Driver Cautioned Over Intersection Traffic Violations

An upsurge of accidents in which motorists fail to stop at a stop sign before driving out into the intersection in front of an oncoming vehicle has been noted in recent weeks, according to Muriel Doan, Twin Falls Safety council president.
Doan said many drivers fail to realize cars traveling 30 miles an hour will cover 44 feet in one second. When a driver stopped at a stop sign spots a car doing 30 miles an hour 100 feet away, the car can stop in 100 feet by the time the stopped car gets into the intersection. The result of misjudgment in such cases is a collision.
On side roads entering a fast interstate highway, the situation becomes doubly dangerous. A car approaching at 50 miles an hour will travel almost 300 feet in four seconds.
Most of Idaho's collision type accidents occur at intersections, the safety council president said, adding that the best way to avoid trouble at these locations is to remain alert and absolutely certain the way is clear.
