### Estimates on Incomes Due In Ten Days

WASHINGTON, Jan. 5 (AP)—Seven million taxpayers face a double deadline for the federal tax collector in 10 days.

Jan. 15 is the deadline for filing amended estimates of income taxes for 1952 and also for paying the final installment on estimated taxes for last year.

They will have to either submit an amended estimate, however, if you file your regular 1952 tax return and pay the tax due by Jan. 15. An amended estimate is needed only if your previous estimate was off more than 20 per cent from actual income.

### Most Are Exempt

The big majority of U. S. taxpayers are wage-earners, most of whom are not required to file tax estimates. Most of the estimates come from persons in business for themselves or from those with considerable investments.

Tax estimates are required from wage earners only if: 1. Their wages are not subject to withholding last year. 2. They have more than \$100 income apart from their wages from which taxes were withheld. 3. They have other income such as interest, dividends on stock, or profit from the sale of investments such as automobiles or securities. In the latter case, only half of the profit is taxable if the property was bought more than six months before its sale.

### Regulations Noted

If their 1952 wages subject to withholding are more than \$4,500 plus \$500 for each exemption, which figures out \$5,000 for a single earner and \$6,000 for a married man with two children.

Farmers do not have to make an advance estimate of taxes due if they file their 1952 returns and pay their taxes by Jan. 31. In writing this provision into the law, Congress took into consideration that many farmers are over-harvested late in the year and the farmer isn't sure what his production is going to be until he gets it into the barn.

### European Nations To Examine New Union 'Blueprint'

BRUSSELS, France, Jan. 5 (AP)—Leading legislators from the six European nations and Britain gathered this week to examine the latest blueprint for a European union.

This blueprint is the work of a 1952-53 constitutional committee meeting in Paris for several weeks. Eighty-seven MPs of the sponsoring nations will be voting on the special one-time only assembly which was formed last September to write a constitution for the union. They will be followed by 18 observers from Britain and other member states of the Council of Europe.

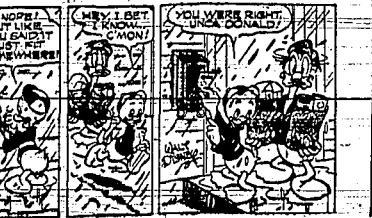

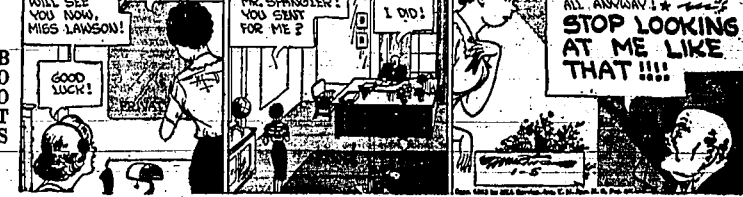
