#### POLICIES AND SECRETS

The problem of secrecy in the framing of high government policy has been posed once again, in acute form, by the Eisenhower administration.

The problem of secrecy in the framing of all players and all provided the consideration. The President himself is responsible for this development. He has declared in deadly carnest that there shall be no leaks of information from top level conferences at the White House or in key agencies.

Despite his edict, leaks have occurred. But for the most part the 1ld has been clamped down with surprising effectiveness.

The question is: Is this good? Is it genuinely in the public interest that no inking shall be had of important new policies when they set in the formative stage?

A good many responsible members of the press think it is not. They believe that in many matters it is too late for sensible deads when a policy is formally announced and ready for carrying off.

For instance, many observers thought that we plunged into the making of the H-bomb with shockingly insufficient public discussion-of both the moral and the military aspects. Of course, this being a free country, there is nothing to prevent debate subsequent to policy announcements. But often it is not in time to forestall action of policy, the result is likely to be a weakening and contunion in the tone of the considered. And even if it does effect a modification of policy, the result is likely to the early phases, to weigh the pros and cons before policy is formally fixed. Then, with the atmosphere cleared and rash plans tempered by the heat of debate, the country's leaders can adopt a line that will command greater popular allegiance and respect.

The argument on the other side is, for one thing, that security frequently makes wide public discussion of major issues utterly impractical. Opponents of security don't want, to violate security, but they declare, that that term is too easily applied to information the public ought to have.

The defenders of servery say further that public attention on plans in their formative stage-scrity, handicaps the whole task only private conversations—free of the dverhanging fear of public reaction—can produce the kind of mental free-for-all that is wholly fruitful. Undoubtedly there is solid ment in this contention. But it is a point that plainly can be carried too far. It would seem fair to give the public reasonable cues to the main avenues being expired. This is a far different thing than disclosing every mental twist and turn of the high-level conferees.

By this means the administration would be able to test its chief ideas quickly in the crucible of public opinion, minimizing the prospect of serious error and of damage to the American leadership which is so vital to the free world.

Some time ago we commented on the praise given Idaho potatoes and the effectiveness of the Idaho Advertising commission, as expressed in the builtein of the Tabb Potato-Bervice, recognised by the trade as being an uthority on potato marketing.

In ils current bulletin, the Tabb Potato Bervice makes another interesting reference to Idaho potatoes, which should be good news to all the growers in the state:

"The potato boys are bewildered trying to figure out why Russets should bring such a terrific premium over all other potatoes. In New York City, Russets are bringing 56.00 against \$3.00 for Malries. Florida New Tritumphs in New York City are seiling at \$5.00 per cwt., which means that Russets are bringing a premium over the Florida new potatoes. In Chicago, Russets are bringing from \$1.50 to \$2.00 premium over Reds including McClures. Russets are also bringing a premium of \$1.50 over the new Reds from Florida. Seven in Mainn, Russets are getting exceptionally good outlet at a big premium over the potatoes that are being harvested in South Florida.
