Texas and Louisiana battled floods today, and violent storms whipped across the Midwest on the heels of high winds and twisters. Storm deaths for three days already totaled 19.

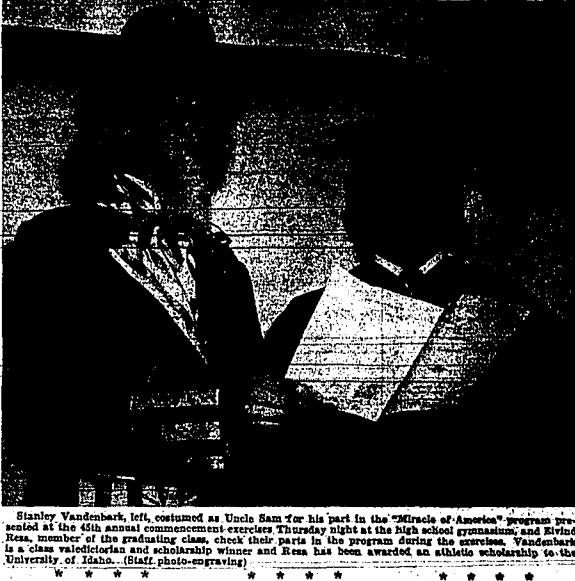

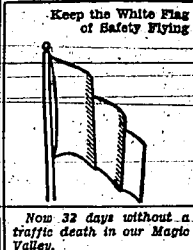

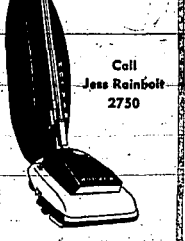

TUCKER'S NATIONAL WHIRLIGIG

WASHINGTON—Although the amiable chairman of the house and senate labor committees—Rep. Charles McNamara and Sen. Alexander W. French—have been already to draft the 1953 version of the Taft-Hartley act, it is probable that "no action" on this legislation will be taken at this session.

The demands of spokesmen for management and the unions are so irreconcilable that they are self-canceling. Although the executives of the great corporations are relatively satisfied with the law, they have insisted on drastic changes in the 12 weeks of hearings on Capitol Hill.

But they have done so in a spirit of bargaining rather than in a spirit of antagonism of achieving their ends.

They stoutly countered opposition pleas for weakening the law.

LABOR PRESSURE PRESENT SYSTEM—Although labor officials are not in a hurry to repeal since they have denounced the measure as a "slave labor law" almost since its enactment in 1947, they insist they would prefer to operate under the present system rather than face new and unknown conditions of bargaining.

The unions' legal and organizing staffs have adjusted themselves to Taft-Hartley provisions and arrangements. And, although they deny it officially, they have not been injured seriously by the six-year experiment—employment, union membership—and wages are not noticeably lower than they were apparently checked, they are as contented as they ever can be.

AMENDMENT RATHER THAN REPEAL—As the hearings reveal, it is extremely difficult to get agents for the workmen and women seen entitled to retention of the law in form or other.

Moving to politico-economic realities, in view of the fact that the membership of the House of Representatives is not likely to be reduced, they have asked for mere amendment rather than outright repeal.

The most vocal advocate of wiping the law off the books has been Sen. Charles McNamara, Democrat, Mine Workers. Ironically, save for the fines he and his organization could well afford to pay, his dictatorial rule of 400,000 miners has not been affected adversely.

DURKIN SILENT—White House inductees will be partially responsible for any legislative failure to revise the law. Although President Eisenhower proffered the union message that he would submit proposals for changes, no administration spokesman has appeared before either house of congress since the executive branch has not carried out his pledge to "submit specific recommendations."

"That" selection of Martin P. Durkin as secretary of labor lies behind the seeming presidential indifference to the labor problem. He had the United Association of Plumbers and Steamfitters before entering the cabinet. Durkin had echoed labor's denunciation of the statute, but he has been a loyal and silent member since.

Both McNamara and Smith have indicated they would appreciate an expression of his views. But they have not pressed for his appearance, presumably because of the risk of embarrassing a senatorial election. The GOP will need labor votes next year and in 1956.

By remaining out of the controversy, Eisenhower will continue to avoid the issue. The actual labor-management compromise toward the present statute is a Republican asset. So, why throw it away by tinkering with the act?

NEED FOR BASIC CHANGES—There is general agreement, however, on the need for basic changes. The most important changes are: (1) to provide for the operation of the law in periods of national emergency; (2) to provide for a 90-day injunction period during which the government tries to mediate. It never has had a fair trial, as Senator Taft notes, because of former President Truman's partiality to labor.

Eisenhower wants the controversial parties to settle arguments among themselves, not to lay them on him. His position may be more flexible in order to keep management and labor anxious over its effect that they will stay far away from 1600 Pennsylvania avenue, Washington, D. C.

VIEWS OF OTHERS

COMMENT ON IEE'S REPORT—New York Times—"What the President has to offer is, as he put it, a policy of 'security with solvency'—this is a laudable attitude concept... his program does not contemplate endangering the security of the nation by resorting to the most-averse approach in foreign expansion... it contemplates, instead, a more efficient use of defense expenditures."

Boston Globe—"Congress will do well to think soberly before undertaking to go further than President Eisenhower has advised in the matter of (cutting) foreign aid requirements."

Boston Post—"Congressional leaders of his own party are not going to be too happy over the fact that the president has decided to institute immediate tax cuts. But the campaign campaign pledge 'merely implies that taxes will be reduced.'"

Atlanta Constitution—"The President's speech was necessary, if not too effective. We hope it means he has abandoned his policy of leaving everything to the courts. A President must fight for his policy and his principles."

"All Americans want to see General Eisenhower succeed."

"It is vital that he guide us successfully."

"But let him take more initiative and project the great principles enunciated in his magnificent inaugural and in his appeal for peace, made before the editors of the nation in Washington last month, into positive action. If he does not, the congress will package them. The nation elected General Eisenhower—not his party. We hope he will speak more."

GOVERNOR JOHNSON'S CHICKENS—Are Governor Johnson's chickens coming home to roost? It would be hard to argue convincingly in view of the recent difficulties encountered by the University of Idaho in securing a dormitory loan.

The university had almost completed arrangements for a loan of \$1,500,000 from the Housing and Home Finance Agency, and was preparing to call for bids on the dormitory next week. The other day, unfortunately, the agency discovered that the university bonds are not always safe investments in Idaho, and notified the university that all action on the loan was to be suspended "pending further study and inquiry."

The agency's sudden hesitancy is excusable. The last legislature failed to appropriate funds with which to meet the interest on several bonds issued for construction of a dormitory, at Northern Idaho College of Education shortly before NICE was closed last year. Governor Johnson's taxes, which would be apt to derive from defaulting of the bonds, although some prophetic voices were raised in 1951.

President Buchanan said Friday the university had suffered a "severe blow." He might have added—although he didn't—that the blow was really dealt at Boise last year by Governor Johnson's arbitrary and without forethought, and by legislative majority which put politics above statesmanship—Lawton Tribune.

MULTER'S MUSE—Rep. Abraham J. Multer of Brooklyn, N. Y., under leave to extend his term in the Congressional Record, inserted a speech protesting against the raising of interest rates on government bonds, FHA and G.I. mortgages and loans. The title which Mr. Multer put on his "speech" was "Bundlers for Billionaires."

Cold Spring Days Blamed For Idaho Lamb Difficulties

WASHINGTON, May 22 (Special)—Cold weather this spring accounts for range difficulties with the early lamb crop in Idaho.

A department of agriculture bulletin says: "The early lamb crop is in good condition, but the range feed situation is not satisfactory due to cold, dry weather in April. Marketings will not start until the middle of August, with the peak coming in August."

For Washington it notes: "Rangers report that recent cold weather has delayed development. Warm weather has improved range feed prospects during the past two weeks. Lambs which previously had gained slowly due to lack of feed were making good gains by May 1. Birthments during July are expected to be heavy."

Comments on Oregon: "Lambs have not developed rapidly due to the limited amount of range feed and cold and damp weather. Some early lambs will be marketed in early June with the bulk of the crop moving in between the middle of June and the middle of July."
