Junior does not like school, and the school, according to a teacher is none too fond of him. He is inattentive and instead of doing his lessons he slouches in his seat, looks around the room and does not seem to hear the teacher's instructions that is not until he is addressed personally in sharp tones. Yet, it is conceded that he is able to do the work if he wants to, but seldom does a school task interest him. He tells his mother that he does not wish to go to school—that he hates it. He appears always to be tired when in the classroom. He is left-handed and writes some of his letters backward. His reading habit, his mother does her best to help him with his schoolwork, but that assistance avails little. Junior is the type of boy who should be examined at a children's clinic. He has plenty of troubles. He does not see things distinctly and from some of his responses it would seem that his hearing is faulty. Only a specialist could help this boy. Drilling him, disciplining him, do more harm than good. He is already fatigued beyond endurance in his struggle to get his faulty system to work. He actually needs less pressure, not more. All children, whatever their condition, training and background—lack of them—long to be approved and praised. It is idle to say that such a boy is inattentive, that he refuses to concentrate and does not do his work. Actually, he is fatigued. Most children are hopeful of a measure of success. When a youngster fails to pay attention, is badly behaved and slouches, it is usually due to physical deficiencies. It is useless to ask such a boy why he does not like school, why he doesn't do his work, why he is not as smart as others. He does not know why. He is unaware what ails him. Record High Set by Debts Of 48 States

WASHINGTON, April 27 (AP)—The 48 state governments spent \$15,830,000,000 last year, and took in \$10,000,000,000 in taxes and other receipts.

The total of all state debts at the end of the fiscal year had climbed to a new high of \$2,774,000,000. The fiscal year for all states is not the same, but most ended last June 30.

Data for all states were collected by the federal census bureau. It reported almost every type of state spending and income rose last year. Only veterans' bonus payments dropped sharply.

State spending was up more than five per cent, without considering retirement and unemployment benefits paid out, nor money spent by state-operated liquor stores.

Revenues increased more than eight per cent, not including the income of the retirement and unemployment funds or the liquor stores. About three-fourths of state income came from state taxes, most of the rest was federal aid.

On the average, the states spent the following amounts for each resident: \$28.39 on education, \$21.50 on highways, \$15.54 on public welfare, \$8.20 on health, \$4.12 on other purposes.

A grand total of \$89.78 per capita, the states with the largest revenues were New York, \$1,072,500,000; California, \$1,741,970,000; and Pennsylvania, \$1,065,000,000—the states with the highest populations.

They also led in spending: New York \$1,500,275,000; California, \$1,400,000,000; Pennsylvania, \$1,072,500,000. They were the only states with either revenues or expenditures of more than \$1,000,000,000.

Eight states failed to balance their budgets: Delaware, Maryland, New Jersey, North Carolina, Oklahoma, Oregon, Pennsylvania and West Virginia.

Businessmen Ask Foreign Aid Cuts

WASHINGTON, April 27 (AP)—A team of 35 American businessmen has recommended the Eisenhower administration sharply reduce economic assistance to western Europe.

Responsible government officials also said the business leaders have urged the state department to exert complete control over all foreign aid programs and that the existing mutual security agency be abolished.

These views have been given to NSA Director Harold Stassen as part of a 4,000-word confidential report following an on-the-spot survey of foreign aid operations in 14 countries.

Clarence Francis, chairman of the board of General Foods Corporation, was the last-voice director of the business group which undertook the survey at Stassen's request.

Safety Award Is Won by Lewiston

BOISE, April 27 (AP)—The Lewiston district has won the state highway department's safety award for the first quarter of 1953.

The Lewiston district has not had a fatality or a major accident since the contest was started Jan. 1.

SEOUL, Korea, April 27 (AP)—United Nations planes dropped hundreds of tons of bombs on North Korean targets today, causing day-long attacks with a 50-ton strike against an ammunition factory.

Final pilot relays were unobtainable at 9 a.m. Sunday in a report from the damage at the factory near Chinnampo because of dense clouds of smoke mushrooming from the blasted area.

Other jets and propeller-driven fighters hit targets across western Korea.

Ground fighting along the 155-mile battlefield was confined to probing actions and harassing attacks.

22 States Adopt Daylight Saving

By The Associated Press Daylight saving time became official at 2 a.m. Sunday in all or part of 22 states.

Clocks were turned ahead one hour, thus giving each daylight hour to residents of those states. Standard time continued in other places, mostly inland or in the south.

"Slow" or standard time will return the last Sunday in September.

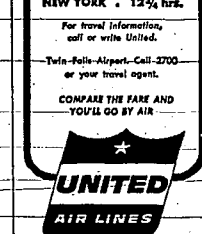
