It would seem to be a good idea for the west to watch carefully for changes in the satellite communist nations and parties of Europe these days for clues to what is going on inside the Soviet empire.
Already there are indications in the news columns that the communist leaders are scared. They might lack the wrong horse in the Kremlin stakes.
This same assumption is noticeable in the press of the Soviet union itself. One of the more intriguing stories there for clues to what is going on is the lack of prominent mention of any of the leaders who took over after Stalin died.
Premier Malenkov gets a little more mention than "First Deputy Premier" Beria. Recently Malenkov, Korya and Foreign Minister Molotov are mentioned all together, but there has been a radical change from the Stalin days.
Before Stalin died, it was not possible to read through a Soviet editorial without finding reference many times to what "Comrade Stalin" had done for the people. Now, many editorials not only fail to mention Stalin, but neglect to mention any of the Communist party's authority, either.

Aide to FDR Blames-Russ For Trouble

WARM SPRINGS, Ga. April 15 (AP)—Speaking on the eighth anniversary of the death of Franklin D. Roosevelt, a secretary to the late President said Sunday his present world crisis is not due to the "Yalta pact" but to the Russian's ruthless violation of its terms.
"The first public address of his career, William D. Heston, said that the Roosevelt administration had implicit tribute to Roosevelt by quiet acceptance of a new pact by the government of the United States.
In a speech just outside the "Little White House" where Roosevelt died, Heston said that the "Yalta pact" was a faithless ally who "betrayed every trust imposed in him."
Heston said that the Roosevelt administration entered into the pact with two Presidents of the United States—Franklin Roosevelt and Truman.
Of the criticism aimed at President Roosevelt and Truman because of the results of those two conferences, Heston observed:
"I think that the armchair strategists of the world are able to tell almost anything about the results of those conferences, but the men who were actually there can tell a different story."
After all to keep the record straight, it must be remembered that the violation of those agreements by Stalin and his fellow barterists which has brought this world to its present misery, this must be said in the interests of truth and justice."

Sudsy U.S. Paring Costs Of Housecleaning Labor for Capital

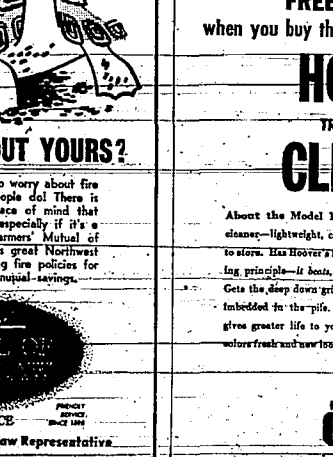

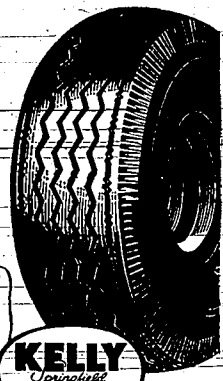
