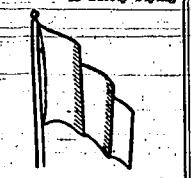

Net Operation Ends With 90 Per Cent of Insects Killed

May 28—Final reports from the Idaho State Department of Agriculture show that the net operation against the Colorado potato beetle in Blaine County of Idaho where the crickets averaged 400 to the square yard. An advance migratory onslaught of the insects was stopped in its early stages by the poisoned bait. Great amounts of the bait were dropped along highway 93 at the base of the mountain.

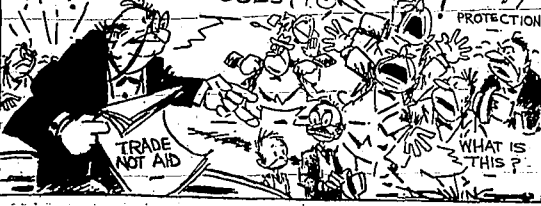

Carr compares the Sloan proposal in detail with an earlier plan submitted by the bureau of reclamation called the "Payette river plan." The latter would involve shipping water via a 30-mile tunnel from the Payette to the Boise river. It had been suggested that power revenue from a proposed canal at the Boise canyon dam be used to pay the high costs of the bureau's plan, under which 183,000 acres would be irrigated.

The high cost of the bureau's earlier proposal, however, as well as the danger of federal development of the Boise canyon mean some sort of alternative plan must be found for congress before any of the Mountain Home acreage can be developed.

Carr notes, "The alternate (Sloan) plan is economically justified, showing a net annual operating and maintenance benefit of \$10,773,000 to annual costs of \$2,208,000 or 4.7 to 1." He adds that the Sloan plan is "the most favorable ratio for the project compared with a ratio of 1 to 1 for the bureau's Payette plan, which is a fact that reservoir storage costs are not chargeable to the new project."

Budge said Carr's ratio on the Sloan report that "this is the best benefit-to-cost ratio ever seen for a project in probably 20 years."

Carr does feel, however, that Sloan has underestimated certain costs and says: "Operation, maintenance, and replacement costs are estimated in this report at \$40,741 annually, or \$5.64 per acre as compared to costs of \$47,182 annually and \$2.84 per acre in the Sloan report. Any increase in the number of wells on the pumping required to obtain the water supply will, of course, result in an increase in these costs."

Carr estimates the investment per acre under the Sloan plan at \$410, as against the bureau's figure of \$1,900. Total cost of the Sloan plan would be \$54,044,000.
