## S. Blasts Russ Call for Conclave On Reich Treaty

WASHINGTON, Aug. 17 (AP)—The State Department today called for a big four conference on the German peace treaty within six months.

The Soviet Union also called for free German elections without foreign supervision and a "German World War II debt."

These Russian desires were made known yesterday when the Soviet government announced that it would accept the German peace treaty within six months.

The note argued that to answer preliminary talks should begin immediately with the Germans sitting down to the negotiations.

It also proposed that the East and West German parliaments meet in Bonn to discuss a unified provisional government to take part in preparing the peace treaty and to elect a government.

The big four conference on the treaty should be held within six months, the note said.

It proposed that Germany cease military production by Jan. 1, 1954, and that all of Germany's postwar debts except those on the trade agreements be canceled.

Occupation costs should not exceed five per cent of the combined East and West German budgets, the note said.

Monday morning newspapers said the Soviet note had invited an East German delegation to visit Moscow.

## POWs Claim Reds Bolster Air Strength

PANMUNJOM, Korea, Aug. 17 (AP)—Returning American prisoners accused the communists today of building strong new air force in North Korea in violation of the armistice agreement.

The information that the Reds were using the captured prisoners' aerial gunnery was offered after 78 American men went through "freedom gate" as "operation switch" neared the halfway mark.

The freed prisoners said they saw new, twin-engine, five wing jet bombers put on a show over the North Korean capital of Pyongyang after the armistice had been signed.

Terms of the armistice stipulated that military aircraft would be destroyed and that no military potential during the truce.

## Eight Postoffices for Valley Are "Eligible"

WASHINGTON, Aug. 17 (Special)—Long-awaited postoffices in Twin Falls and seven other Magic Valley communities came a step closer in the last session of congress. The house public works committee included them on a list of eligible building projects for Idaho.

### Higher Wool Price Is Seen For '53 Crop

WASHINGTON, Aug. 17 (AP)—The agriculture department said today American wool growers probably will receive slightly higher prices this season.

A report on the wool situation prepared by the bureau of agriculture economics, said prices this marketing season have averaged slightly above the government support price of 53.1 cents per pound.

"The average for the season probably will be slightly above that of last season," the department said.

It said a general increase in wool prices on the world markets has occurred since early 1952. It attributed this to strengthening of world demand, movement of a "substantial" amount of the domestic U. S. production into the government loan program and additions to the stockpile in England.

The commodity credit corporation acquired about 101 million pounds of wool under the 1952 price support program. As of July 31, about 27,400,000 pounds of the 1953 wool production were under CCC loan.
