



European statesmen to the United States. Heretofore the stress too often has been upon mere palliative measures, tiding our allies over from crisis to crisis. Always the lasting solution seems to have been avoided because it meant hard decisions on both sides that neither was yet willing to make. But the mood has altered. Evidence suggests the British are prepared to seek at last constructive answers to their underlying economic dilemmas. And the signs are present also that the new American administration wants to grapple with the realities.

Up to now the psychology of western in-ternational economics has been marked by the cramped outlook, Restriction has been the watchword. National self-protection, con-ceived in the narrowest terms, has been the corollary.

corollary.
Under the spur of Butler's new and more
positive approach, the emphasis has shifted
to economic expansion, to a lowering of international barriers, to a fuller, freer flow of
trade for the mutual benefit of all the free
countries.

trade for the mutual benefit of all the free countries.

This spirit activated the economic conference of the British commonwealth nations last fail. To work well, it must likewise reflect itself in more and better production of goods within British proper, where for too long industrialists on the whole have not shown the vital urgs to medernies their plant facilities and techniques.

This healthful change in British outlook presumebly is now being spelled out by Eden and Butler in the specific proposals they make to President Elsenhower. Secretary of State Dulles and other top administration men.

It will come to naught if we Americans do not in turn give substance to our own fresh resolves by meeting the British program with matching, proposals of constructive_merit. The recent report on a White House survey, drafted by 13 American business, labor and farm leaders, strongly appealing for lowering of tariffs and other barriers restricting foreign exports to the U. S., is a laudable step in the right direction.

If out of the current talks emerge the beginnings of a plan to unshackle trade, to promote the free international exchange of currencies, and to boost the productive capacities of both the manufacturing mations and the raw material producers, then the Eden-Butler visit will stand as something of a milestone.
