Postmaster Pleased With T.F. Response to 'Mail Early' Plea

Response of local residents to the postoffice plea to mail Christmas packages early has been gratifying.

The volume of incoming and outgoing mail Saturday reached the highest peak so far this year. Particularly encouraging to postoffice employees is the fact that the volume for early December has shown a stable increase over the same period last year.

All-day postoffice hours were in effect Saturday. Next Saturday, as the Christmas stampede grows, the postoffice will be open again from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Frantz stated.

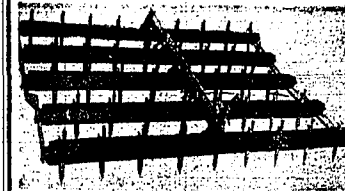

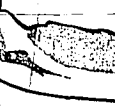

MacArthur Meeting May Bring Out "Clear, Definite, Solution" to Struggle

What I advocate is that we defend every place, and I say we have the capacity and it is divided on all these fronts, we should be able to meet... believe it would act as the greatest possible deterrent upon the enemy if we were successful in stopping the enemy's attack in the far east. I believe if we do not do it... it would be an invitation for him to attack another area.

Lack of Policy

"The inertia that exists. That is no policy—nothing. I tell you—no plan or anything."

"I was operating in a vacuum."

"There are only three ways I can see... either to pursue it to victory; to surrender to the enemy and end it on his terms or what I think is the worst of all choices—to go on indefinitely and indefinitely, neither to win or lose, in that statement."

Defeating Red China

"Limited pressures would be quite sufficient to bring Red China to a reasonable attitude."

"I made clear that if not permitted to destroy the enemy base north of the Yalu. If not permitted to utilize the friendly Chinese force of some 600,000 men on Formosa, if not permitted to blockade the China coast to prevent the Chinese from getting succor from without and if there were to be no hope of major reinforcements, the position of the command from the military standpoint forbids victory."

"He does not seem to me to be reasonable."



With the population of the country increasing over 7,000 every day, life expectancy increasing constantly and with a high proportion of our people reaching retirement age every year, the active work force will have plenty to do in housing, feeding, clothing, teaching and entertaining American families, he declared.

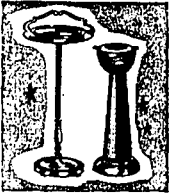

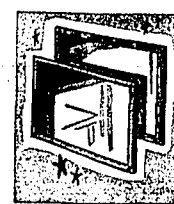

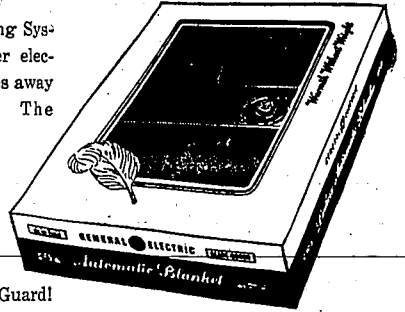

Care of Your Children

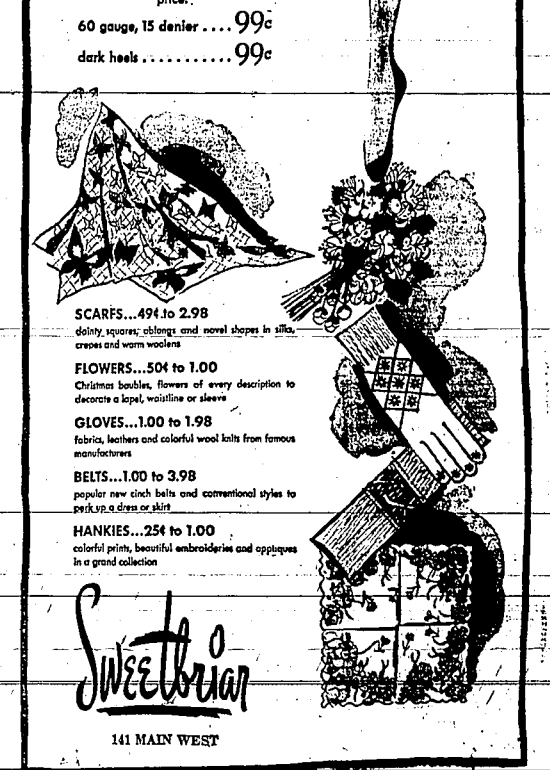
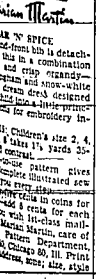

Press Counts Are Close on Vote Figures

WASHINGTON, Dec. 10—The hundreds of newsmen and others who gather returns for the Associated Press election lines come very close to the final official figures released weeks later.

This was shown Friday in a study of votes cast Nov. 4 in the 18 states where the AP completed its unofficial tabulation of presidential ballots after Eisenhower was conceded victory. In the 30 other states the outcome was decisive beyond doubt and therefore unofficial tabulations were discontinued before a complete count was reached.

Many Excluded
Despite the fact that the unofficial vote for major party candidates for President in the 18 states excluded much of the absentee civilian and military vote which the later official tabulations included, the comparative votes showed:

Official AP
Eisenhower — 1,493,468 14,871,428
Stevenson — 1,140,751 11,390,669

Thus, the official vote came to 46,000 more than the unofficial in the case of Eisenhower and 25,762 more in the case of Stevenson. The total official vote of 28,262,097 in the 18 states. How much of the excess can be attributed to absentee votes cannot be determined.

State Records Better
The record is even better in the individual state races.

For example the AP unofficial count showed Sen. Charles McNary, D., won reelection over Patrick J. Hurley, R., in New Mexico by only a dozen votes more than the 5,071 margin the official canvass later developed.

In Nevada, the official presidential total vote was \$2,190, or only 26 less than the earlier AP figure. Only 21 votes separated the official and unofficial counts in the same state.

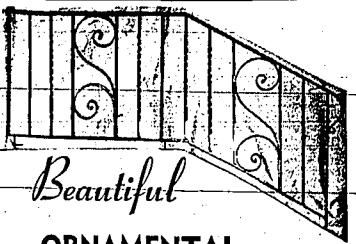

Asked at Eisenhower's headquarters here whether he favors the present price support, Benson said: "Well, it's on the statute books for another two years."

Hopes for improvement Benson, a Salt Lake City resident, said he hopes the Eisenhower administration can improve on the present program, and added: "I suppose we need some support, but at what level I'm not prepared to say, whether at 90 per cent or 75 per cent."

Parity is the price farm produce should command to give the farmer a fair price for what he sells in relation to prices he must pay for the things he buys.

Favors 90 Per Cent Eisenhower has said he favors present laws that guarantee price supports on basic crops, through 1934, at 90 per cent of parity.

Benson said he agreed with the message from Eisenhower read Tuesday at the convention of the American Farm Bureau Federation at Seattle in the message the President-elect urged farmers to analyze their problems so as to be prepared to offer possible solutions when the price support law expires at the end of 1934.

The attention was called to Miss Grafort's Christmas plea for food and clothing for the children on a nation-wide radio broadcast last week.

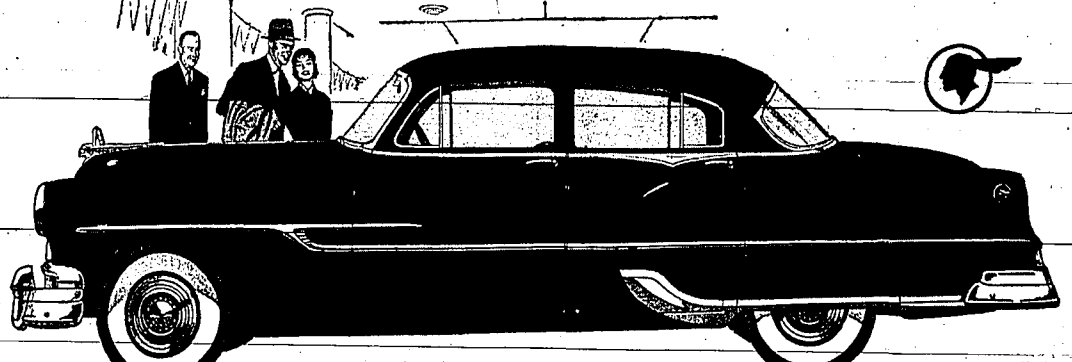

Pruett Thinks Sky Distances Inconceivable

Astronomer, Extension Division Oregon Higher Education System
A clear blue sky is a sign of great esthetic beauty, even though we may consider the twinkling celestial jewels no farther away than their seem. But over-whelming wonder is truly ours when we gain even a little insight regarding the inconceivable distances the stars are from us.

Finally, muttering almost wordlessly—but despairingly—toward his sister, he exclaimed, "It's all so wonderful! I believe it all—but I can't make it seem real. Does it seem real to you?"

Continuous Awe
Those of us who have studied and thought and dreamed start that of our lives will have to admit it is absolutely beyond our comprehension to stand in continuous awe of the greatness of the universe, but aren't we more understandingly impressed with the mathematical representations of these immensities?

In print it is indeed thrilling to know the statement that the nearest known star is 25 trillion miles away. Our faith is strong, but our feelings are wholly incapable of seeing the realities. About the best we can do is to understand the 60 or more miles to an indistinct range of hills drowned in the haze of a far-away horizon.

Comparison Attempted
Just to gain some comparative figure on celestial distances let us assume a plane having an inexhaustible fuel supply and able to travel 200 miles per hour anywhere in our vast universe. To go around the earth's equator, our plane will require only three and one-half days for the 26,000 miles; to reach the moon, a little over a month; and to the sun (93 million miles), 36 years.

From the sun our aviator flies out to the planet Neptune about 1,000 years. Leaving Pluto a little later, he launches his plane into the trackless sea of interstellar night and, grown old with flying, reaches the nearest star, Alpha Centauri (4.3 million miles), in 9 million years.

Figures too enormous
The figures already are getting too enormous to handle. Light travels 186,282 miles per second or almost six trillion miles per year. From Alpha Centauri light rays

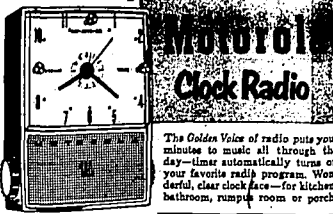

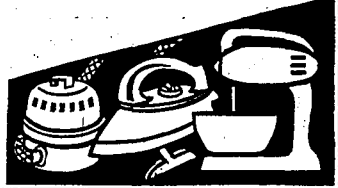

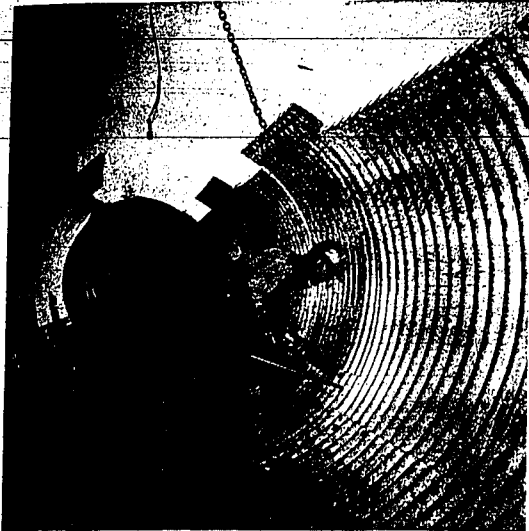

Contributions for Christmas Seals Termed Generous Here

Tuberculosis Christmas seals contributions were termed generous Friday by Mrs. J. O. Pumphrey, chairman of the county drive, who reports \$450.00 received so far from Twin Falls residents alone. This is about \$500 below the \$1,300.00 taken in Twin Falls last year, excluding the school contributions. It is too early to tell whether the collections will exceed those of last year, Mrs. Pumphrey points out. However, \$2,000.00 was collected last year in the entire county. Richard Nixon, vice president-elect, in the same outdoor ceremony at the capitol at which Eisenhower takes his oath. Until 1933 it was usual for the vice president to take his oath at a prior and separate ceremony in the senate chamber. Bridges said Nixon will receive the oath from Sen. William Knowland, his California colleague, but will make no speech. Eisenhower then will be sworn by Chief Justice Vinson and deliver the inaugural address.

Eisenhower Regaining Old Stature as Man of Decision After Campaign Role

By DON WHITEHEAD
IN ROUTE HOME FROM WASHINGTON, Dec. 13 (AP)—Dwight D. Eisenhower has emerged as the most widely known of the presidential campaign into a position of command where once again he is more like the Eisenhower of pre-political days.

It is almost as if Eisenhower had passed through a phase in which he had shed his old personality in the campaign and then donned the comfortable personality that has won him victory at the polls.

At least that is the impression of a reporter who knew Eisenhower in World War II, watched a subtle change take place when he became a politician and now is seeing the old Ike emerge again.

The Eisenhower of June 1 to Nov. 4—the campaigning days—was never quite the Eisenhower we had known in Europe. And perhaps the reason was that in those days people were making the big political decisions for him.

Eisenhower never made any secret of the fact that he was the amateur in political maneuvering—and that he was leaving the strategy to his advisers in the political field.

But that period ended with the election. Now Eisenhower is back into his role easily and with an outward confidence that he never quite achieved as the political campaigner.

As the stilled commander in World War II, General Eisenhower made the great and final decisions. He moved with decision and sureness through world-shaking events, dealing with world figures on an easy and friendly basis.

In those days, Eisenhower always was the boss. His meteoric rise in the army and in the diplomacy of the time never overwhelmed him. But even with this rise to power and fame, Eisenhower still retained a midwestern, down to earth quality.

He moved in a world he knew intimately—the military world. And he didn't seem to lose his stride in moving through the diplomatic maze.

Eisenhower's great achievement—if one is to be singled out—was his ability to bring people of contrasting nationalities and personalities together and make them work as a team. It became a passion with him. And he delegates responsibility, depending a great deal on those he brought to his staff.

There is a story, perhaps apocryphal, that Eisenhower once called an American officer on the carpet for having been in a violent argument with his British opposite.

As the story goes, he told the officer: "I don't mind your calling him an SOB. But when you called him a British SOB that was too much." And the American was sent home.

At any rate, the story does illustrate the Eisenhower demand in those days for teamwork.

And the strong Eisenhower per-

sonality and directness in command never seemed to vary in the years that followed.

The subtle change seemed to come when Eisenhower returned home last June to enter the race for the Republican presidential nomination.

The Chicago convention, Eisenhower told reporters in Denver, that he was "in the hands of the politicians" who were asking a question about convention strategy. He replied: "I ought to have asked about that."

He was referring to Sen. Henry Cabot Lodge, Jr., Mass., who helped lead the fight for Eisenhower's political board of strategy plotted the moves he made. Speeches were written for him. He was guided through the political maze and it seemed the sharp outlines of the old Eisenhower personality had become blurred.

One of his close associates told me recently, "The camera knows me knowing A from B in the political world. He didn't know whom to trust and which advice was best. But I must admit he learned fast. This same adviser said: 'But he's the boss now. Make no mistake about that and he knows where he's going and what he wants to do.'"

It's been 11 1/2 weeks since the election and look what he's done. He's named his cabinet, taken a look at Korea, and how has completed the first moves in outlining a new policy for the entire far east. It's quite an accomplishment.

And there has been a transformation in Eisenhower, too, since he won the election. The personality is no longer blurred.

John Foster Dulles gave Eisenhower full credit for this week's conference which are shaping

attered All Records With 81 ent Tally in November Election

The official record books for presidential election were opened today, because 494,916 of the 50 million total either scratched their presidential ballots or had them thrown out.

The total presidential vote was 11,777,549 more than the previous record of 48,820,213 cast in the Roosevelt-Wilkie contest in 1940 election.

Eisenhower got 68.1 per cent of the total vote, Stevenson 44.4 and others 0.3. Eisenhower's percentage of the major party vote was 53.4, Stevenson's 44.4.

Sixty-three per cent of the adult population—potential voters—cast votes for President, reversing a downward trend that had been in evidence since 1940. The vote represented 81 per cent of the nation's estimated eligible voters.

The figures show Eisenhower rang up a tremendous personal victory in the 37 states where figures on other statewide two-party races were available. Eisenhower ran

ahead of the highest man on the state Republican ticket—senator, governor or other officer—in all except six states. Only state candidates in Arizona, Minnesota, New Hampshire, North Dakota, Vermont and Wisconsin topped the Eisenhower vote.

Stevenson, on the other hand, topped Democratic state candidates in only nine states and lagged behind them in 27. The highest Democratic state candidate outpolled him by a net of 2,011,133.

Stevenson topped Democratic state candidates only in Arizona, Delaware, Kentucky, Maine, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, North Dakota and South Dakota.

Eisenhower won a plurality in 39 states for an electoral vote of 454 to Stevenson's 89 in nine states.

Eisenhower's biggest pluralities over Stevenson were New York, 488,214; California, 62,767; Ohio, 500,124; Illinois, 443,407. His smallest was 2,437 in Tennessee.

Stevenson's largest plurality was

253,344 in Georgia. He skinned through Kentucky by only 700.

The final official vote was reached Friday as canvassed figures became available from the last four states—California, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island and West Virginia.

Their official tabulations came just before the deadline Monday when the presidential electors met in their respective states to cast their votes. The votes will be counted by a joint session of congress Jan. 6.

BOISE, Dec. 13 (AP)—Special traffic surveys were conducted in five Idaho areas by the state highway department in the past two years.

The surveys were made to determine the ratio between costs and benefits of various alternate routes and types of improvements, the state highway board said in its first annual report.

Studies were made in the Burley-Twin Falls area, U. S. highway 10 near Smelterville and at Ashton, Nampa and Lewiston.

JEROME, Dec. 12—Patrick McMonigle, Halsey, was bound over to district court Thursday afternoon by Probate Judge Theron Ward on a charge of selling liquor in Jerome without a license.

McMonigle was arrested on Nov. 30 by Lehman Edwards, liquor law

enforcement officer. When arraigned before Judge Ward, McMonigle demanded a preliminary hearing. Bond was posted and Thursday was set as the time for the hearing.
