Eisenhower Names Four Top Officials Of Defense Bureau

NEW YORK, Dec. 19 (AP)—President-Elect Eisenhower announced today his selection of the civilians who will head the armed services under Charles E. Wilson, secretary of defense-designate. They are: Deputy secretary of defense—Roger M. Kyes, 46, Bloomfield Hills, Mich., a vice president of General Motors.

Secretary of the army—Robert A. Stevens, 63, of South Plainfield, N. J., a director of the General Electric Corporation, General Foods and Jackson Mills, and chairman of the board of J. P. Morgan & Co. and company, textile manufacturer.

Secretary of the navy—Robert B. Anderson, 42, Vernon, Tex., a director and deputy chairman of the federal reserve bank, Dallas.

Secretary of the air force—Harold L. Talbot, 64, New York, former chairman of the board of the North American Aviation company and a member of the board of the federal finance commission.

Talbot was active as an adviser during the Eisenhower administration's presidential campaign. The others selected today had not figured in the campaign highlight of a national scale. All the designations must be approved by the senate.

James C. Harter, Eisenhower's press secretary, announced the appointments today.

He said they were decided upon after a series of conferences between the candidates and the president-elect's chief of staff, Gen. Lyndon B. Johnson.

The new appointments were announced as Eisenhower faced a number of crucial decisions in coping with inflation.

HOW THINGS APPEAR FROM PEGLER'S ANGLE

When Gen. Maxwell Taylor was superintendent of the military academy, he lectured the cadets on the professional soldier's relation to the enlisted soldiers who accept his authority but hold him to high standards of behavior.

...I continue to quote General Maxwell, substituting references to the press where he spoke of the military.

"This, then, is a rough picture of the kind of people to whom you will be required to give editorial leadership. There is no standard only as to what characteristics are most important in editors.

"Nevertheless, all the great editorial leaders of the past and present have been devoted to the welfare of their country. I would mention as an attribute of the casual editor the gift of human understanding, the ability to treat American persons as individuals and not as masses.

"Americans resent any suggestion that they are without individuality, that they are social security numbers, units of circulation in a survey prepared to impress advertisers, and not people.

"They want to be known for themselves and will resist efforts to mold them into an anonymous mass. All great editors have been successful in convincing their people that they respect them as individuals."

There are phases of the discussion, wherein General Taylor studied the personal relation of the officer to troops, which are sharply in-

"Our pioneer forefathers, who pushed the frontiers of the nation to the west were not individualistic. They treated restraint even to the point of lawlessness. This tradition of disregard for law is visible today in mass picketing, soldier demonstrations, mob violence and, most dramatically, but none the less typically, in the shower of pop bottles which falls around the unfortunate umpires at the ball game.

"Few of our public enterprises have escaped this American attitude, this love of giving authority the broadest of certainly the press (Editors) cannot claim any immunity. Editors (officers) must recognize and respect this attitude of the American people. It is a phenomenon which we cannot, and probably should not, try to change because it is a necessary concomitant of the vigorous virtues which are inherent in most of our citizens.

"The critical tendency puts the editors (officers) to the test. They cannot be the blind and unmerciful obedience of the Russian. They cannot expect to receive a respectful hearing by hundreds of editorial plutocrats. (Reading military gospel from a book.)

"No American institution is sacred to the American people. They will criticize all and it behooves our military officers to be up to sound ground and know their stuff if they expect to carry conviction.

But the competition among editors or editorial executives to cultivate popularity for papers has cheapened the press even in the eyes of the same people who receive prizes for the prettiest baby, the best salad dressings and other carnal trophies.

It has become a too-important phase of journalism. The general educated cadets to know their soldiers individually, an impossibility for editors in large cities. There is a middle ground, however.

The editor should not try to be a mother's little helper, giving no sense at lunchings and petty indignation at grim evening meetings of precinct improvement associations.

Such baby-sitting in "public relations" should be assigned to those incurably ineane and ineffective trouble-shooter who occurs in most shops.

The editor should read a great deal and try to keep his mind firm against propaganda and cliches. Some "knowers" have fallen into a habit of referring to the CIO and AFL as "labor," knowing that they take the trouble to think it out, that labor is a word of noble meaning and that these two big job-mongers do not deserve the bleating un-AFL.

The CIO and AFL never have been willing to submit to a public lack of freedom of the press.

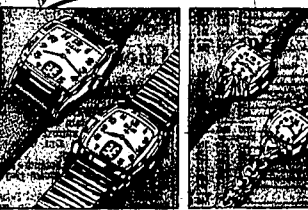
Care of Your Children

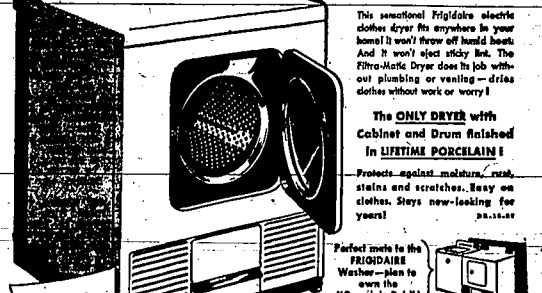

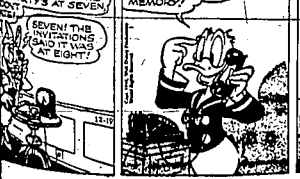
