the next 18 months.

In an address to branch managers and directors of the bank, Schoonover said "it is evident that the recent slump in production and the increasing administration the expectation that all expenditures, including those for war and foreign relief, be reduced.

"Added to this is the announced objective of the new administration to reduce taxes substantially. Taken altogether these various items would seem to give an indication of a substantial reduction in government spending and a consequent dropping off in production in all lines, with possible accompanying increase in unemployment."

Schoonover advised the bankers to urge Idaho farmers to reevaluate their operations and attempt to bring about more economic and efficient farming operations. He said it was necessary "in view of the prevailing profit margins and the possibility of a very substantial reduction in foreign exports of farm products which would reduce profits and income still more."

He predicted that a "tight money" condition will continue, but forecast no increase in interest rates.

Shortage for Antimony Is Seen in U.S.

BOISE, Dec. 8 (AP)—Harry Marsh, secretary of the Idaho Mining association, fears a serious national antimony shortage may develop in 1951 unless domestic production of the strategic metal is encouraged.

Marsh said the nation has been almost 100 per cent dependent on foreign antimony production since the closing of the Bradley Mine company operation at Granite last June.

Marsh said his association has made three recommendations to correct the antimony shortage possibility, including:

Encouraging the domestic antimony mining and smelting industry to resume production by, if necessary, guaranteeing floor prices for mine and smelter products for several years.
