## Russian Bomb Gain Reduces Power of U. S.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 21 (AP)—The Soviet H-bomb and A-bomb have destroyed much of the U. S. atomic deterrent power, according to a report from a top U. S. atomic official. The report, which is being kept secret, says that the Soviet Union has gained a significant advantage in the atomic race. The report states that the Soviet Union has developed a hydrogen bomb, which is a much more powerful weapon than the atomic bomb. It also states that the Soviet Union has developed a method for producing atomic energy in large quantities, which would allow it to produce atomic weapons at a much faster rate than the United States.
