Inquiry Chief Asserts Reds Held 'School'

LOS ANGELES, Calif., March 26 (P) — Communications operated a secret school in California only three months ago to plot a dictatorship of the proletariat after a revolution, a house un-American activities subcommittee charged today.

Rep. Harold Velde, R., Ill., chairman of the committee now investigating communism in southern California, disclosed yesterday that last December the school trained communists to infiltrate key defense industries.

Called to the witness stand was Joe Springer, a Los Angeles manufacturer of men's clothing, identified as the man who ran Camp Tenaya as a children's camp from June to September of last year.

Springer, Polish-born but now a U. S. citizen, resorted to the fifth amendment of the constitution in refusing to state if he was at the camp last December, and also for declining to say whether he was a member of the Communist party or an agent of the Soviet union.

Prisoners of U. N. Foment New Trouble

PUSAN, Korea, March 26 (P) — Communist prisoners of war fomented three incidents in U. N. prison camps Monday and Tuesday, forcing U. N. guards to quell the disturbances with gunfire and tear gas, the U. N. prisoner of war command announced today.

Three Reds were wounded when South Korean guards fired at prisoners who rushed a platoon making a routine search of their enclosure on Kojin Island Tuesday.

On Poigang Island the same day, North Korean communist civilian prisoners began a demonstration when "subversive leaders" were removed from their compound.

"Instruments were used," the U. N. said. "The chanting communists deliberately remained in their massed formation, apparently trying to withstand the effects of the irritants. U. N. troops entered the compound and moved them out."

"Because of their stubborn attempt to force the use of harsh measures, 80 per cent of the red civilian internees were affected by the irritants. None was hospitalized." The irritant gases quelled a similar demonstration the day before, the U. N. said.

Editor Analyzes Anti-Red Acts On Eve of U. S.-France Parley

French government raids against French communists—coming on the eve of Premier Rene Mayer's departure for the United States—give rise to the suspicion that they were more than slightly political.

That is, Mayer can at least point with pride to the French campaign against communists even if other phases of his report aren't so bright. The Communist party itself is responsible for figures which show that in the last four years it has lost more than half its membership and "now" in Paris' "Dail" account 240,000 as compared to a postwar high of some 800,000.

Once again drawing the information from communist publications, disident members and captured party documents, French sources give three primary reasons for the party's decline.

One was U. S. Marshall plan aid to France.

When the communist afternoon newspaper Ce Soir announced it was being forced to suspend publication because of a falling subscription list, it placed most of the blame on the Marshall plan.

Another reason has been the growing disappointment of the working class with the party.

Created by Moscow to pilot the foreign policy above all else, the party tried to mobilize its rank and file in protest demonstrations against the Atlantic alliance, the arrival of Gen. Matthew B. Ridgway, the European army, German rearmament and many other purely political objectives.

The workers resented what they considered a betrayal of their legitimate interests, higher wages and better conditions.

As a result, they deserted the party by thousands.

The third greatest reason given for the party's decline is weak leadership and the liquidation of big-name communists which has thrown the party into confusion.

Maurice Thorez, sitting in Moscow for the last two years, continues as the French party's nominal leader. But behind him he left a family fight which finally resulted in the expulsion of Andre Marty, hero of the communist strong-arm wing, the disgraced Charles Tillon, wartime resistance leader, and at least the temporary victory of Jacques Duclos.

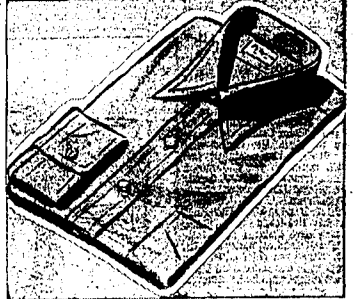

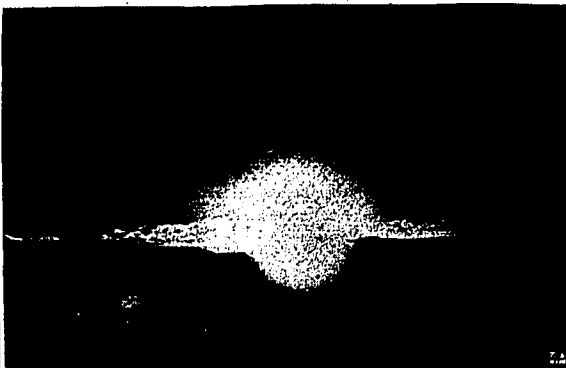

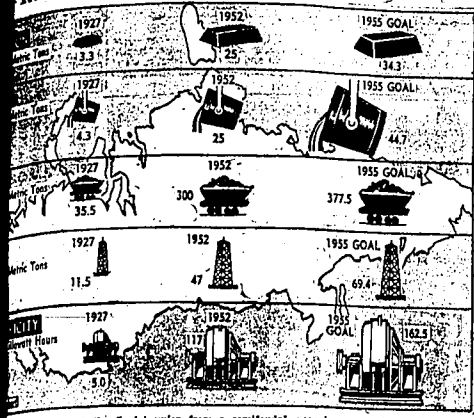

Publicity for State Spread Thin by Aide

BOISE, March 26 (AP)—Secretary of State Ira Masters is pinching pennies to get as many Idaho publicity pamphlets distributed as he can. The 1941 and 1942 editions failed to appropriate any money for handling the state publicity program transferred to the secretary of state's office in 1940. At that time \$15,000 was made available to distribute the heat of Idaho publicity printed the previous biennium when a \$100,000 publicity program was under way.

Uses Current Fund
Masters said he was still sending out a little publicity and was using a few stamps out of his office's current expense fund. But he said that fund is nearly exhausted for the current fiscal period which ends June 30.

Masters said his office receives an average of about 50 requests a day for publicity on Idaho scenic attractions, industry and agriculture. Only few are answered. Most of the requests from school children find their way into the wastepaper basket, he said.

Chamber Gets Many
Many of the requests are turned over to the Idaho State Chamber of Commerce office and Masters praised the chamber's efforts to answer them.

No new publicity pamphlets have been printed by the state in the past year and a half, Masters said, and his office is still using some of the material published five and six years ago. They're being supplemented by recent mimeographed lists of Idaho resort facilities and scenic attractions.

One company, which recently printed a story on Idaho in its trade publication, donated several thousand copies of the article, Masters said.

Chugging wazels pulled the sleds over the snowy hillsides. And inside, mess hands heated rations and coffee on the stoves. When the men stopped to rest, up pulled the mobile hash house.

Refreshments were passed out. Greene is a mighty popular man among his buddies.

One of his mates was so impressed he was inspired to compose a little ditty, called the "Greene Mess Hall" and sung to the tune of "Jingle Bells."

It's a little on the corny side.

Shirer, who covered the rise and fall of Hitler's regime as an American newspaper and radio correspondent, said he was "alarmed over the rapid comeback of nazism in Germany."

Revert Less
"The Germans don't regret having started World War II," he said. "They only regret losing it."

Shirer said he was afraid Germany "may one day go with Russia" and he feared the present Washington administration "fails to realize this."

He said it was a "prevalent idea" in Washington "that the Germans are going to reform." That belief could turn out to be one of those "terrible delusions," Shirer said.

Shift of BLM Not Included In New Plan

WASHINGTON, March 25 (AP)—The reorganization plan for the agriculture department President Eisenhower proposed Wednesday does not include any proposal to transfer the bureau of land management from the interior department to the agriculture department.

A group of senators last week moved to fight any attempt to shift the BLM from interior.

Senator McCarran, D., Nev., told a group of western senators at a luncheon meeting of their informal organization that an executive order making the transfer "is unconstitutional unless we make known the facts and stop this serious threat to the west."

20 Oppose Shift

McCarran said about 20 senators attending the meeting opposed the transfer.

McCarran also said a Hoover commission "asked for" a separate executive department reorganization has opposed such a transfer.

The Nevada senator said such a transfer would mean a separation of the administration of the so-called public domain from the administration of the water for the land.

The reclamation bureau, he explained, would remain in the interior department. It handles water projects.

Sees Complications

McCarran declared "unnamed complications" would result from removing the land management bureau from close association with the interior department bureaus which have closely inter-related activities. These include the geological survey and the bureau of mines.

The agriculture department is looked upon as a "service organization" whose primary function is to serve the farmers on their privately-owned lands," McCarran said. "On the other hand, the interior department is a management organization, fundamentally designed to manage public properties which are in the control of all the people."

McCarran suggested that if business are to be transferred, it might be wise to move the forest service from agriculture to interior.

Left-Wingers Open Blasts on "Big Business Atomic Grab"

WASHINGTON, March 25 (AP)—Left-wing associates of the new deal-Democratic coalition have opened fire on what they call a big business grab to control atomic energy.

They claim private business seeks to snatch the 20th century's greatest discovery for cash profit.

The current "Socialist Call," the CIO United Gas, Coke and Chemical Workers and others left of center are sounding the alarm. The controversy is of a type likely to spread and to become angry after the fashion of the continuing national dispute over development of electricity from water power.

The facts are, however, that private industry was an acknowledged and desired partner in the development of atomic energy from the very first. The 1946 atomic energy act said it was reasonable to anticipate that applying this new source of energy will cause profound changes in our present way of life.

With that in mind, the declaration of policy was phrased further this way: That subject to the prior needs of national defense, development and use of atomic energy should be toward these objectives:

1. Improving the public welfare.
2. Increasing the standard of living.
3. Strengthening free competition in private enterprise.

The act officially committed the atomic energy commission to foster private research and development to encourage maximum scientific progress in the field of atomic fission.

Those objectives appear directly to challenge the complaint of the professed socialists and their associates that big business is making a grab for control. The national security resources board during the Truman administration was concerned over the interests of private industry in atomic developments, fearing that private initiative would not get as early and adequate an opportunity to perform as it should have.

Rigid controls are set up in the act by which the commission and congress would protect the public interest in any licensing of industry to develop and use atomic power. The resources board apparently felt these controls were too severe, and should be relaxed.

SOUTHERDIDGE, MASS., March 25—A new method for making life-like motion pictures has been announced by American Optical company and a group of Broadway and Hollywood producers.

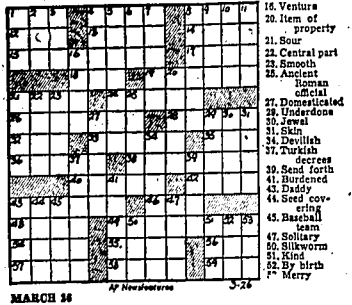

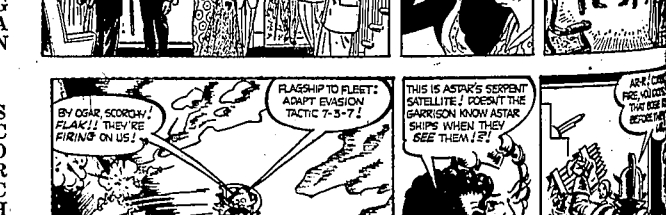
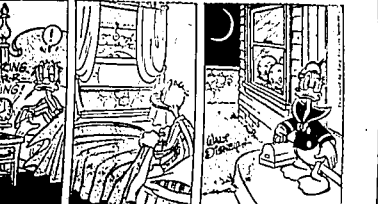

TV Increasing Paper Buying, AP Aide Says

NEW HAVEN, Conn., March 25.—The advent of television has increased the demand for newspaper coverage for major events, an Associated Press aide said here today.
Speaking at the annual meeting of the Connecticut branch of the Associated Press, Alan Gould, executive editor, said TV has sharpened some of the newspaper's concepts and stimulated ideas concerning both pictures and news coverage.
"It is easier to express such conditions now than it is to demonstrate what the future holds," he said. "But let us consider a few of the facts in hand."
Gould said sources of news are increased and simulated others.

He said an AP survey conducted in the country the morning after the inauguration of President Eisenhower showed that TV coverage of the event was a solid boost to newspaper sales. Morning and afternoon newspapers in 20 cities showed increased street sales for the first two reports, whereas only five showed little or no change.
