New Churches Being Built at Rapid Rate; Big Funds Noted

NEW YORK, Dec. 15 — Drive through almost any city, and you'll see a wealth of new churches, either up or going up. It's the result of one of the biggest waves of church building in this country's history. "There's never been anything like it," said a spokesman for the bureau of church building and architecture of the National Council of Churches. All three major faiths—Catholic, Protestant and Jewish—have poured huge funds into projects for expanding and adding new religious structures in the last few years. "The boom in church building has been notable particularly in the metropolitan Midwest and far western areas," said the Rev. Edgar Thomas J. McCarthy of the National Catholic Welfare conference. An estimated billion dollars worth of new Protestant churches now are in the process of being planned in the architect's offices. Thousands of others already are being newly finished.

Chinese Reds Reject Truce Plan of India

TOKYO, Dec. 15 (AP)—Communist China batted hopes today for an immediate armistice in Korea by rejecting a United Nations plan announced at Beijing. Foreign Minister Chou En-lai had called formal rejection of the plan to U. N. general assembly President Lester D. Pearson, Canada. Chou demanded that the assembly "cancel its illegal resolution" and that the assembly urge the United States "immediately resume the Panmunjon truce talks." Rejected Since Oct. 8, the U. N. declared an indefinite truce in the truce talks on Oct. 8 when the Reds refused to budge from their insistence on the repatriation of all communist prisoners held by the U. N. The United Nations would return only those who wished to return to the communist side. U. N. holds 116,000 prisoners. Including 20,000 Chinese. Of the total 83,000, including 6,000 Chinese, want to return to the communists. The other 80,000 and they would rather die than return. Chou's long cable to Pearson, dated Dec. 14, demanded that a truce be carried out on the basis of the drafted Korean truce agreement.

Most Cherished Documents of U. S. Moved to New Location

WASHINGTON, Dec. 15 (AP)—The two most cherished documents, the declaration of independence and the constitution, were placed tenderly and with great care Saturday in what should be their final resting place.

A military guard of honor with bayonets flashing in the chill Washington sun, two army M-24 tanks and a huge armored car were part of the elaborate precautions taken to protect the historic documents over the 10-block route from the Library of Congress to the National Archives building on Constitution Avenue.

There they join the third great American inscription of freedom, the bill of rights, placed in the national archives in 1938.

The entire display may be moved from its place in exhibition hall to an underground vault 22 feet below by an elevator-like mechanism.

The declaration was written by Thomas Jefferson on instructions from the continental congress. President Truman will make the formal dedicatory speech Monday in exhibition hall of the archive, a large semi-circular room which rises to a dome 75 feet above the floor.

All-Jet Bomber to Receive Test Soon

WASHINGTON, Dec. 15 (AP)—The air force's newest all-jet light bomber will make its maiden flight soon.

The Douglas-built B-68 is a modified version of the navy's ASD sweepwing, twin-jet attack plane. It has speeds up to 700 miles an hour, the air force said.

The air force previously disclosed it had ordered some reconnaissance versions of the AD-2, but had not revealed that it was building a light bomber of this type.

The B-68 and the Martin-built B-27 are the two light bombers the air force will use to replace the conventional B-65 light bombers now in use. The B-27 also is used for reconnaissance. It is listed as having a top speed of 370 miles an hour.

Research Reported for Music As Medicine for Sick Humans

By ALTON L. BLAKESLEE

NEW YORK, Dec. 10 (AP) — Can music help bring sick human minds and bodies back to health? There's evidence it can. But what kind of musical prescription turns the trick? Soothing? Irritating? A march, or a symphony? What music for each kind of trouble, each type of individual?

The Music Research Foundation, Inc., of New York is testing these questions, so doctors someday may be able to write musical prescriptions. The musicians are aware of the tremendous power of music. But we can't expect doctors to prescribe music as a therapy unless they first have full knowledge of the content of the "drug" they are prescribing, says Frances Paperte, founder of the foundation and former concert and opera singer.

The exact impact of music on emotions is only now being studied, she said.

The foundation is sponsoring research to learn what music does to and for people so music may be used scientifically in psychiatry and medicine. This work is headed by a research committee of directed psychiatrists, physicians, psychologists, musicians, and physiatrists. Dr. Jay T. Wiskit of Columbia is chairman of the board of directors.

In 1944, the army's surgeon-general authorized the foundation to test, under medical supervision, the effects of music on selected patients at Walter Reed general hospital in Washington.

One patient was a wounded bomber pilot, who had suffered mental shock, Miss Paperte recalls. He was silent, withdrawn. At the first trial of music therapy, he stayed only a few minutes. But he returned the next day, staying longer.

Music reminding him of his childhood touched him. His became interested, finally he volunteered he had always wished to become a musician. The offer of piano lessons delighted him. It was credited with helping to change his mental attitude and aid his recovery.

In three and one-half years experience, numerous patients appeared to benefit, state psychiatrists reported. But it was apparent to medical leaders, Miss Paperte says, that not enough facts were known about music and its effects on people to make musical therapy scientifically useful now.

More knowledge was needed. The foundation now is sponsoring three research projects.

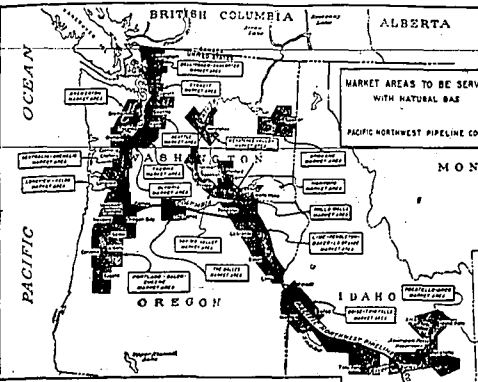

Auto Industry Eyeing Use of Plastic Bodies

DETROIT, Dec. 15 (U)—The auto industry currently is experiencing a mild rash of plastic body cars.

Kaiser-Frazer recently announced it would build a limited number of such vehicles. No major car maker is yet producing them. Generally, the future about the molded plastic body stems from individual experimenters who adapt attractive appearance sports model bodies to the chassis and engines of different major auto companies.

The plastic body researchers apparently have overcome one of the major problems encountered by the late Henry Ford in his efforts two decades ago to produce a satisfactory plastic body. That problem involved the difficulty of producing a plastic that would be immune to

extreme heat and extreme cold. This was a problem, incidentally, that also harassed the earlier experimenters in synthetic rubber tires. They found that in extremely cold temperature areas tires produced of man-made "rubber" became brittle. They found, too, that they had to rely more upon natural rubber in truck tires because of the extreme heat generated in truck calings even at normal speed.


