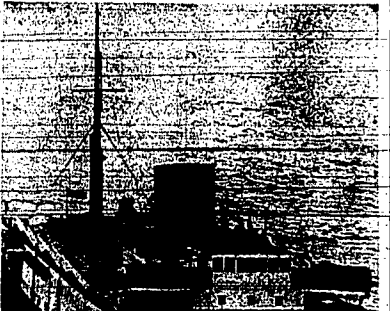

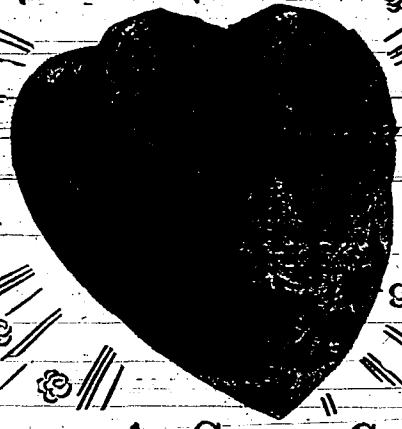

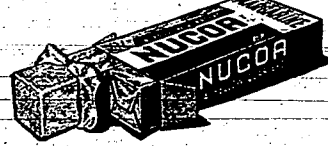

Speaker given them in some quarters in this nation. Continuing, he said he was not optimistic about Korean peace talks. During his review on Malenkov he stated there is undeniable proof that Stalin poisoned Lenin, Russia's early communist leader, in 1924. Turning to his next question, he talked about the effect of the Voice of America broadcasts behind the iron curtain. He said the effect was poor because few people had radios behind the curtain and those who did were afraid to listen to them because of the penalty if caught. In his secret visits behind the curtain, he said people told him the best thing this nation could do would be to drop "the small things" behind the curtain in packages. He said a restaurant type packet of sugar or coffee with an American flag stamped on it dropped in the curtain countries in some manner would do more good than any number of broadcasts. Morley noted that the removal of the U. S. seventh fleet from the Formosa channel has caused the Chinese to pull some troops out of Korea to protect against a possible attack from Chinese nationalist forces. Despite a steady increase in prices, the meat counter at the local grocery store still has the top food bargain. The price of beef, pork and lamb is still lower than it was a few weeks ago.

Frying chickens were lower in price than last week, with cuts of two to six cents a pound. No big increase in pork prices was noted this week, but sales managers for several chains agreed that the trend was upward.

As for lamb, one meat specialist commented that wholesale costs had gone up about seven cents a pound in the last 10 days to two weeks. In retail, he added, that might work out at about 10 cents a pound.

Egg prices varied. The price of butter was unchanged in most stores. The list of worthwhile buys in specialties was fairly long this week, including waffles, onions, potatoes and fresh corn.

In the fruit department, strawberries were cheap. Although some stores complained about the quality, milk prices were a bit lower in some cities, reflecting record production.

Deaths claimed by state children last month. The health director emphasized that the most education, not ironing, is the key to the problem. They should be taught "in painful but not lethal situations" that matches are hot, that pins hurt and that they shouldn't eat and drink everything they see.

"There are probably enough poisons in your kitchen, bathroom and laundry to kill half the children on your block—maybe all of them," he added.

"Lock these poisons up, get them definitely out of reach of youngsters or get rid of them." He said a survey showed that 84 per cent of kitchens and laundries had lists of poisons and that in 84 per cent these were in the open where children could get them.

Peterson also warned against the danger of leaving discarded "ice boxes and refrigerators where youngsters can climb into them and be suffocated after the doors snap shut."

Ike's Domestic Aims Sketchy; End of Controls Is Main Feat

Editor's note: Fourth of five columns on President Eisenhower's first 100 days.

WASHINGTON (NEA)—The greatest accomplishment of the Eisenhower administration on the domestic front in its first 100 days is the removal of all price and wage controls. The move was just right. Meat prices were already being held down by other food prices normally drop in the spring.

On the industrial front, supplies of materials had been built up to meet increased demands of the Korean war. The national economy had been adjusted to the new, higher productive level.

On the wage front, the more troublesome industrial disputes had been settled. So every "right" was right for lifting the lid. Contrary to some dire predictions, there have been no ill effects from the removal of controls for lifting the lid.

Meat controls have been scheduled to end July 31. At the turn of the first 100 days the congress still was in a sweat over continuing stand-by controls for use in case of a new inflationary emergency arises.

The administration still has to meet its first test on handling a major labor dispute. That may come in the steel industry.

Both AEC and OIO have announced their intent to seek new wage increases as controls come up for renewal. In the case of the OIO, this may be extended to include demands for a guaranteed an-

along lines outlined by previous administrations. Plan No. 2 combined national security resources and reorganization of justice, state and defense departments are on the first points. The Eisenhower administration has been slow in this reorganization. The effort has been complicated by a number of fumbles in firing career civil servants to make way for Republican blood and brains.

Revised personnel policies to reduce government employment, killing office of price stabilization and wage stabilization board returned \$1,500,000 to the treasury. Director Joseph M. Dodge ordered no new hiring after Feb. 3. Defense Secretary C. E. Wilson ordered a 30,000 personnel cut by the end of May.

A new loyalty and security program has been announced, intended to weed subversives and criminals from government. But it will take some months to put into effect and test fully.

Civilian commissions, committees and study groups are being plans all over Washington. President Eisenhower seems to depend on them heavily. Among his creations are a reorganization committee, a temporary farm advisory commission, national security council advisers, psychological warfare advisory committee, a commission to survey natural resources and another on foreign trade.

The President also has asked congress to authorize a commission to study federal-state relationships. Departmentally, there are committees to study defense department reorganization and to reorganize the bureau of standards. A department of labor advisory committee, supposed to shape new labor policy for the coming year, is being set up in confusion on its first meeting and has been abandoned.

But it will take months for all the other and still more new study to make their reports and get the Eisenhower administration's policies in shape to identify as a definite program.

In the meantime, the top middle of the new administration is how far it will go in carrying out Republican campaign promises and campaign hopes to get the government out of business, end the so-called trend towards socialism and put the country back on the road towards an economy dedicated to, and dominated by, the first enterprise.

The decision to liquidate the reconstruction finance corporation and sell the government-built and government-owned hospitals, rubber plants are first steps in this direction. Returning the tidelands from federal to state government control is another.

But how far will this go? And will it become what critics of the administration now call a gigantic giveaway of the public domain?

Only the answer to these questions in due time will disclose the real nature of the Eisenhower domestic program.

There are signs now that in setting these policies, sharp differences between President Eisenhower's thinking and the opinions of a majority of the congressmen will have to be resolved.
