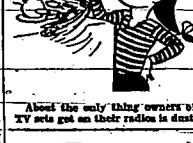

### Senator Flays Bureau Cut in Project Funds

WASHINGTON, April 21 (AP)—Budget-bureau revisions which slashed more than \$6 million dollars from requests for Pacific northwest power and reclamation projects were attacked by Senator Magnuson, D. Wash., as "administrative brown-outs."

He referred to slashes totaling more than 30 1/2 million dollars in requests for army engineer civil functions projects as well as a cut of approximately five million in reclamation requests.

**Projects Cut**  
Magnuson said he had learned the budget bureau had cut the request for former President Truman for the Columbia basin development from \$21,900,000 to 18 million. The Kennewick irrigation project was cut back from four to three million. Earlier in the day, budget bureau revisions were disclosed to have eliminated a request for \$4,900,000 for Ice Harbor dam on the lower Snake river and cut back The Dalles lock and dam on the Columbia from \$38,400,000 to \$37,420,000.

**Breach of Assurance**  
Magnuson said the elimination of Ice Harbor was a "breach of assurance made in the 82nd congress." The lower Snake river project is proposed by sponsors to provide an independent source of power for the Hanford atomic works.

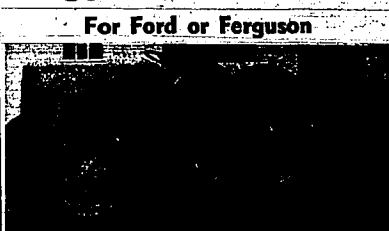
Magnuson said: "In its determination to set the brakes against Pacific northwest power and reclamation development, the budget bureau has also dangerously handicapped the expansion of our atomic program at Hanford. It is neither in the interest of national security nor economy."

They bought their bicycles in London.

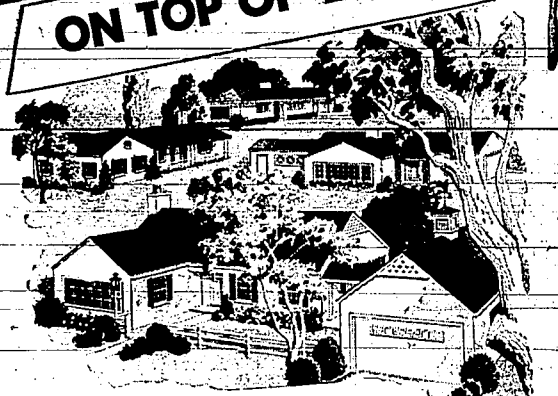
