CUSTER STATE PARK, S. D., July 12 (AP)—President Eisenhower says "creeping socialism struck at the United States during the last 20 years of Democratic administration" and that the nation runs a grave risk "if that group takes over again."

The President swatted the political opposition in an informal talk last night to about 500 South Dakota Republican leaders a few hours after arriving here from nearby Mt. Rushmore where he told another GOP rally his administration has made a "good beginning toward a regime serving the interests and needs of all our citizens."

Canal Company Personnel Use New Radio Equipment



Savings in time—a priceless commodity in the event of a canal break or drowning—will be possible for Twin Falls Canal company through its new two-way radio system. The system, installed at company offices and in five company vehicles, puts water masters and crew supervisors in touch with immediate aid in event of an emergency.

And it will mean better service to the company's stockholders. No longer will crew supervisors locate ditch riders by telephone. Messages will be dispatched by radio to field crews who will investigate problems.

Mrs. Marguerite Conant, company secretary, will be in charge of the radio equipment which will be in operation from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. five and one-half days a week. Licenses for the equipment has been granted by the federal communications commission in Washington, D. C. Individual call letters are expected to be assigned shortly.

The new equipment is expected to be a boon in repairing equipment breaking down in the field. Situations can quickly be sized up, reported to the company office and parts dispatched to the scene in less time than ever before possible.

Future expansion of the company's radio facilities to include dam sites at Miller and Murtaugh lake and possibly at company diversion points is seen by Alfred Peters, company manager.

He notes company radio equipment is powerful enough to handle any future expansion program. Any point on the canal company's system is within easy reach of the company's transmitter. Radio facilities can cover an area as far north as Shoshone, south to Rogerson, west to Gastfriend and east to Burley.

Radio signals will be transmitted from a 50-foot steel tower atop the company's Twin Falls office. Equipment was installed by the Yerkes Communications Radio service and has been in operation since Tuesday.

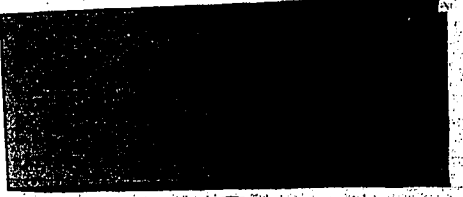
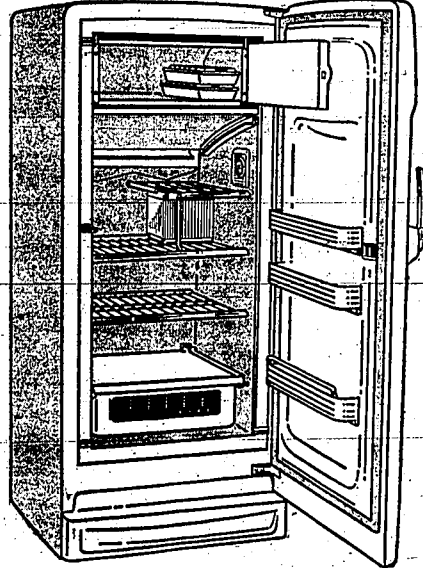

Mapping Project Started in Alaska

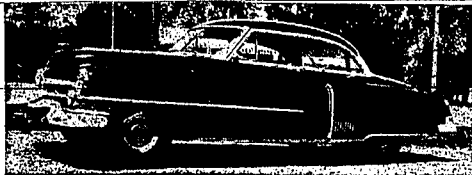
