

## Federal Power Policy Cuts U.S. Role, Boosts Local Control

WASHINGTON, Aug. 18 (AP)—The department today announced a new policy designed to encourage the development of local power resources and to increase the role of private citizens in the development of the nation's electric power resources. The new policy will be based on the principle that the federal government should cooperate in an effort actively to encourage the development of the natural resources of the country. "I approve fully of this policy, and the various cabinet departments have expressed, after careful review, their approval of the new program. It is my hope and my considered belief that, translated into action, this policy will serve the best interests of all the people of the United States."

**Care of Your Children**  
 By ANGELO PATRI  
 Parents and teachers have a difficult and complicated task in the direction and control of children. During the first two years of a child's life his mother acts and thinks for him, but after that he begins to be independent. He may make trouble for himself and others, so guiding and controlling him is important. Sometimes it seems to call for almost the wisdom of a Solomon.  
 As a child grows, he acts as if he is his own master. What he does is based for him, and parents and teachers are confronted with the delicate task of curbing his conduct in himself. If he has had the right guidance, he is likely to listen and come close to obeying. If he has been spoiled, getting him on the right road is difficult for both parents and teachers.  
 A child can be trained to obey. We can guard him, police him, so that he stays within the bounds we set; but until we manage to reach his mind and influence him to do it—right, and he hungers for gratification, he will do what he wants to do—immediately—parents and teachers are off guard.  
 How can we reach his mind so that he will willingly behave as he knows we want him to? Few of us are actually wise enough to answer that question, for the answer rests in the child's heritage: an environment, home background, training, and hidden influences that we can only guess at—all have power to influence the child. We must act directly at his will, and once we succeed in that we that he wants to please by obedience, our task has been virtually accomplished.  
 How to persuade a child to think our way, I cannot say. I know how.
