PARIS, May 20 (AP)—There is more than the problem of military strategy behind the sudden red "offensive" in Laos.  
 Moscow is preparing to launch a new "peace offensive" this time in Indo-China—communist sources in France report.  
 Ho Chi Minh, chief of the Vietnamese revolution, is expected to have written an "interview" in which he calls for a "peaceful" solution of all Indo-China problems.  
 The "interview" supposedly was given to Pierre Courtade, foreign editor of the communist newspaper "Humanite," to be released at an "opportune moment."  
 French military authorities have, of course, no illusions about Moscow's latest move in the "cold withdrawal" in Laos was made on orders from Moscow and Peking.  
 The advantage to the Kremlin and to Mao Tse-tung of a peace offensive in Indo-China at this time are clear:  
 1. It would help the red Vietnamese military to build-up during the rainy season — when military operations must always be limited.  
 2. The U. S. may be discouraged from stepping aside to the French in Indo-China.  
 3. It may influence the negotiations in Korea in favor of the red.  
 4. French communists will certainly find it easier to lure pro-democratic parties and politicians into a new "united front."  
 Meanwhile, the Vietnamese would leave behind in Laos guerrilla bands and communist organizers to prepare the way for a renewed offensive in the autumn, French military authorities believe.  
 But for the moment at least the French reds are beginning to talk "peace" in Indo-China. The party "line" has changed again.  
 After Stalin's death, Jacques Duclos, secretary of the French Communist party, went to Moscow where he had a long talk with his new boss, Premier Georgi M. Malenkov.  
 Duclos returned to Paris with orders to advocate "revolutionary defeatism" in Indo-China and other "colonial countries" oppressed by Anglo-French-American imperialism.  
 In red double-talk this simply meant that French communists would back the Vietnamese rebels against their own government.  
 This was the line of the French politburo until the sudden withdrawal of the Vietnamese forces in Laos.  
 Now party faithfuls who only yesterday called for "revolutionary defeatism" claim—without even being an avowal—that the Vietnamese

### Break of AFL Help for 'Ike' Appears Near

WASHINGTON, May 20 (AP)—The American Federation of Labor seems headed for an open break with the Eisenhower administration and may move in that direction at a strategy meeting opening today.

The AFL's powerful 15-member executive council gathered amid considerable grumbling over the way things are going under the Republican regime.

Besides considering politics and pending legislation in congress, including bills to change the Taft-Hartley labor law, the council was expected to decide what to do about the AFL's crime-tainted member union, the International Longshoremen's Association (ILA).

Three months ago the AFL council ordered the ILA to purge itself of criminals, as "turned up in New York crime commission probes, and to end the mass-hiring "shape-up" hiring system, under which dock workers are hired each day. The ILA has promised to change the hiring method but has balked at ousting leaders.

Scathing Critique George Meany, AFL president, delivered a scathing critique of the Republican administration in a speech in Chicago, and was wound up with a promise to get the AFL political action program rolling to elect "a liberal congress" in 1954.

Meany reserved most of his criticism for congress, rather than President Eisenhower. He said the President asked congress to extend social security coverage, but Senate Republican leaders in Ohio, "publicly branded the social security system as the greatest advance toward social justice yet made" and called for the substitution of a federal dole to the aged.

### Grangers for Oregon Map Project Fight

PORTLAND, May 20 (AP)—The Oregon Grange will rally forces here May 23 in protest against the administration's policy on the Hells Canyon dam project.

Elmer McClure, state master, said farm, labor and other groups had been invited from California, Idaho, Washington and Oregon.

Interior Secretary McKay recently announced the interior department was withdrawing its opposition to the Idaho Power company's proposal to build a dam upstream from Hells canyon.

McClure called this "abdication by the federal government at Hells canyon." He said the Idaho Power dam would block construction of the "Hells Canyon" dam, and would upset all long-range planning.

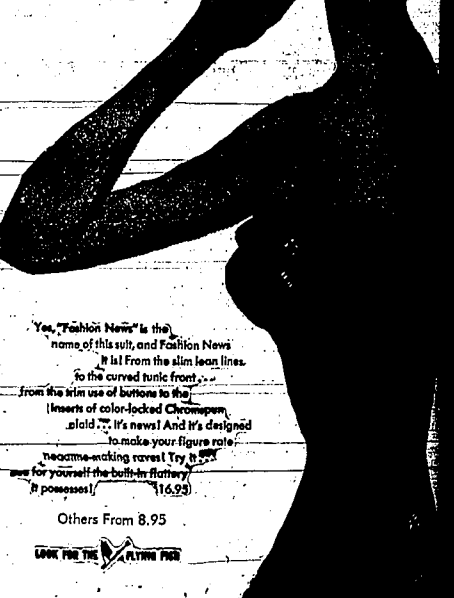

The senators, Humphrey, Minnesota, and Sparkman, Alabama, both serve on the foreign relations committee, which has virtually completed its hearings on the measure to authorize the mutual assistance program for the new fiscal year starting July 1.

The group's chairman, Senator Wiler, R. Wis., also has indicated he will back the full sum sought by President Eisenhower although he would not predict what his committee finally will decide.
