Feb. 9 (P)—Chairman Earl Wright, R., Clark, said state affairs committee voted to introduce option slot machine bill later in the day.

Senate GOP Leader Robert A. Taft said tax legislation was not included in the 11-point list because the President and his leaders have made no final decision on tax policy.

The 11-point program is:

1. Full Appropriation Act
2. Appropriation bills to clear the house and reach the senate not later than May 1.
3. State tax overhaul.
4. Tax-Harley amendments.
5. Limited extension of controls over the steel industry.
6. Extension of the reciprocal trade law.
7. Extension of the reciprocal trade law.
8. Customs simplification.
9. Extension of old-age and survivors insurance to cover groups previously excluded.
10. Extension of temporary aid to schools and critical areas.
11. Adding two commissioners for the Federal Reserve.

The program was announced by Taft and House Speaker Joseph W. Pendergast.

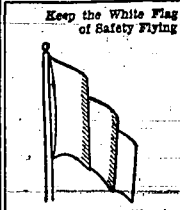

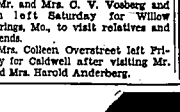

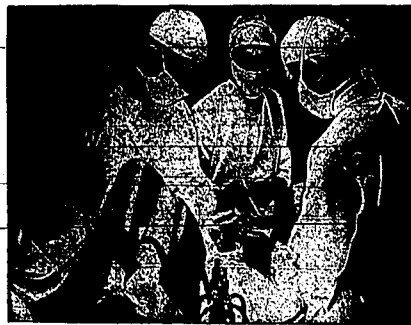
