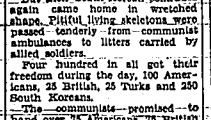

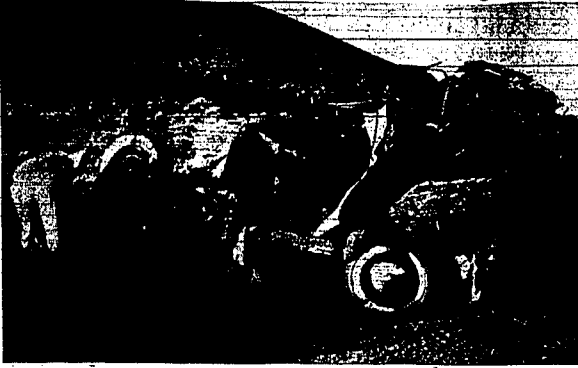

'Bundles for Congress' Ruckus Ends in Good Pension System

WASHINGTON, Aug. 12 (AP)—The "bundles for congress" ruckus, which poured in on unhappy senators and house members after they voted themselves a pension system in 1942?

The indignation was so outpoken that congress repealed the law just six weeks after it was passed.

But the lawmakers calmly tried again in 1946—enacting another pension plan for themselves as part of a general congressional reorganization in the La Follette-Monroney act.

And the 1946 idea has worked so well, Senator Monroney, D. Okla., said today that contributors to it from the legislators' salaries have totaled more than double the retirement benefits paid out.

In seven years, members of congress have paid 2 1/2 million dollars into their retirement system. One million has gone out in pension checks.

Monroney said there was little doubt the congressional pension plan would not be actuarially sound except for one thing:

"We in congress usually are extremely reluctant to retire as long as we are physically able to carry on the work."

So, many senators and house members hold on to their seats and continue paying into the retirement fund. At a time when most other men are enjoying the pensions they have built up over the years.

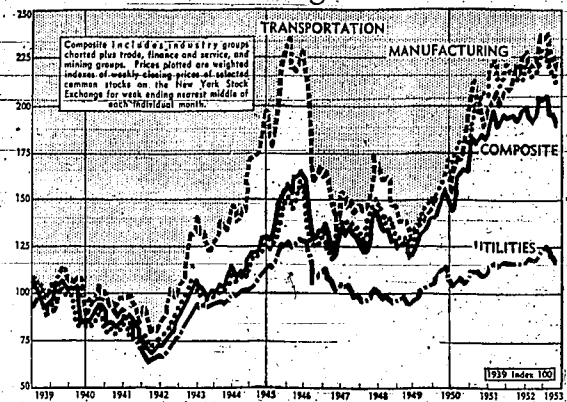

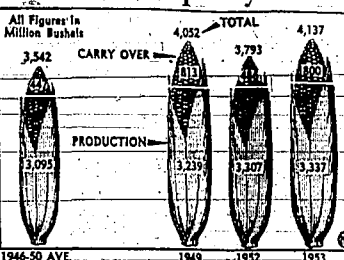

Germ Attacks Main Danger; Savant Avows

WASHINGTON, Aug. 12 (AP)—A defense avowed today that biological warfare poses a deadlier threat to mankind than the hydrogen bomb. But defense officials sharply disputed the statement.

Prof. George Gamow of Georgia Institute of Technology, a world-famous nuclear physicist, said a reactor the H-bomb Russia now aims to possess is "not the weapon to be feared most in the modern arsenal of mass killers."

More Damage

"Biological warfare would be more," he said. "In other destructions—atomic, hydrogen—the damage could do more damage than an H-bomb."

Defense department spokesmen said they did not share Gamow's view, and asserted this country has excellent defenses against germ warfare.

"Nobody is worried about the possibility of a devastating bacteriological attack," one Pentagon official said.

Officials refused to say how much information, if any, U. S. intelligence agencies have been able to obtain about Russian progress in germ weapons. Nor would they discuss a country's own program, which is conducted under conditions of extreme secrecy at Camp Detrick, Md.

It is U. S. policy to treat germ weapons like poison gas—that is, that country will not react to them "until the enemy does so first. But the army evidently feels power to retaliate strongly is the best insurance against enemy use of such weapons."

He also said it would take one billion dollars to rehabilitate his war-torn country to prewar level.

Relief Starter

Dr. You Chan Yang, here to take part in ceremonies with loading of the first relief supplies for Korea, said Korea has 10 million without homes, 200,000 orphans and 10,000 known amputees as a result of the war.

He urged that the U.N. insist on truce arrangement with "some teeth in it" to make the communists stick to their promises.

"Judging from past experience," he said, "the only time the communists are sincere in talking about peace in the world is when they are talking about peace by conquest."

70,000 Held Back

Yang also said Korean intelligence reports indicate some United States and Chinese soldiers and South Koreans are being held back by the Chinese—reds—and he said some "have been sent to Siberia as Siberia, and Manchuria to work on industrial projects instead of being included in the prisoner exchange."

He said he would "go along" with the idea of holding communists prisoners in custody, until all United Nations troops have been returned.

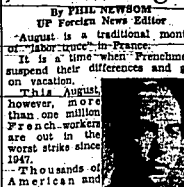

Test Posed in Reds Holding Of Prisoners

The United States and the United Nations face a very serious prospect—initial reports of Chinese release of war-prisoners turn out to be false.

President Eisenhower and Secretary Dulles, by their instant scolding of the problem, indicate the evidence is piling up that the Reds are holding the true agreement on release of prisoners.

It is much too early to pass final judgment, however, in the near-future conditions which exist in North Korea and in certain portions of the red armies, foul-ups in such an exchange operation would be bound to occur even with the greatest of goodwill.

The communists already appear to be laying grounds for the defense, when the matter comes before either the U. N. or the Korean political conference, that many prisoners are dead. The only cases the allies can press will be those actually named by representatives as having been left behind at specific camps.

Allied diplomats even then can save themselves time in the face of their own unwillingness to get into getting any satisfaction, just as they have about the German prisoners in Russia since World War II.

What will the West be able to do when it will be facing a great test, before the Orientals would—its highly proclaimed regard for the individual.

Tito Pledges Yugoslavs Will Not Return to Soviet's Orbit

BRNO, Czechoslovakia, Aug. 12 (AP)—President Joseph Tito pledged Tuesday that communist Yugoslavia never will return to Russian domination, predicted red China eventually will pursue an "absolutely independent policy," and said prospects for avoiding a third world war look better now.

Marshal Tito, in an exclusive interview with the Associated Press, answered spontaneously more than a score of questions about world and domestic affairs.

His answers reflected confidence tempered by some caution—that both are improving.

Right at the outset, he made it clear that Yugoslavia never will return to the position of close cooperation with Russia.

"No matter how the Soviet union changes its foreign policy in the direction of improving relations and approaching settlement of all international questions by way of agreement, Yugoslavia never would return to its previous position, that is, to the policy of cooperating with the Soviet union on all questions regardless of whether such cooperation is in the interests of Yugoslavia or in harmony with the desires of a peaceful nation," he said, adding, however:

"Yugoslavia wants normal relations with the Soviet union just as she wants them with all countries in the world."

Would Yugoslavia even consider rejoining the cominform if the cominform abandoned its position of hostility toward his country?

"That's impossible," he said flatly.

Tito avoided a direct answer on whether recent developments in Russia would produce a change in Russia's policy.

Tito was asked whether Malenkov or the red army was the real

boss of Russia now. He expressed belief that it was neither one nor the other, adding:

"The Russian leaders are now following the policy of strict neutrality to the party of letting it have the leading role."

He doubted that any internal difficulties "could push the Soviet leaders into waging war or sharpening international relations. I think Stalin's death and the eternal that followed it have in a certain sense decreased prospects of war and aggression by the Soviet union."

Of the truce in Korea, Tito said he believed the peace conference, although it will not be able to settle the problem in its entirety, will nevertheless in a certain sense consolidate what has been achieved so far, that is the avoidance of future conflicts there."

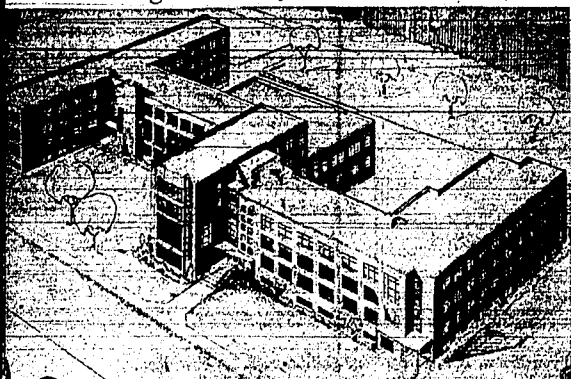

Production of First '54 Model Cars Planned for Late August

 DETROIT, Aug. 12 (AP)—The auto industry's first 1954 model cars are scheduled to reach the production line late this month.



From that point on each month will see more new models until after the beginning of next year. Some companies working on new model changeover plans right now indicate they will attempt the switch to 1954 cars with no assembly line shutdowns.

This can be done with models involving no major design changes. Where extensive restooling is necessary the production lines will have to be closed from two to three weeks or more.

Some extensive restooling is planned by two or three companies, indicating marked changes in their new models. At least one company involved in these plans hopes to keep its 1953 model in production right through to the end of the present year.

The current restooling of several car makers includes some heavy equipment needed in the machining of new engines as well as to the construction of frames and bodies. Several companies also have changes in the casting facilities.

Even with minor alterations, model changeovers involve heavy outlays by the manufacturers. They usually are counted in the hundreds of thousands of dollars. Major changes involve expenditures running into millions.

It now appears heavy investments in new tooling will be an annual affair with the auto makers. At least some major changes are looked for each year. For competitive reasons the car makers usually like to have something of advanced design to introduce each year. At the

same time restooling for major overall changes has become so costly that basic styling and design usually are retained for a three-year period.

And because it usually takes 18 months and more to get a new design from the drawing board to the assembly line major changes some times have to be made in the face of adverse market conditions.

You can't get a major car manufacturer to admit any adverse conditions are in immediate prospect for the auto industry. It is true, however, that excepting for last year, under strict governmental output control, the auto industry has been roaring along in high gear since the start of 1933.

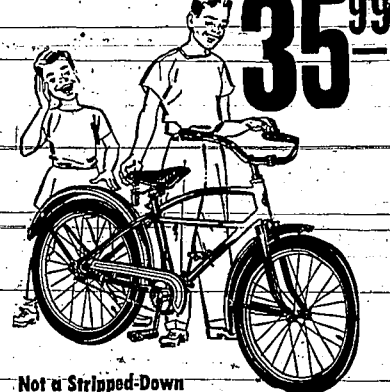

his own expense because it was good farming to do so. They greatly increased his yields and hence increased his income.

Benson took this view, but Congress, in appropriating funds for the 1954 program, asked that the lime and fertilizer payments be continued.

Accordingly, farmers next year will be able to get these materials with the government paying up to half the cost, but only under limited conditions.

"They will be available for use on land subject to erosion, provided it is needed to grasses and legumes, but only for the initial application. Any additional applications would have to be financed by the farmer.

They also will be available for land to be used in 1954 for cash crops, providing the land is put to grasses and legumes in 1953. Only in the initial application will the government share the cost.

"Federal contributions on lime and fertilizers for grasses and pastures are justified on the basis that such uses of the land bring farmers no immediate returns, but do help protect land for production of food at a future time when increased supplies will be needed by the nation. In limiting lime and fertilizer payments to the initial application, Benson has taken the position that once the government helps a farmer establish a conservation practice on his farm he should assume full responsibility for its upkeep and maintenance.

Because of the tighter regulations, the applications for ACP help next year may decline somewhat. This

185 million dollars appropriated by congress may not have as many takers as did this year's more liberal 200-million-dollar program.

In an effort to get farmers to maintain conservation practices performed in the past with federal aid, the secretary has instructed that future aid be withheld from negligent farmers.

"The failure to maintain practices carried out under the previous program may be regarded as a practice defeating the purposes of the program. Under this provision, all or any part of the federal cost-share... due to a person under the 1954 program could be withheld if he failed to maintain during the 1954 program year a practice... carried out under a previous program."

"In a recent report, the agency... reflecting his dislike for subsidies, Benson has instructed officials to stop the use of words "payments" and "assistance" in referring to the financial grants. Instead, they are to be referred to as "federal cost-share" or "federal cost-sharing."

"The agricultural conservation program," he said, "is an offer on the part of the federal government to share with farmers the cost of carrying out needed conservation measures."

"The fundamental purpose of the agricultural conservation program is to provide a means by which the public can share with land owners and operators the cost of carrying out needed conservation work over and above that which they would do with only their own resources."

"The end sought, he said, is not a one-shot improvement in farm income, but an improvement in the nation's farms and ranches so they might meet the food needs of the future and at the same time contribute to long-term agricultural prosperity."

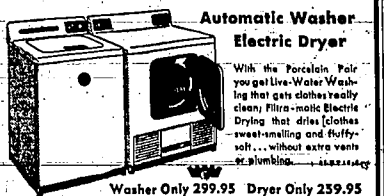
