The protest against the premier's rumored plans for government economic work was France's worst strike since the 1936 days of socialist Jean Blum's popular front government.

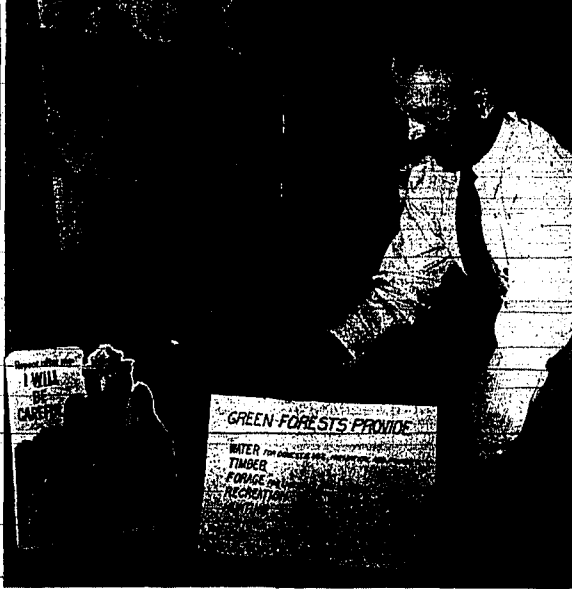

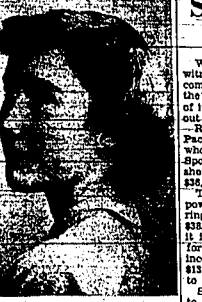

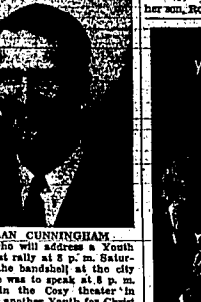

Farm Prices In Idaho Dip

BOISE, Aug. 7 (AP)—Prices received by Idaho farmers last month were the lowest since June, according to the U. S. department of agriculture, said today.

The department's index of agricultural prices for Idaho stood at 108.7 in July, a decline of 1.3 points from mid-June.

Wheat declined 1 cent a bushel, hay \$1.00 per ton, potatoes 35 cents per bushel, lamb \$1.70 per hundredweight, cattle 80 cents per hundredweight, and pigs 65 cents per hundredweight. Butterfat, 194 clover seed and barley prices also dropped.

Prices increased from June to July for hops, up 120 per hundred weight; eggs, 5 cents a dozen; dry beans, \$1.00 per hundred pounds, and wool, 1 cent per pound.
