Events of Week May Settle S. Crop Pay Plans

WASHINGTON, Aug. 8 (AP)—The coming week may show how far the Eisenhower administration will have to go next year in applying crop controls it has pledged to hold to a minimum. On Monday the agriculture department will release the first official estimate of the size of this year's cotton crop. Should it exceed 12,000,000 bales, controls on the 1954 crop would appear unavoidable.

Another report, to be issued Tuesday, will give the latest forecast of the corn crop. Should it exceed 3,400,000,000 bushels, controls would be considered for this crop next year. A forecast of 3,400,000,000 bushels for the corn crop at 3,330,000,000 bushels.

On Friday growers will vote in a nationwide referendum on a rigid marketing quotas for next year's wheat crop. Proclaimed recently by Secretary of Agriculture Benson, the quotas must be approved by at least two-thirds of the growers before they become effective.

Both the GOP platform and President Eisenhower are on record in favor of a "minimum of controls on farmers."

The action in invoking controls on wheat, plus prospects of similar controls on cotton and corn, were made necessary by the accumulation of large surpluses from recent years. The law makes it mandatory to impose controls when supplies exceed a "minimum of controls on farmers."

Controls in effect this year on one-third of the wheat crop will carry over on next year's crop. In addition, Benson has announced plans to restrict production of surplus wheat in 1954 and in 1955.

"Friday's wheat referendum has important political and economic implications," said a spokesman.

Malenkov Declares Russia Has Broken H-Bomb 'Monopoly'

MOSCOW, Aug. 8 (AP)—Premier Georgi Malenkov said today "the United States no longer has the monopoly of the hydrogen bomb" and the Soviet union has mastered production of that super weapon. He made the announcement in a surprise speech on Russian world affairs—including the purge of Deputy Premier Lavrenty P. Beria—before a session of the supreme soviet (parliament). The 1,300 legislators of the supreme soviet are expected to meet in the next few days.

"The trans-Atlantic 'emblem' is said to have been tested in the Soviet Union," Malenkov declared. "It is a powerful weapon that is a bomb and has the monopoly of hydrogen bomb." Malenkov said that the Soviet Union had broken the "monopoly" of the hydrogen bomb.

U. S. Experts Doubt Russ Produced Bomb

WASHINGTON, Aug. 8 (AP)—Russia may have mastered the secret of the hydrogen bomb, but American experts doubt that the Soviet union actually has produced one of those terrible weapons.

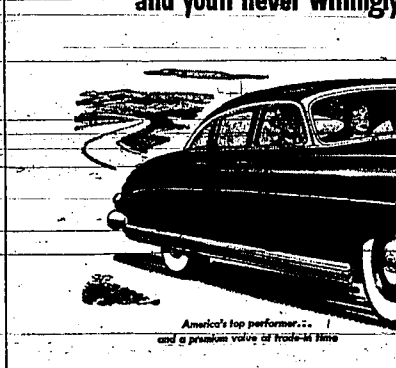

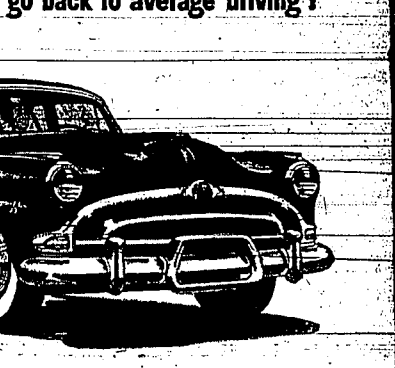

F. Woman Manufactures Homemade Kaleidoscopes

A hobby should make others happy as well as oneself," is the philosophy of Mrs. Charles E. Beymer, during light of a hobbying fancy for Mrs. Beymer has been spending her leisure time converting glass, cardboard tubes and assorted odds and ends into kaleidoscopes, which already have been donated to the cerebral palsy school.

After she had made a secret venture through a kaleidoscope, however, Mrs. Beymer and several of her friends have received the kaleidoscope in the dining room of the home.

Mrs. Beymer learned this hobby on a Colorado Springs woman, who had made 80 of the kaleidoscopes and ends into kaleidoscopes, which she covered with colored paper. Mrs. Beymer simplified the home by decorating the kaleidoscope with leftover housepaint and oil paint.

The essentials of a homemade kaleidoscope include plate glass, cut by 1 3/4 inches; white cardboard, 1 3/4 by 8 inches; a round piece of cardboard of the stocking box variety, 2 inches in diameter and covered with a hole through which the "looky" two round pieces of colored, one 2 inches in diameter and the other slightly smaller, and a cardboard tube.

Mrs. Beymer paints the glass on one side to obtain a mirror effect. She then inserts a paper fastener, together, two pieces of brass and one of cardboard to form a frame which will go the length of the tube.

The cardboard tubes, which originally hold glass, are broken apart from a department store, about a yard long, they are cut for "mirror pieces" 6 1/2 inches long by 2 1/2 inches wide.

The triangular object of two pieces of mirrored glass and one of cardboard is placed in the hole of the tube, which is sealed to the outside so that one cannot see right through. The hole is sealed at the end by the special glue.

Within the 1/2-inch space, Mrs. Beymer places the small objects which form the kaleidoscope patterns. A typical example might include a triangle of red, one which is glass beads, colored aluminum foil, an eye from a book and a black lace, a twisted end of a

course stem, knotted yarn, sequins and cellophane strips from Easter baskets.

Color pieces and bits of colored straw also may be used.

"It's always fun to try out different things to see how they work," Mrs. Beymer claims of her pattern-making objects, which must be tiny so as to form dainty patterns.

According to her Colorado instructor, the music for the kaleidoscope patterns are black lace, the eye (hook) and color pieces.

"Otherwise, any kaleidoscope manufacturer may let her fancy dictate," Mrs. Beymer says, "you're eyeing your friends' homes and jewelry to see if there's anything that would look pretty in a kaleidoscope."

Mrs. Sadie Nichols, Mountain Home, came to the Wood River country by stagecoach from Kelton, Utah, in 1881. "It took me 11 days

to make the trip from New York to Boise—and my heart was in my mouth a good part of the time," she said.

An oldtimer who hasn't traveled far from Halley except to visit her married children is Mrs. Jim Jones. She came in a covered wagon drawn by Texas ponies in 1887.

The worst part of the trip was fording the river," she says, "we lost many horses and one wagon leaving streams.

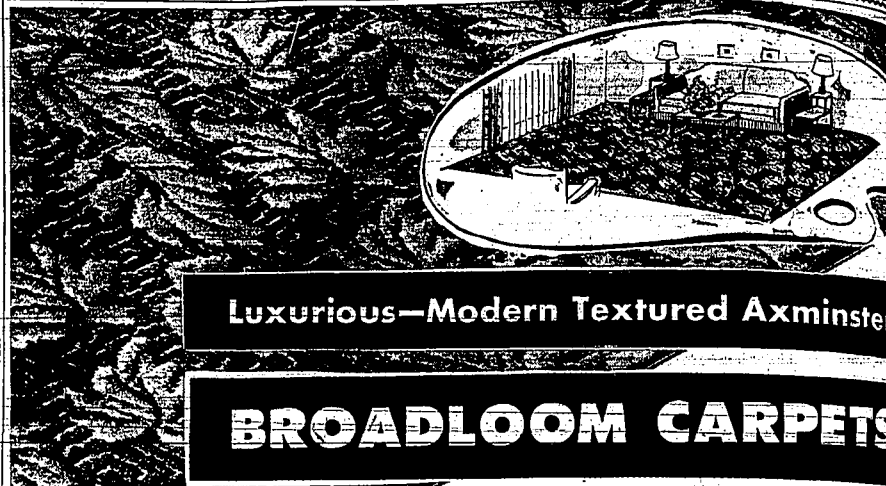
For the second time, Mrs. M. F. Cunningham won the prize for being the oldest woman present. Born in 1868, she is on the job every day as Halley city librarian.
