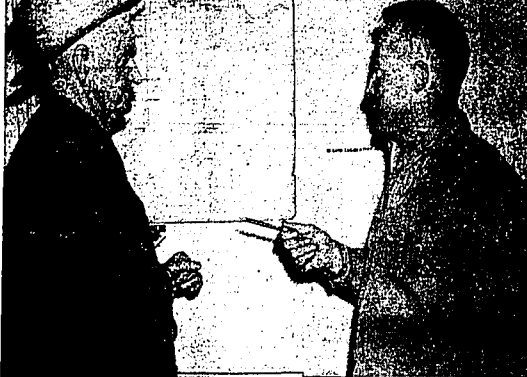

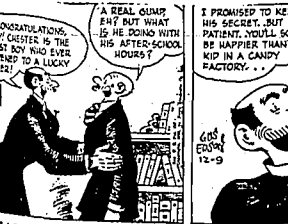

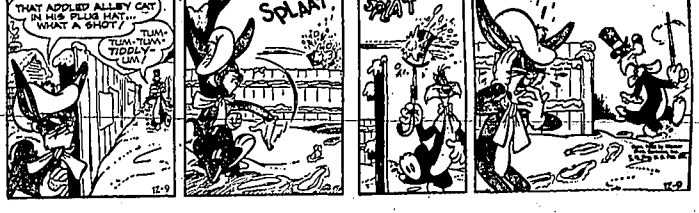

Polio Serum Plan for '53 Is Reported

SEATTLE, Dec. 9 (AP) — The National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis hopes to administer globulin—newest blood derivative for treatment of poliomyelitis—to 1,500,000 children next year.

Paul O'Connor, foundation president, said in an interview Monday the serum is so scarce it will be used for 1 to 11-year-olds only.

"First Break"

The serum, described as "the first break against polio," will be for measles, infectious hepatitis and infantile paralysis cases, O'Connor said. It will be used in areas where a severe polio epidemic is arising.

The still scarce, he explained, because of a production block, not because of a lack of blood.

Not Full Answer

Gamma globulin isn't the answer to polio, O'Connor said, because it must be given yearly. "We don't have a vaccine," he added. "But

we're much closer to it than we were two years ago."

In experiments last summer in three cities, O'Connor said, gamma globulin gave five-week protection to children when administered before epidemics began. One such experiment was made in Provo, Utah.

O'Connor estimated this year's polio cases may total 55,000.

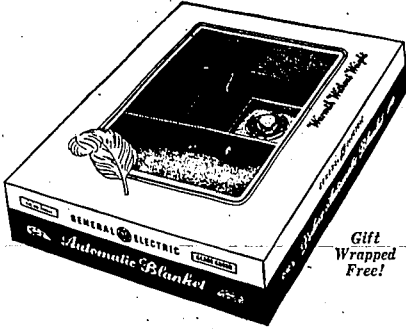
