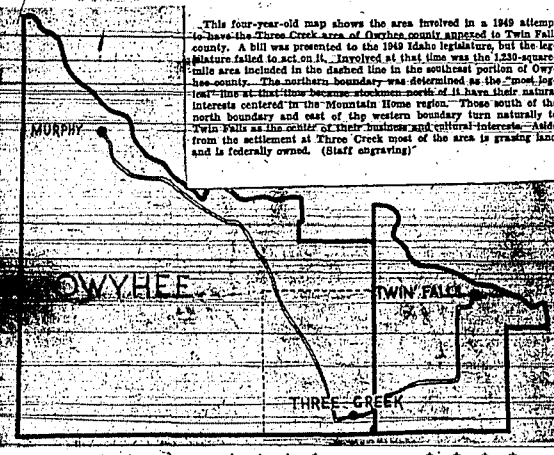

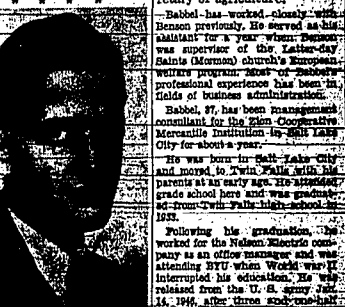

The new golden jubilee model Ford tractor with hydraulic controls and three-point linkage for implements is now on display at Pioneer Tractor and Implement company, 220 Second avenue south. The new tractor, marking the 50th anniversary of the Ford Motor company, is more powerful, larger and heavier than the Model 80 it replaces. Over-all length has been increased to 120 inches and the weight to 2,510 pounds. It is powered by the entirely new overhead Ford "Reddy" engine.

A new design feature is the full-view instrument cluster panel set in raised section of the hood for the convenience of the operator; instruments include the exclusive Proof-Meter, ammeter, temperature gauge and oil pressure gauge. Split-Second Response—The hydraulic system has been improved for greater power and faster, more accurate operation. The new model introduces a system completely filled with oil at all times for a split-second response to controls. The hydraulic pump is driven by the engine, providing a constant source of hydraulic power while the engine is running, which makes adjustment of the clutch, suspension and eliminates many gear shifting operations. The hydraulic system lifting power has been increased to approximately 1,000 pounds at the drawbar. It has been my experience during these two years of operation that considerably over half the people visiting the rink have been from churches, school classes and other organizations of Magic Valley, and not especially the young people of Twin Falls. Hundreds of these people have expressed satisfaction with the wholesome entertainment they have enjoyed here.

Now, you ask a lot of Twin Falls teenagers, as I have, why they don't visit the rink and they will tell you they don't because—using their own expression—"the no-accounts" go there. It is for this reason, how could a group of young people work for three months and produce a polo skate show with net proceeds of \$250 for the polo derby? No, I for one, would never think of a young person willing to devote his or her time to such a worthy cause as being a "no-account."

I believe the main answer as to why we do not have more successful entertainment in Twin Falls is that the young people will not utilize and support the many fine recreational facilities we already have in Twin Falls.

As an operator of a recreational business, I'd like to object to this plan to Jerry and other young people interested. If the young people through their schools, churches and other fine organizations will only desire the type of recreation they desire and support through their attendance, I realize that all young people regardless of social position can enjoy the same privileges as long as they conduct themselves properly. Twin Falls will have a lot more recreation for teenagers.

I'll agree with Jerry—that the citizens and parents of Twin Falls will also support wholesome entertainment for their young people, if the young people will conduct themselves as good citizens of our community.

"Fire Engine" for Canal Breaks Kept On Duty by Twin Falls Canal Company

The key to handling canal breaks efficiently is speed, declares Alfred Peters, Twin Falls Canal company manager. "It's just like a fire. Fire engines are all ready at any moment an emergency strikes."

That's what gave Peters the idea of having an emergency truck ready for such emergencies—a truck to carry equipment and materials to the break site and make speedy repairs and prevent potential damage.

Other important items among the truck's collection are a number of 2- by 12-inch timbers, in about 12-foot lengths, used to form an emergency "walkway" across the escaping water. One board is tossed out from each side of the break providing a place for workers to stand while driving the piling. If necessary, 4 by 4 supports are hauled off the truck to serve as supports for the walkway.

Also aboard the emergency vehicle are rolls of canvas sheeting and bales of burlap bags to be used as bank sealers and other important items such as picks and shovels, and nails.

Chains and hooks are available for handling the piling and removing it when it is no longer needed. The chains also are available for possible use in case the truck gets stuck. For night work, the truck carries a stock of lamps and a lantern of prevention—a can of lamp fuel. Rubber boots also are handy.

The emergency truck reverts to normal duty during the winter when water is turned out of the company's canals.

The truck happens to be a unique feature of the canal company's operation. The organization is alert in other ways. Manager Peters says he has had in his office a roster showing just where the three to eight-man repair-and-maintenance crews are working at any given time. If a break comes on any part of the company's 200,000-acre tract, the truck is the way mobile crew reacts to the crew nearest the break to recruit manpower. Nearly every one subject to night calls carries in his own car a high-powered flashlight which can be plugged into the dashboard lighter socket.

The company is now considering installing radio equipment to further expedite the operation. A survey is under way to determine the feasibility of such a plan.

Such a move appears likely, reports Peters who notes that the greater part of radio equipment and its installation is the determining factor. The survey should be completed within 30 days and it appears that radio equipment will be installed. "It's the coming thing," says Peters, "it's only a matter of time."
