

On Charges 'Meat-Ax' Slash Made in U.S. Air Force Funds

WASHINGTON, May 25 (AP)—The House today charged that the "meat-ax" technique of cutting off appropriations for the Air Force was a deliberate attempt to slash the budget for the fiscal year beginning Oct. 1.

Gen. Hoyt B. Vandenberg, air force chief of staff, said he was present when the national security council decided the over-all defense budget but that "I was not asked my opinion and therefore did not give it."

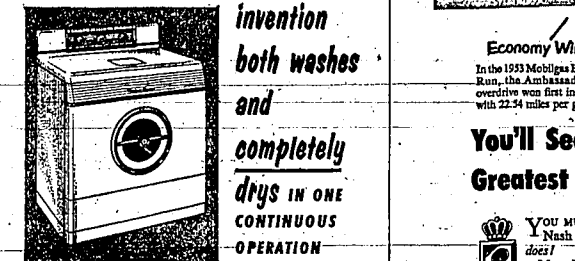

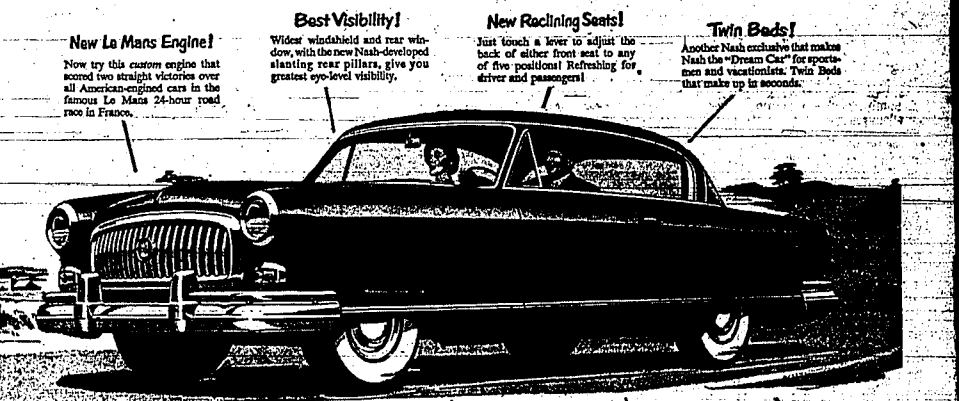

Liberal Ford Pay Contract Is Approved

DETROIT, May 25 (AP)—The Ford Motor company and the CIO United Auto Workers agreed early today on a new wage contract even more liberal than that agreed by General Motors and the UAW last week.

GM reduced its raise demands. Ford agreed to boost them from \$125, including social security payments, to \$137.50.

Pay Boosts
GM also granted skilled workers a flat 10-cent hourly increase. Ford agreed to raise skilled workers from 30 to 36 cents hourly, depending upon their classification.

Otherwise—Ford workers—got everything GM workers got, including an agreement on a switch from the government's old cost-of-living index to a new one the bureau of labor statistics says more nearly portrays actual costs under modern circumstances.

Reason for Hoping
Abandonment of the old index to which all auto contracts are tied, gave an opening for negotiation. GM started an historic signing of five-year contracts in 1950 that were tied to the cost-of-living as figured by the bureau of labor statistics.

The BLS announced it was abandoning the old system earlier this year but President Eisenhower ordered it continued until June as auto strikes threatened.

USDA Relates View on Need Of Protection

WASHINGTON, May 28 (AP)—The department of agriculture told the house banking committee Monday that so long as farm price support programs are continued the nation's farmers need protection against imports.

The statement came from Howard W. Gordon, administrator of the department's production and marketing administration.

Gordon also testified on a bill before the senate to give the government authority to impose a 50-day price freeze in the event of a national emergency.

Provides Restriction—The senate bill also provides that a section of the defense production act which restricts imports of fats and oils, butter, cheese and other dairy products, must be amended and should be allowed to lapse on June 30.

Gordon said "the executive branch had in the past failed to use general legislation dating from 1919 to restrict farm imports. This, he said, resulted in the special provisions of the defense production act covering dairy products.

General Protection—Gordon and promptly administered" the 1935 law could give agriculture general protection and that this should be used instead of special legislation applying only to a few products. For instance, he said, wool needs similar protection.

"The 1935 law provides for hearings before the tariff commission and restrictions in the form of quotas or import fees if the commission finds that imports are upsetting domestic agricultural programs.

Wrong Ideas on Cattlemen Cited

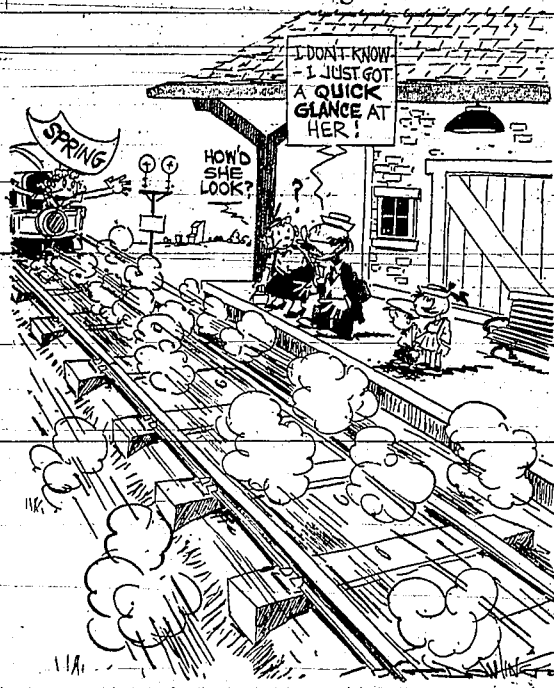
WASHINGTON, May 28 (AP)—The committee on agriculture today told the cattle industry to be misunderstood by the American people, a senate subcommittee was told Monday.

Both have been concerned largely with stories about "big spreads" — western ranches for huge ranches — and this has served to create the impression that most cattlemen are cattle barons, said Matt Ding, assistant legislative director of the American Farm Bureau federation.

In reality, Ding explained, most cattlemen are small operators, with relatively small incomes. Ding testified at a senate hearing on a bill which would set up uniform regulations for the raising of livestock on some 300 million acres of federal land.

Baptist Group Assails Solon Probe Tactics

DENVER, Colo., May 28 (AP)—The American Baptist convention, representing some 1,500,000 northern Baptists, yesterday sharply denounced "character assassination and guilty by association" techniques of congressional investigating committees.

The final session of the meeting of more than 3,000 delegates from 24 states adopted a resolution expressing "deep concern over the techniques used to curb freedom of inquiry and research and to silence debate upon the great public issues of our time."

In another resolution the Baptist convention approved President Eisenhower's apparent refusal to establish an American diplomatic post at the Vatican.

At the same session Dr. Winfield Edson, 45, pastor of the Long Beach, Calif. Baptist church, was nominated president of the national organization for the coming year. His was the only name submitted for the president.
