# Wilson Held up Pending Ike's Nomination

WASHINGTON, Jan. 21 (AP)—The senate today belatedly confirmed President Eisenhower's cabinet choices, but the fate of Charles McNamara, a defense secretary nominee, remained in doubt.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 21 (AP)—Chairman Stenholm, R., said today the senate armed services committee will act on the nomination of Charles E. Wilson as director of defense until President Eisenhower formally sends the nomination.

Meanwhile, the senate is holding up the nomination of McNamara, while the administration is holding up the nomination of Wilson.

They are former Sen. Henry Cabot Lodge, Jr., as U.S. representative to the United Nations and Harold E. Stassen as director of mutual security.

Earlier Republican Leader Taft asked the senate to confirm the cabinet members whose nominations have been submitted by the President.

Wilson's ownership of 2 1/2 million dollars worth of stock of General Motors, one of the largest defense contractors, led to his being asked to resign by the armed services committee.

Eisenhower had hoped that his cabinet selections—other than Wilson—would be confirmed by the senate Tuesday afternoon, but he was blocked by Sen. Wayne Morse, Ind. Ore. He could force a day's delay because senate rules do not permit action on confirmation on the same day it is received except by unanimous consent.

When Taft moved today for confirmation of the nominees, Morse got the floor and launched into an explanation of why he blocked action Tuesday.

# Ex-President Gets Sendoff From Throng

WITHE TRUMAN IN ROUTE TO MISSOURI, JAN. 21 (AP)—Harry S. Truman, 54, left Twin Falls, Idaho, tonight after an emotional-packed night marking the end of nearly eight critical years in the White House.

A throng of several thousand in Washington's Union station cheered him to the ship and called him "Harry," as crowds did in his fighting political campaign. In reply, Truman declared in a voice in which happiness seemed to mingle with sorrow:

Unforgettable Event

"All my life, I have been a long one, I've never had anything like this happen. I will never forget this if I live to be 100—and that's what I expect to do."

Old friends, Democratic senators, employees under his administration, banded up to the private car to shake his hand and wish him goodbye.

Aschenbrenner

The press was so heavy that Dean Aschenbrenner, Truman's secretary of state, had to help from a railroader to get to the platform where the Truman family held farewell open house before their private car.

It was the new ex-President's second big demonstration of the day. The first came within an hour of the Eisenhower inauguration ceremonies that made him a plain citizen. Like the train ride, it was as warm as anything in Truman's long public career.

The crowd sang at the train pulled out, "Auld Lang Syne."

# Boost for Parcel Post Rates Asked

WASHINGTON, Jan. 21 (AP)—The inter-state commerce commission decided today a petition from the postoffice department for a pay increase in parcel post rates averaging close to 30 per cent.

**Care of your Children**  
by ANGELO PATRI

—Our hearsay stories of children who are disrespectful of their mothers and who even call their mothers harsh names. Such a child will probably not revise his father, but occasionally a violator is shocked to hear himself or herself, the target of a child's bad language.

Everybody dislikes hearing a child use offensive words, and it is especially shocking when they are directed at his mother. We all have had experiences with bad language and bad manners in our relations with little children. Not knowing the meaning of the words, without understanding their implications, the child experiences a thrill at the effect the utterances produce. What is one to do?

*"The little kid, a small child came home with such an addition to his vocabulary, it is best to meet it with silence. That robe him of the pleasure of the desired effect. Look over his head and give him a simple direction: maybe about taking his coat to the closet, and go on from there. Do the same the second time. The third time look at him coldly and say, "We don't use such words in this family." The next time, and there will be no next time—and him to a room to sit by himself until he realize what he has done. But the less drama, the better.*

A good pattern of speech is about the best possible way to teach the children to use good language. If they hear profanity in the house, they will repeat the words they hear and that without discrimination as

to their auditors. Children usually follow the ways of their parents in thought, word and deed. If fathers and mothers want their children to speak clearly, to use the right words, they set a pattern.

It is useless to depend upon the schools to teach the children good manners and good speech when the home people are careless about both. No teacher can compete with the parents of a pupil. What father does, what mother does—that is the law and the gospel for them. The child who uses bad language to his mother often is reflecting his home background. Once or twice may be the passing reflection of a playmate's words, but the habitual offense has roots in his family, and the family alone can stop it.

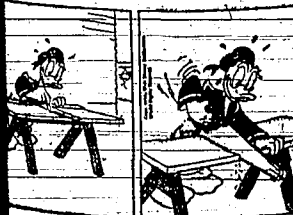

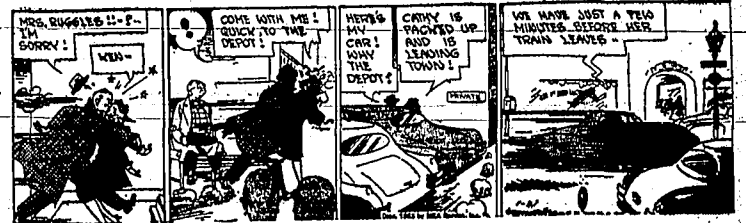
