





THAT WORD "BLOCKADE"

The dramatic word "blockade" still seems to command the headlines, but the fundamental goals of the Eisenhower administration in the far east evidently are in exactly the opposition direction—toward reducing rather than expanding the west's commitments there.

Secretary of State Dulles confirmed reports to this effect in his first press conference.

At the same time he eath his department is "considering" a blockade of Red China, along with a lot of other possible measures. But it is time so many of us—and our friends abroad—stopped equating "considering" and "adopting".

Dulles indicated

Dulles indicated the blockade idea has been under study almost continuously since the Chinese rods entered the Korean war, and acknowledged only that it is now getting "perhaps more intensive scrutiny." He made it clear that any concrete plan for a blockade or other new maneuver would not be framed without taking into account the views of friendly nations and the possible military consequences.

This is a far cry from the sort of irresponsible talk that in the last week or two has been pouring forth from eartain key places on capitol hill. The substance of that often idle chatter was that a blockade was virtually administration policy.

What does appear-to-be-Peasident Elsenhower's policy is this: To disengage both American and French ground forces from the fighting in Korea and Indo-China, at the same time stepping up aspisiance to the native armies which thereafter would have to communists.

A second aim is to free western forces so they can form a mobile reserve capable of moving with reasonable speed to any major trouble spot. As it is, major French and U. S. forces (a third of our army) are tied down in fringe wars that do not engage Russian ground manpower at all.

Manifestly this purpose cannot be achieved overnight. Thousands more South Koreans must be trained and equipped before they can replace U. S. and perhaps other western units in the lines. In France, a plan to step up use of native Indo-Chinese forces is only now gettigg into the discussion stage.

Fightermore, no withdrawal plan framed inching the meet optimistic terms will likely get around the necessity for continued U. S. naval and air support and possibly support of artillery and other specialized ground units.


