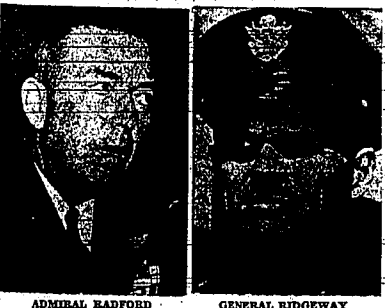

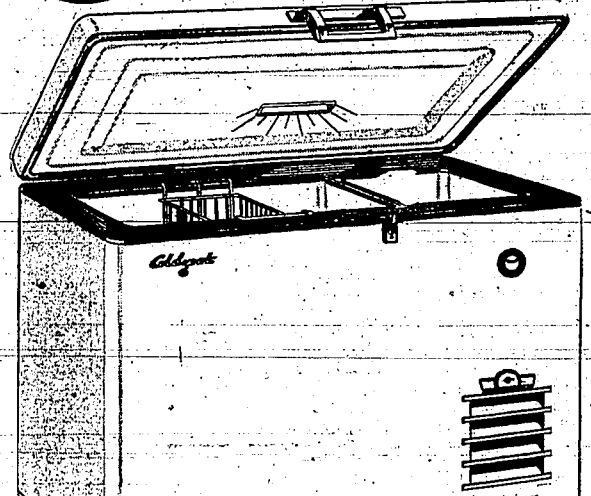

NEW YORK, May 12 (AP)—The head of the Voice of America said Monday his international radio propaganda machine ranks only third in the world and is slipping toward fourth.

Francis, voice director, said the communists are spending more money in the United States than they do to put it in.

Admitting some errors in the program, Francis defended them on grounds the voice merely echoes government policy and doesn't create it.

Not to Blame "If the policy is sometimes unpopular," he added, "it is not the voice which should be taken to task."

As for his staff, individuals of which have been under congressional fire, Francis said: "I only wish the American people knew what a loyal, competent and devoted staff they have here at the Voice of America."

Francis and other witnesses from the Voice blamed divided facilities, lack of funds and dispersed facilities for the limited effectiveness.




