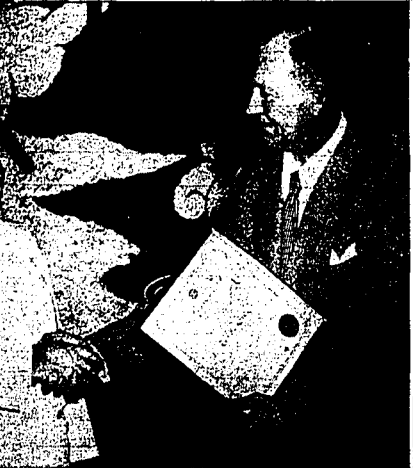


Club Receives Charter

Gas by 1954 Predicted as Boise Parley

BOISE, Dec. 17 (AP)—Idaho and other Pacific Northwest markets probably can be delivered naturally as by the fall of 1954, representatives of two companies seeking franchises to pipe gas into this area told the final session of the All-Idaho congress Tuesday.

Frank H. Wilson, a member of the Boise club and a past member of the National Exchange club's agriculture study panel, presented the charter to C. A. (Bud) Gore, the club's first president.

The ceremony followed an address by Wilson in which he urged the new club to be active in civic affairs and to help in the betterment of the community. He briefly outlined the exchange club's plan to build a gas pipeline from the Snake River valley to the Boise area.

The Idaho public utilities commission has granted Trans-Northwest a certificate of convenience and necessity to operate natural gas transmission lines in seven northwestern Idaho counties.

Robert Herring, Houston, Tex., vice president of Pacific Northwest Pipeline corporation, said his firm ready to construct a 138-mile gas pipeline from the San Juan basin in New Mexico and Colorado to Seattle and Portland through Utah and Idaho.

The federal power commission will issue a permit for the pipeline.

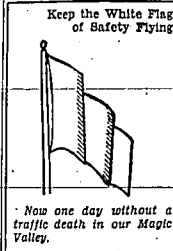

Red Propaganda Mailing Reported

CINCINNATI, O., Dec. 17.—Families of servicemen captured in Korea have received communist propaganda, some mailed from California with a strong anti-Japanese feeling.
 One mother told the Cincinnati Post she received booklets from Pacific Calif., describing "allegations" committed by American troops. The booklets said the troops were trained by "sleazy crews of Japanese officers."
 Other mothers reported they received booklets printed in Czechoslovakia. They gave glowing descriptions of life in communist-held countries.
 Others said they received letters requesting money "so your son can spend a vacation in China" from a prisoner of war camp.
 One mother said she received a magazine saying most of the American prisoners of war have been transferred to Russia.
 Personal taxes in the United States took 3.4 cents of each customer dollar in 1933-41 and 11.8 cents in 1952.

U. S. Adds to Legal Claims Against Russia

WASHINGTON, Dec. 17.—The United States filed up more legal claims against Russia today but officials admitted the chances of collecting are nil.
 The state department filed a suit note to Moscow late yesterday demanding "compensation" for an American B-29 and eight air men shot down by Soviet fighters near Japan last October.
 The United States previously had called on the Kremlin to make a full accounting in the case of the B-29, although there has been no decision yet.
 Legal Action Eyed
 Officials said the government was planning to take legal action to try to recover damages in the Hungarian incident. The same might be done, they said, in the case of the B-29, although there has been no decision yet.
 Officials said privately an attempted suit or appeal to the international court might have some propaganda value. But they doubted it would produce any cash. They said the hard fact is Moscow would have to agree to be sued and this is considered extremely unlikely.
 Figure Not Set
 The United States called for nearly \$100,000 in damages in the Hungarian plane incident but didn't put a figure on compensation for the B-29 and crew.
 The 300-mph note charged, however, that the attack last Oct. 7 was "unprovoked and unjustifiable" and that the Soviet fighters "illegally" invaded Japanese territory to make it.

Contract on Dam Signed by Nelson

BOISE, Dec. 17.—Harold T. Nelson, regional-director-for-the U. S. bureau of reclamation, has signed a repayment contract virtually insuring rehabilitation of Snake Rapids dam on the Rogue river in southwestern Oregon.
 Under the contract, the Grants Irrigation district obligates itself to repay the construction cost for the dam; Nelson said.
 The district is to make graduated payments on the cost, estimated as not to exceed \$850,000, the reclamation official said.

Taft Chances On Top Post Given Boost

WASHINGTON, Dec. 17 (AP)—Sen. Robert A. Taft's chances of becoming senior Republican floor leader here were given a boost today by the publication of statements from two of President-Elect Eisenhower's closest friends in congress.

"How much of a lift all depends on the reaction of Republican senators," said one source.

The statements came from Sen. Frank Carlson, R., Kans., and H. Alexander Smith, R., N. J., who are in the light of other Carlson remarks, his statement was interpreted here as something less than an endorsement of Taft for the floor leadership.

But it was also regarded as evidence that the Eisenhower administration would not fight to prevent the election of the Ohioan, who lost the contest at the Republican national convention in June, 1946.

Arguments on Gambling Tax Being Voiced

WASHINGTON, Dec. 17 (U. P.)—When a bill "friendly" to a tobacco and a "wager" is introduced by Jacob Kossman, Philadelphia attorney with a flair for re-examining these are two of the many questions Congress left in the air when it passed the 1931 gambling tax, Kossman wants the supreme court to declare the law unconstitutional because of its "bizarre and fantastic" definitions. He contends it also violates the constitution's guarantee against self-incrimination.

Hearing held by Kossman and Robert E. Stern, government attorney defending the law, evoked numerous queries from the justices, at a hearing opening yesterday and continuing today.

Stern argued that Congress was properly exercising its taxing power when it passed the law requiring gamblers to purchase a \$50 stamp tax and register the names, addresses, places of business, and names of employers.

He said such registration provisions are found in numerous other tax laws and their validity has never been doubted. The information is needed to enforce collection, he contended.

Remitting Not Taxing
Kossman said the point is to penalize illegal intrastate gambling under the pretense of enforcing the federal tax power.

Stern argued that the law was on a gambling act, not just on the regulations. But Kossman rejoined that the statute had been "cleverly" written to exempt "friendly" bets, operations of charitable institutions, and legal gambling in Nevada and the like.
