Vow Heeded In Pledge to Disown Pacts

WASHINGTON, Feb. 2 (AP)—President Eisenhower's proposal to repudiate Roosevelt's secret agreements with Russia carried out in a Republican platform pledge.

The GOP, in its national convention, adopted a plan saying the government, "under its leadership, should disown all commitments contained in secret understandings such as those of Yalta which aid communist enslavement."

Mr. Eisenhower used almost the same words in his state-of-the-union message to congress.

To Ask Action

"We shall never acquiesce in the enslavement of any people in order to purchase fancied gain for ourselves," he said. "I shall urge the congress at a later date to join in an appropriate resolution making clear that this government recognizes no kind of commitment contained in secret understandings of the past with foreign governments which justify this kind of enslavement."

As far as is known the only secret agreements were those negotiated by the late President Roosevelt, Winston Churchill and Josef Stalin at the Crimea resort town of Yalta in February, 1945. Two months later Roosevelt was dead.

Conditions Cited

These secret agreements included Russia's decision to enter the war with Japan after Germany's surrender on the same condition that Russian rights in Manchuria lost to the war with Japan in 1904 be restored to the Soviet union; the southern part of Sakhalin island be returned to the Soviet union, and the commercial port of Dairen be internationalized.

The word Yalta has been sinister to the Republicans since rejection of the secret agreements in March, 1947, two years after the meeting.

Mystery Held by Grounded Vessel

SAN DIEGO, Calif., Feb. 2 (AP)—The Coast guard worked today to float a grounded freighter, loaded with secret military cargo, that radiated a mysterious story of an unsolved murder on the high seas.

If the report that the chief steward of the SS Fairhope was murdered at sea is correct, the slayer apparently is among the 42 crewmen stranded on the ship.

The Fairhope ran aground off San Benito Island, 40 miles west of Baja California, Friday night. A coast guard cutter reached the island yesterday and reported the ship was taking water and listing but the crew was in no immediate danger.
