Maxwell was one of the duty infantrymen crawling out of his bunker today by a warm July sun and a lack of enemy activity. The men sprawled relaxed on the back slope of the shell-worn front line.

"It's funny," he said, "they're shooting hell out of the 80s, but we're not getting a thing."

"Then he grinned. "It they don't want to fight us, that's all right with me," he said. "Let 'em shoot."

### Toll Spreads For Weather Over Nation

More than 20 persons were missing or dead today in boating tragedies and electrocutions caused by a thunderstorm wind squall in a flash flood and swimming accidents.

Meanwhile, the eastern two-thirds of the country smoldered in a humid heat wave—and the weatherman said there would be no relief before the July 4 holiday.

Forecasters also warned that millions of dollars' worth of crops would be brought-stricken southwest where an end in much of the area. At least six weather-caused deaths yesterday, most of them in boating accidents, were counted Tuesday.

A family tragedy took place at Pleasanton, Mont., when Box Elder creek spilled out of its banks in a flash flood and trapped Mrs. Don Logan and her son, Alvin, 14, in the basement of their home. The flood also surrounded about 100 homes with water and caused an estimated \$500,000 damage.

The heat wave was at its worst in the Midwest after hot humid air from the southwest blew into the area. A high of 97 was forecast for Chicago today after the temperature reached 92 yesterday, shattering a 50-year-old June 30 heat record. Another record was set at Tucson, Ariz., when the mercury reached 102.3. It was 98 at Milwaukee, Wis.

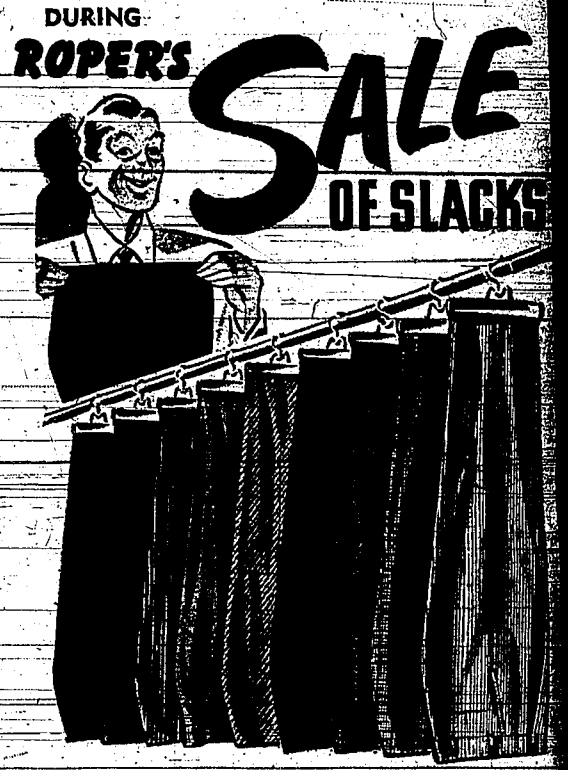

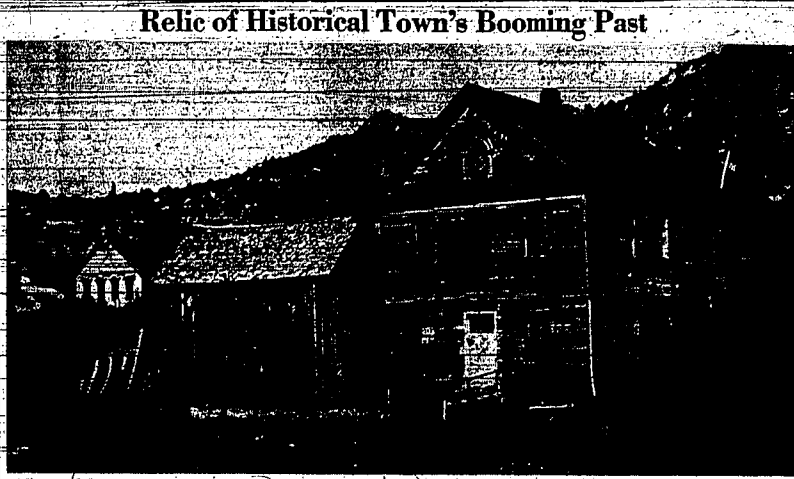

### Town in High Owyhee Mountains Now Mere Shadow of Gold Boom Day Glory

Some will call it just another ghost town. Others will imagine like the sunny one you've picked for it as it once was. Still others—those who lived in its houses, attended its schools, shopped in its stores—will say it's not the home they know, its glory is spent.

It's Silver City, locked in the high Owyhee mountains in the heart of Idaho. It once was one of the state's leading communities, with the mother lode and boasted over 10,000 residents.

It's a mere shadow now of the booming mining camp it was during the Civil war and the city it became in the half century that followed. It once was the seat of Owyhee county and many persons famed in Idaho lore called it home.

Now a light gust of wind swirls the dust on the vacant streets. The dust is symbolic. Once it must have been ankle deep on these hilly streets. That would be in summer

of course, on an earlier day much like the sunny one you've picked for your visit.

But more interesting things await your imagination.

Down the street to your left are several weather-beaten, dilapidated wooden buildings. Ahead, and to your right, "Rexco," a new, vacant block lies there or the same.

Only two nearby structures show any life. A "fairly recent" sign proclaims "Idaho hotel and bar" to your left. To your right is another bar with open doors, inviting you inside.

Around the corner behind the bar are more old buildings, the old drug store, the grocery store, a grocery, dotted here and there around the hillside are homes.

Those and most others are locked and barricaded now, their interiors hidden behind sometimes torn and awry blinds, or maybe an old adver-

once towned with the activity of pioneer day commerce, you look around. North across the narrow canyon is a still impressive wooden building, the Masonic emblem shows prominently on the front.

Farther up the opposite hill is an ornate mansion. It is a severely weather-beaten tower. A neat, pointed home sits in front of one side. To the left and another one is an equally weather-beaten church. It's grand tower.

And between them, but down closer to the town proper, is the school. Higher on the hills are the grey ballings of old mines, contrasting sharply with the sun-scoured hillsides.

Feeling of the lone and its isolated location, "Silver City" is a most curious example of "mining town" living. And its high, dry air is proving a welcoming invitation for children too warm in Boise valley. They and others are giving it new promise as a "place to go" for a week-end or a few days away from the bustle and bustle.

The curious may become impatient by the locked and barred doors and the covered windows. But enough are unbarred—to permit good inspection.

In the hotel can be seen the fading grandeur of its tremendous bar, having lobby and now outmoded sturdiness.

The bar with the open door is spotted here and there inside with modern furniture. They are incongruous against the wooden walls.

But to the romantically inclined, the best sport is to trudge the paths, inspect what buildings are open and explore as much as you can.

You can climb the hills to the old

mines and poke around. Or you can go west of the town to the old grave yard. It has a fascination only those of historical bent can understand.

If you visit Silver City, start early. It's a rough road. From the north you enter it over three mountain passes and some canyons. You think you've made a mistake, but suddenly you pass an old power house, turn a corner and there you are.

The trip over the route is an experience in itself. Take it in daylight, the road is not suited for night driving.

You can gaze over thousands of acres of rugged Idaho. They appear never to have been disturbed by man. But a closer inspection reveals trails here and there.

Cattle and sheep graze in those hollows and meadows, fishermen place their streams, and the adventurous side horses along horse trails just for fun.

To reach that rough road with its awe-inspiring sights travel south from Mountain Home past the old town base, turn right past Grandview to Murphy. That's where you'll get used to dust. From Boise valley the trip is easier. Murphy, now the Owyhee county seat, is reached on hard-surfaced state highway 40. But you still have the mountains to cross from there.

You miss the high mountain

passed, but see others by entering from the east. U. S. 96 at Jordan Valley for that route.

Whatever your route, you'll have a fine occasion to pause and wonder at the pioneer fortitude that has made possible a nature to be seen in the mountains.

The senate appropriations committee sustained a \$420,000 cut by the house in the department of education. NEA officials contended that would result in an immediate reduction of the staff members.

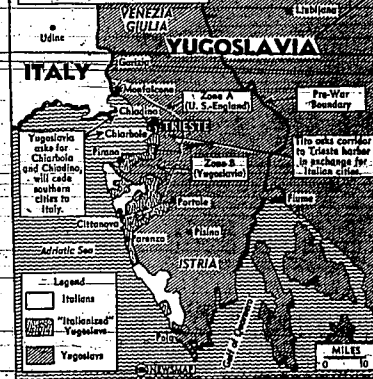
Under the department budget for this department was \$2,000,000. The Truman administration recommended \$2,200,000.

### Tito Seeks Trieste Action

Trieste, because of its strategic location, has been fought over for centuries. Austria claimed the territory for 100 years before it was lost to Italy after World War I. Hitler grabbed Trieste during World War II and lost it to Italy in 1945. In 1946 they compromised on a "free territory of Trieste" under UN supervision, occupied jointly by Italy and the U.S. Since then they've attempted to settle the problem but have been disappointed by both Italy and Yugoslavia.



Marshal Tito, taking advantage of Premier Alcide De Gasperi's shaky and narrow victory in the recent Italian election, has started pressing for a solution to the Trieste problem. Newsmap shows what steps the Yugoslavs want taken to help solve the seven-year-old dilemma. Experts feel that because of the weakness of the Italian government the plan to give some A (including the port of Trieste) to Italy is no longer feasible. However, an Italian foreign ministry spokesman said that his country still insists on Trieste's return, which was suggested by the Big Three in 1945. There appears to be growing support for an independent free territory of some A and B, under a governor appointed by the UN. This is a feeling harbored by many Triesteans who are as opposed to Italian bureaucracy as they are to Tito's communism.

# Release of Catholic Cardinal Believed Forthcoming in Soviet Peace Campaign

 Twin Falls, July 11.—Many Catholics here believe that the release of Cardinal Mindszenty, prisoner of war, is a condition for the Soviet peace campaign.

With Cardinal Mindszenty and Archbishop Jozsef Csernok in jail, the archbishop is the de facto head of the church. He was pleased to attend the world peace council at a delegate from Hungary and his speech to the communist front organization was carefully timed and recorded in its entirety so that maximum value could be extracted.

Most of the 3,000 priests in Hungary have been forced to become members of the peace movement but every so often attacks appear in the communist press against individual priests for not playing an active enough role or not attending peace meetings.

Attendance in churches has not dropped since the Mindszenty conviction and recently more youth have

been noticed among congregations. A well-known reason for this is the government, having broken the church, has not put many bars in the way of attendance.

The faith of the people can best be judged by what one priest told me in a small "parish" church in Budapest. Some 10,000 fortunes are made each year in Hungary and at least eight people were put into the poor box alone.
