



A German fighter pilot mamed Heinrich von Sinaiedel was shot down over Stallingrad In 1942 after bagging 35 Russian planes. Later he played a leading role in the Free Germany committee, the communist-controlled anti-Hilter organization of German officers. Now he has written a book called "I Joined the Russians," in which he unfolds with clarity and commendable honesty the story of his embracement of communism and then, at length, his rejection of the All aside from the elemental fascination of this tale, growing out of its adventure and the inside picture it gives of communist atrategy, it has a lesson for Americans—and for Europeans who think they know us. For as one analyst, of communism, Edward for Europeans who think they know us. For as one analyst, of communism, Edward Crankchaw, points out, the really astounding thing about Einsiedel was that it took him so long to turn away from communism. This man knew at Ilrat hand the worst communism had to offer, Yet he hung on and on far past the point of reasonableness. Why? Because, quite pilainly, he could see no decent alternative. This must come as a shock to us, for we think of American notions of freedom and material standards as presenting a pretty respectable future for anybody.

But Linguist, like many of his German countrymen, like many Frenchmen and Britishers and Italians, has a badly warped image of America. He sees it as given over almost wholly to crass materialism, to all the externals of a good life but little of the sub-

stance.

Americans are partly to blame for this false portrait. Some who travel or live abroad do not represent our best traits. On top of that, our books and our movies put extraordinary stress upon our faults and too little upon our virtues. They overplay our crime, our pursuit of the dollar, our gadgets, our fads and manies.

But the Europeans themselves are much to blame. Of course they can't afford to travel to see us first hand, as we do to see them. Still, they could make a far greater effort to report American life through European eyes, through the eyes of their own correspondents.

European coverage of America always has been ridiculously insufficient. And for the most part what coverage they do have gives them a distorted, outdated, unreal picture of this country. To read of America in British newspaper is to wonder what planet the reporters are on.

We have our job to do to correct the false image. But so have the Europeans. Long enough have they warmed themselves with comforting reports which merely confirm their prejudices that America is "not so much." It's time they began trying to find out what we are really like.
