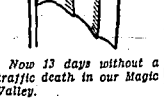

WASHINGTON, Dec. 22 (AP)—The Interstate Commerce commission told Utah today it will have to raise its intrastate railroad freight rates on a dozen heavy commodities to conform to the national freight rate pattern.

British Okay Radical New 4-Engine Jet

London, Dec. 29 (AP)—The world's most advanced jet bomber with four engines—whose giant plants are now being built in quantity—was made its first flight Saturday after the flight at the Royal Aircraft Establishment, the air force said it had ordered the bomber named the Handley Page "Queen" for the bomber.

The bomber, which is being built by the Handley Page Co., is a four-engine jet bomber with which the British are presently holding the lead in jet commercial aircraft with the high-performance Handley Page jet fighters also are being developed.

Differences in Stalin Text Translation Water Down 'Peace' Bid, Scribe Says

Editor's note: Differences between the Russian text and published English translation of Premier Stalin's statement are found by N.Y.A.'s roving correspondent, Charles Dennen says. Russia's policy since the 15th. The interpretation of the meaning of Stalin's words is that of a subtle to the field of communist relations with the world.

NEW YORK, (NEA)—There are important differences between the Russian text of Premier Stalin's Christmas day statement and the widely-published English text.

First, Stalin did not say he would regard "favorably" a suggestion that he meet with President-Elect Eisenhower. He said he would regard such a suggestion "positively."

The Russian word for this is "polobiteleno" and its meaning falls considerably short of the word "favorably" used in the English text supplied by the Russian embassy in Washington.

Similarly, on the question of settling the war in Korea, Stalin did not offer to "cooperate," as was generally reported. He merely offered to "collaborate" in diplomatic moves to end the war.

The Russian word used by Stalin was a "sotrudnichestvo" (collaborate) and not "koperirovka" (cooperate). Again, the accurate translation waters down the strength of Stalin's reported language.

Stalin's Christmas eve offer "unquestionably" is another attempt to divide the non-communist world. This time his gesture comes just when France and Germany are experiencing much difficulty in ratifying the European army pact. Stalin's words would have the effect of weakening the hand of those pushing the pact while strengthening growing sentiment toward European "neutrality."

The Kremlin wants Europeans to think they may be left out on a limb while the new Republican administration in the United States goes ahead with two-way negotiations with the Russians. The fact that Eisenhower has told the Europeans repeatedly we will not let them down might be overlooked in a jittery attempt to read new meaning into Stalin's old words.

What the Russian dictator seems to be angling for is to cast the United States in the role taken by Nazi Germany in the 1930s. Then Russia led the world in denunciation of the Hitler regime—and then made a pact with Germany.

For the past year the Russians have stepped up their late-American campaign—even using many of the identical charges they hurled against the Nazis. Now Stalin offers to "collaborate" with the U.S.

Revolt Urged In Report on Miner Union

WASHINGTON, Dec. 22.—The senate internal security subcommittee urged the rapid reorganization of the national union of Mine, Mill and Smelter Workers today to revolt against pro-communist leadership.

The union, now independent, was expelled by the CIO in 1950 on grounds that it followed a Communist party line. Its membership is employed in the copper and other non-ferrous metal industries.

The subcommittee asserted "the union has since become a Korean war organ."

"Harvey M. Kasson, a former Communist, testified," the subcommittee added, "that Clinton Jencks, in 1946 a CIO representative of miners in New Mexico, told him in 1950 the communists in the union were planning strikes in the copper industry, under the guise of wage demands, in an effort to cut down production of metal for the Korean war effort."

In a report on hearings held at Salt Lake City in October, the subcommittee said it should be a matter of deep concern that the union "has operated in the industry so vital to the security of the nation, is controlled by officers who are known to be communists and will not deny their membership in the Communist party."

Union's Reply Blasts Report

DENVER, Colo., Dec. 22.—The International Union of Mine, Mill and Smelter Workers today blasted the report with what it called the "unfounded, undocumented, and foolish charges leveled against the union."

The union released a 1,000-word statement in connection with the publication of a senate subcommittee on internal security report.

The statement said the union "is a democratic organization and has no ties with the Communist party."

The union leaders said: "We note that in releasing his so-called report," Sen. Philip McCarran, D., Calif., said that the union's "testimony" of the discredited Harvey M. Kasson.

The Pope named in his place Msgr. Valeriano Orazi, archbishop of Bombay, India.

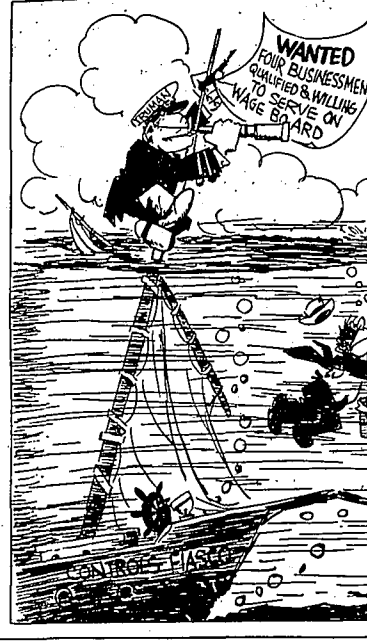

Truman Convinced Peace Is Possible, Thinks Korea Decision His Toughest

WASHINGTON, Dec. 22.—President Truman is getting ready to leave office convinced that a strong America, cooperating with strong and healthy partner nations, can maintain peace with Russia.

He believes his decision to send American troops into Korea under United Nations mandate may have saved the world from another global war.

That step, he told me, was the toughest decision he ever had to make, tougher even than the one to drop atomic bombs on Japanese cities in 1945 because it involved the risk of a third world war.

I talked with the President in his Oval room office at the White House Friday. It was one of a series of personal interviews he is granting separately to a small group of reporters that have covered him fairly through his occupancy of the White House.

Truman is proud of his record on foreign affairs and feels that, when the history of his administration is written by future researchers, it will be noted for having kept the world out of war for nearly eight long, crisis-ridden years.

He is planning a nationwide broadcast sometime in January summarizing up what he considers the achievements of his administration and the succeeding steps undertaken by the United States in congress to be delivered early in the session opening Jan. 3.

He is proud of the Greek-Turkish aid program, the Marshall plan and the succeeding steps undertaken by this government to strengthen the economic and military potential of communist-dominated nations.

When he ordered the bombing of Japan, Truman said, he was told it would shorten the war and save the lives of possibly 50,000 American and as many Japanese.

In that case, there was no question of the course to take, he said.

Report Shows Huge Need of School Space

WASHINGTON, Dec. 22.—The nation needs nearly one billion of a million more classrooms to give its school children adequate and safe learning facilities, the office of education said today.

A nation-wide survey by the office showed a need for 15,000 classrooms in every city and town. Another 17,000 are needed to replace obsolete or unsafe classrooms not worth remodeling.

The reports put the cost of need of new facilities at nearly 11 billion dollars. That is about 16 times the amount spent on new school construction in 1951.

The 1948-49 dimensions of the school shortage, the report said the additional space required to replace obsolete classrooms and to provide additional housing space in Philadelphia. This would be the same amount of space as would be provided in country building 32 feet wide and stretching across the continent.

"Over the past two years has seen record-breaking school construction. Nevertheless, the survey shows that more than 100 million in elementary and secondary schools when school buildings up since the 1920s."

And, the education office said, the situation is similar in other cities. About 25,000 schoolrooms are needed just to replace the present shortage. Another 25,000 classrooms will be required by 1960 to handle growing school enrollments, the report said.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 22.—History's 1948 atomic explosion apparatus is being readied for a test at the Nevada Atomic Test Range. The field is being built to test either a new A-bomb model or an artillery or guided missile warhead.

The blast test site was set up in the desert some 75 miles west of Las Vegas in 1951. Some of atomic blasts have been tested there. The last Nevada test was June 3, 1952, when a 250,000-ton blast was sent 725 miles away at Kallispell, Mont.

BOISE, Dec. 22.—Idaho's year-old gross weight truck license law appears to be on the verge of revision by the 1953 Idaho legislature.

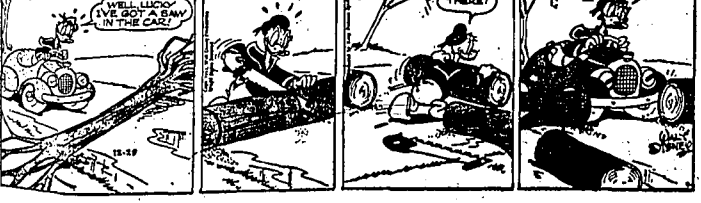

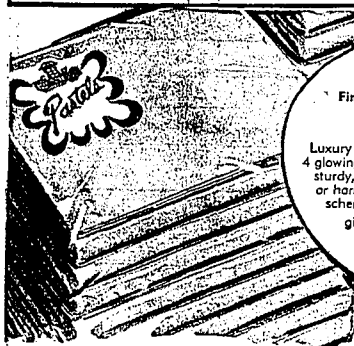
