Zech Says Soviet War Due by '55

WASHINGTON, May 23 (AP)—A former Czech army officer in Soviet military strategy, has informed the committee of purported Russian activities in Europe "before 1955."

He said the Russian decision to "take over western Europe," the prediction was made, is predicated on the Soviet suspicion that the "Soviet Union" is a "satellite" of the United States.

He said that the Russian government is planning to launch a "Soviet war" in 1955.

Needless Deaths Charged in U. S. Munitions Lack

WASHINGTON, May 23 (AP)—Four of five senators who investigated ammunition supplies in Korea reported today that "there was a needless loss of American lives" because of shortages there. While asserting "it is difficult to pinpoint the responsibility," they blamed policy-makers of the recent administration, from former President Truman on down, for miscalculating the "aggressive designs of international communism." Congress was absolved of any share in the blameworthy situation.

"This is a tragic episode which has been extremely costly to the American people," the report said. "The miscalculation of this type of miscalculation and inability to plan for the defense and security of the United States resulted in catastrophic losses of American lives."

The fifth member of the investigating subcommittee, Senator Richard M. Nixon, said, "In addition to the finding that lives were lost because of ammunition shortages."

"will be met by disapproval by some in the United States and elsewhere, who are seriously object to being intruded upon from the placidity they so unreservedly enjoy."

Bukar told the committee the Soviet target date for war was disclosed to him as one of 3,000 officers in training at a Russian military school for command at Moscow between 1945 and 1947.
"I was told," he said.
The witness, stating he fled to the U. S. a little more than a year ago, told the congressmen Russia's plan to overrun western Europe was outlined in a lecture by a Kremlin foreign service expert named Sverdlov.

He quoted Sverdlov as saying Soviet intelligence had information of Britain's plan to split the Soviet Union in 1955. And, he said, Sverdlov asserted:
"Therefore, we Russians must take over the Balkans and the Bosphorus before 1955. We shall close the Mediterranean sea—and so the through-way across Asia to the Indian ocean. We shall not wait until they strike, but ourselves, we shall take over the western Europe before 1955."
Bukar went on to tell how the Russians taught him in 1946—before the end of the war—that nationalistic China must be taken first, and then Korea.
Bukar said that in the "Primo" military school at Moscow, he was taught that foreign army establishments and labor unions must be infiltrated and that Alaska was still part of Russia.
Bukar said his instructors told him the Russians do not intend the sale of Alaska by the czar. "And the day will come that we shall infiltrate Alaska, and that Alaska shall again belong to us."

Panel Discloses Trade Offer of Oats

WASHINGTON, May 23 (U. S. A.)—A week before William Oatis was released from a Czech army officer offered to exchange his own freedom for the release of the American Press correspondent.

Reseeding Project Proves to Be Profitable in Lincoln Area

SHOSHONE, May 23—The carrying capacity of range in the Sugar Loaf area has been increased 15 times by reseeding, Jack A. Keith, district range manager, announced. He said 1,200 acres of burned-over grazing land was seeded in the late fall of 1948 at a cost of \$5,000.24, or \$3.07 an acre.

The area was closed to grazing until the spring of 1951 when it was grazed lightly by sheep. It has been grazed lightly every year since. According to a range survey, the carrying capacity of the reseeded area is one acre an animal unit each month. rather familiar, he thought, and a closer inspection showed that Council Bluffs was painted on one end and Omaha on the other.

The bridge across the Missouri was in four sections but the bridge across Snake river had only two sections—the end sections from the Missouri river bridge.

Handy has the unique distinction of having attended the dedication of the same bridge twice in two different locations.

The Heyburn pioneer has been in on other dedications, too. In 1904 he was on hand when the railroad station at Heyburn was dedicated by the Oregon Short-Line. That structure has long since been moved west.

Handy came to MATTA from Iowa and moved to BURLEY in 1905 to homestead near what is now Heyburn. That area then was in Lincoln county. Shortly after he moved to Lincoln county he was called to do Casia county jury duty.

After the next election, when he became a registered voter in Lincoln county, he had to go all the way to BOHONNE when called on jury duty. His jury duty trip was shortened later when Lincoln county was put up and Minidoka county was formed with RUPERT as its county seat.

The Rev. Tracy Greer Gilpin, now of Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Greer, KING HILL, came from Iowa to Idaho with his family. He has well and showed motion pictures on his missionary work.

In showing his pictures at a meeting of the Women's Missionary society, the Rev. Mr. Gilpin explained the country in which he has been working. He said the plains of Idaho are flat and that while water is scarce, the people have been using an irrigation system for centuries.

Rice is the main staple in the

diet of the Indians and workers receive between 8 and 12 cents a day for working in the fields. Every inch of arable land is used to raise food for the tremendous population of the country, he said, and 50,000 acres are irrigated from one relatively small reservoir.

He said he timed the chore of drawing water from deep wells and discovered women spent 35 minutes twice a day drawing water for their daily supply.

Planting and harvesting in Idaho, despite the irrigation systems, are primitive, he said. Dried beans together with the pods and dirt are placed on flat stones so the wind can blow away the pods and dirt.

Every village has a temple and a religious idol, he explained. Melted butter or milk is poured over the idols as "a symbol of God."

The Rev. Mr. Gilpin supervises medical education and evangelism at the mission where he is stationed while Mrs. Gilpin teaches sewing and helps with personal problems. He said the medical work sometimes is very discouraging because the people do not obey instructions.

During the famine of 1952, he said children at the mission school were given a thin soup daily and their parents were fed three times a week. He said the country is facing inflation but people hope to get more money from the United States.

May 8 marks an event in the life of EMERSON. A landmark was made in 1910 Mr. and Mrs. William Nelson, early settlers who had homesteaded a farm in the Emerson district one mile north of the school, built a new home to have more room for their family. The house, a two-story building, was

made large to take care of Nelson family of four boys and one girl.

Frank Nelson, the eldest, became a doctor; Walter Nelson became a rancher and cattleman; Horace Nelson, a public accountant; and Neal Nelson is secretary to Sen. Herman Walker in Washington.

The daughter, Mrs. Wava Marby, Everett, Wash., was graduated from the Knoxville, Tenn., high school and became a graduate nurse before her marriage. Nelson died a few years ago and Mrs. Nelson resides in Moscow.

The house, built 43 years ago, has been a landmark but on May 8 it was moved by the Modlin Moving company, Twin Falls, to another farm, three-fourths of a mile, west of its original location. Here it will be a home for Mr. and Mrs. Fred McCord and family.

RUPERT, May 23—An extensive road maintenance program is under way by both Rupert highway district and city of Rupert, Henry Creason, member of the highway district and city councilman, reported Friday.

One of the largest projects is the Cemetery road. The Rupert highway district has authorized widening the road two feet on each side and applying a new seal coat. The seal coat will be applied as soon after June 1 as weather permits, Creason said.

Other work by the highway district includes one and one-half miles of blacktop to be added on what is known as the "Pete Willie" road, and a half mile of blacktop near Tom Mabey's farm.

The city council has authorized a contract with Hoops Construction to blacktop all of the street east of "A" street. There are 23 blocks of gravel streets in that area to be surfaced. In addition, seal coating will be applied to 20 blocks needing repair. This will include a seal coat on the business district and various blocks in the residential sections.
