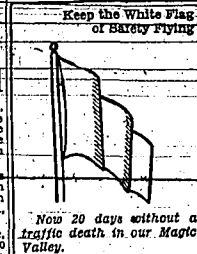

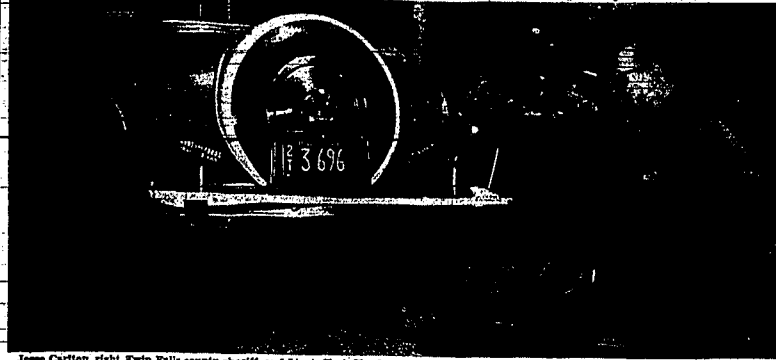

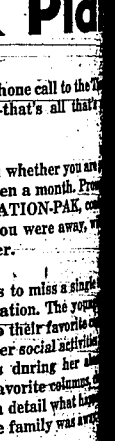

### Cool Weather Slows Basin's Water Runoff

**BOISE, May 9 (UP)—Cool April weather retarded the snow melt in the Columbia basin leaving the snow pack considerably higher than normal for this time of the year, two federal agencies reported today.**

A joint release by the U. S. weather bureau and U. S. soil conservation service said this delay in runoff "will increase peak flows in relation to the total runoff yet to come."

Below Normal

All major rivers in the basin reflected the cool temperatures during April and ran well below normal for the month, the agencies said. The last few days of April produced relatively high peak flows in low elevation rivers such as the Clearwater, but for the entire month low flows were reported.

Additional snow at higher elevations also added to the relatively deeper snow pack, the report said.

April precipitation in the basin averaged nearly 150 per cent of the 1941-1950 average, boosting the total anticipated April-September stream flow 51 million acre feet.

Water Absorbed

The dry soil beneath the snow pack is absorbing the water from the snow water, easing the flood potential, the report said. Early seasons of irrigation water from the rivers is also lowering the total downstream runoff.

The snow pack in the Kootenai river drainage in northern Idaho and Canada is about 70 per cent above normal in the higher elevations. The Kootenai river spills its banks at Bonners Ferry nearly every year.

Storage of irrigation water in Idaho reservoirs is above normal, the two agencies reported.

"As I have said many times," he declared, "we want peace in Korea if it is a peace with honor. Whether we desire a truce or a permanent peace depends on the terms of the truce."

That kind of a peace is still under discussion between the representatives of the two sides in Korea, under guidance of courses, as far as are concerned, from Washington.

Proposals Stated

"The communists-made proposals before yesterday which we are studying carefully, it is obvious that they will require negotiation and perhaps a modification before they will be acceptable to us as compatible with peace with honor, but that is a matter which we are going into and which will be developed in further discussions which will be taking place in Korea over the coming days."

Dulles met with reporters at the State Department at noon a few hours after leaving on a 20-day tour of the middle east and south Asia. In a statement and in response to questions he made three principal points about the critical far eastern situation.

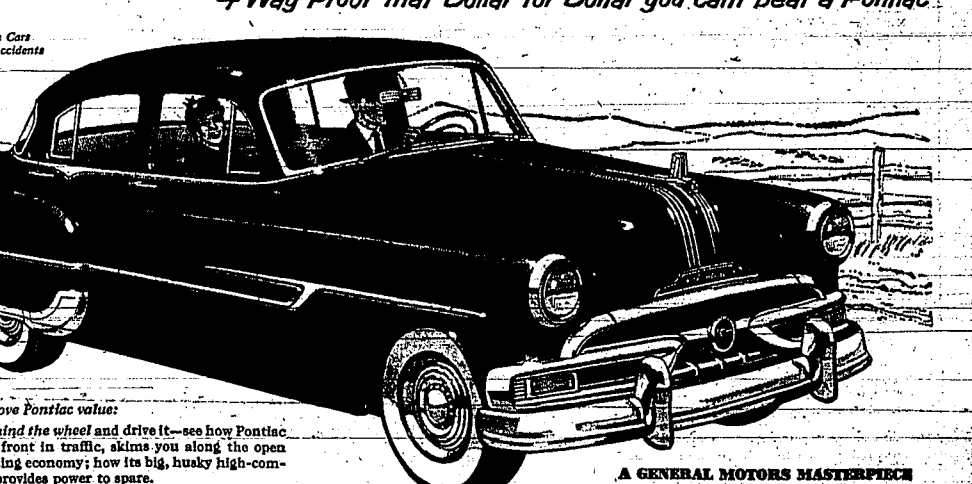

The publication said a Soviet Marshal Gonorov also was present.

# Life in MAGIC VALLEY

There is a little Indian girl in a Salt Lake City hospital through the kindness of the residents of VIEW. This little girl has been paralyzed since birth but if everything goes all right she will be walking soon. Each year Indian families come to View to work and usually occupies the same house. With this family has been a child who last year was believed to be 4 years old.

At first, her mother was the family doctor but later the family worked for Miles. He died and lived on his farm. He noticed that each morning the family carried the small girl to the best field, placing her on a blanket while other members of the family worked. The father of the family (the grandfather of the group) about the little girl, the grandfather said she never had walked and that doctors had told the family she never would walk unless she had an operation. He explained that the Indians could not afford to pay for the operation. The picture of the little girl on the blanket haunted Payne and he decided to do something about it. He contacted LDS officials in View and in turn they arranged to send the girl to Salt Lake City.

Working season was and her mother were taken to the Lakes City to the children's hospital. Already she has had two operations but will have to have more before her full health will be restored. Doctors are confident that some time in the near future she will be able to walk just like normal children.

Members of the FILER Women's club use a unique means to raise funds for the Filer library. They have been holding series of coffee hours which are expected to net \$150 for the library fund. Each of the 12 coffee hours held this spring have had from one to three tables.

Each of the coffee hours are held in the home of members of the club. They begin at 10 a. m. and last for one hour. In addition, one has been held at the annual "Girls' state" where the hostesses arranged some sort of simple entertainment.

The library is sponsored by the club but now has financial aid from the city. During 1952, 7,500 books were loaned by the library, 100 new ones were purchased and 100 were donated.

This is the second year the club has sponsored coffee hours to raise funds for the library. Mrs. C. C. Davis is chairman of the program. Money raised will be used to purchase new books, a desk for the librarian and refinish the library floor.

Next month a number of Magic Valley high school girls will go to the University of Idaho as delegates to the annual "Girls' state" but little will they realize that the original idea for "Girls' state" came from Mrs. Phyllis Kennicott, a former HAZZLEMAN resident.

Mrs. Kennicott taught school for many years and was the first president of the Hagerman American Legion auxiliary. She patterned her idea after the Boy's state the American Legion sponsors for high school boys. She pushed her idea at auxiliary conventions, beginning in 1947, but it was not until 1948 that the first "state" was held.

In Hagerman five girls from the junior class are selected by the high school faculty as possible girl states.

Finally, there are wages of noble life and purpose. Mothers have the special ability to impart their own qualities to their children. One cannot write and say it is generally admitted and very frequently proved that virtue and genius and all the natural good qualities that men possess, are derived from their mothers.
