Convicts Defy Prison Chiefs In New Trials

PITTSBURGH, Jan. 19.—Sixty-five convicts in two big riots and wrecked havoc at big Western State penitentiary today defied prison officials backed by the armed might of Pennsylvania.

The cold and hungry convicts held four guard hostages—two were captured originally—and angrily shouted for prison reform. They smashed windows and looted police lockers...

Warden J. W. Clardy moved cautiously to avoid bloodshed although he declared the riot was not a riot but a rebellion.

Col. G. H. Wilson, state police commander, arrived from Harrisburg to direct 72 state troopers who moved into the prison yard...

In 1952 \$425,700 was spent building 48 new dwellings. This is a decrease of 28 per cent over 1951, when residential expenditures were \$585,000.

Twin Falls construction estimates during November and December of 1951 totaled \$400,000 and \$370,000, respectively. In December 1951, construction figures totaled \$122,500, or about 52 per cent over the same month in 1950.

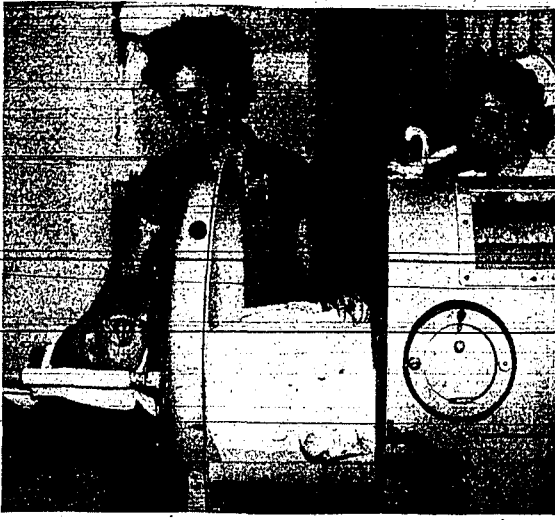

Should the group decide to form the district, the boundaries and name would have to be decided upon prior to circulation of petitions to the state. The petitions would be presented to the state soil conservation commission.

If the state commission approved the petition a hearing would be called, followed by a referendum vote. A two-thirds majority of the farmers voting would be required to form the district.
Misunderstanding on the governing of the district developed at the Thursday meeting. Committee members emphasize that the five-man board elected by the farmers of the district would formulate the policies of the district, not any representatives of the state commission.
The local supervisors would be entitled to technical assistance from the soil conservation service if they requested it. They urge all farmers in the area to watch for a notice of next week's meeting, and attend it.

President's Last Press Conference Is Informal; Several Strangers Present

WASHINGTON, Jan. 19 (Special)—Veterans around the Press club were asking each other questions like, "Have you got your check for the funeral this afternoon over at the White House?"
They referred to the President's final press conference. And many stayed away. I went.
I'm sure the affair was one of the most casual ever involving a chief executive of the U. S. and akin to the gatherings at the White House in the robust days of Andrew Jackson.
Not that the reporters were too forward or Mr. Truman undignified. All was simply informal behavior.
"First off, all of Washington could have walked in off the street and into the meeting. And many did. I never saw so many strange faces at a press conference. The room was jammed but many a citizen, many absent and his seat occupied by a stranger. The secret service made no adequate check of credentials.
Strictly before the scheduled time to start, an aide announced the President was in an adjoining room and would like to shake the hand of all present if they'd like through sign. Mr. Truman leaves office with every appearance of good health, unlike the broken Woodrow Wilson or another Democrat, FDR, whose body was shattered by the job.
Mr. Truman has a pinkish coloring, a back to an attractive attitude and still wears an American Legion button in his lapel and a Masonic ring as he did on entering the office. He was, however, now wearing a white handkerchief in his breast pocket rather than one matching his tie.
All the President's staff was flanking him, except Maj. Gen. Harry Vaughan, who has just about disappeared from sight these days.
Mr. Truman started the conference by reading a statement warmly endorsing the idea of the wide-open question-and-answer method. This will endear him to reporters, who fear Mr. Eisenhower will require to writers questions and infrequent meetings with the press.
He then announced he had sent another letter and the phrase drew laughs from him and the crowd but this time to congress on a serious problem.
Questions varied from what type of hat he'd wear at the inauguration to tidbits on oil and relations with Canada. The President said he was leaving a certain order and an inexperienced reporter came up with the query, "Before you leave office, are you just as kind and...
said he obviously couldn't issue one after he left.
There was an unusual end to the session, which lasted about a half-hour. No reporter made the customary remark of "Thank you, Mr. President." Instead, Mr. Truman simply said in a few sentences how much he enjoyed his relations with reporters and a round of vigorous applause followed.
The President's staff, it might be added, seemed far from cheerful. Until lately any one of them could have gone out into private life and gotten rich. Now the job hunting for them and most Democrats is tough going.

Television Held '52 Spotlight in Sports

NEW YORK, Jan. 19 (AP)—The most significant sports trend of 1952 was television's effect on attendance and popularity, and the future impact of this pink entertainment medium on amateur, professional sports.

That was the consensus of the nation's sports writers and sportsasters replying Monday to the annual year-end poll of the Associated Press.

More than half a hundred of the replies to the question dealt with some phase of video in relation to sports after their first full-year that facilities have been available to transmit major contests from coast to coast and into millions of living rooms throughout the land.

A year ago, the outstanding trend was the nationwide cry for demerolization of college football and other intercollegiate sports such as basketball following the shooting incident. This was secondary characteristic of 1952, in the minds of the writers.

The first of 1952—which was to bring the world series, championship boxing bouts, big college and professional football games, and the first full-year of other sports, to a nationwide audience—was yet to be felt. Last January only the first year of the telecast of television's relationship to sports attendance.

Another key question in 1952 was the NCAA's tight restrictions on television of college football games with its "no camera" rule, which is only on the network.

Others were concerned with declining attendance at major and minor league sports, and the "no camera" rule. Here are a few comments on the question, "what was the most significant sports trend during 1952?"

First, the "no camera" rule. "The first threat of the sports Frankenstein—TV."

"A broader outlook on television and perhaps a relaxation of the no-camera rule. Television has been a boon for boxing and nearly as many for football, especially professional, yet proved detrimental in gate receipts."

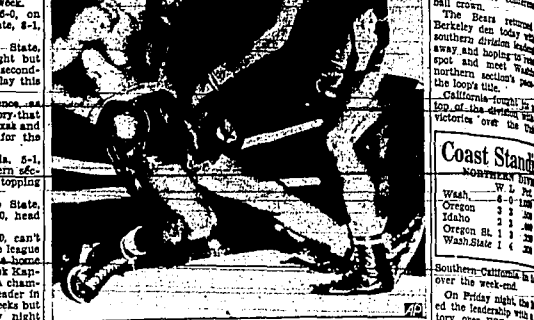

Tennis Moguls Decide to Pay Amateurs' Expenses

NEW YORK, Jan. 19 (AP)—The U. S. Lawn Tennis Association, frustrated at home and abroad for the last three years by a quiet Australian named Frank Sedgman, has taken the first step toward a more realistic amateur code by proposing its eight-week rule.

Sedgman, 1952 Wimbledon champion and hero of the first in a series to replace even a decade's delay to ditch the expense-limiting "regulating B-8" which prohibits an amateur from accepting expenses for only 10 tournaments yearly.

U. S. amateurs now will be permitted to accept expenses in tournament play throughout the year. The U.S.L.T.A. move matches that of the International Tennis Federation, which took similar action in 1951.

Section two defines a professional tennis player as one who is paid directly, or indirectly for playing, engaging in, or teaching the game for tennis or any other form of athletic competition, or sport, or who has competed in any game or sport for a stake, or prize, or for large money."
