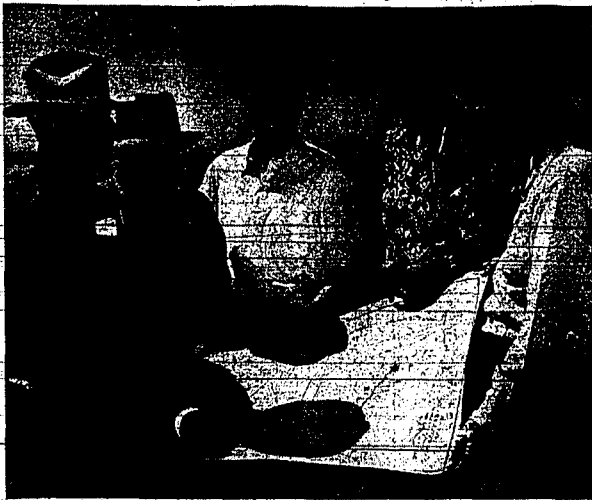

WASHINGTON, Aug. 27 (AP)—That now familiar refrain "I refuse to answer on the ground it might tend to incriminate me" appeared to be headed for a new test in the courts.

Senator McCarthy, R., Wis., is threatening a court test in an attempt to limit the situations in which it may be used.

Countless times since congress began looking into subversive activities, one witness or another has given this response instead of answering questions about alleged communist or pro-communist activities.

Bargain-Basement Treaty for U. S., Spain Nears Final Okay

Spain, whose services and supplies have been an international market since 1940; it is to sign a bargain-basement treaty with the United States.

Under the terms of the agreement, the United States will provide some \$100 million in military equipment and economic assistance over a four-year period. In return, Spain will give the U. S. the use, for 10 years, of four

airbases and a naval base at Cadix; shepherds and rangelands rights and an option for two extensions of five years each.

For Spain that price tag represents a 13 years ago, when Franco's army entered the war at Hitler's side for this tidy consideration: Gibraltar, French Morocco, those parts of Algeria mostly colonized and inhabited by Spaniards, and a grant of Rio de Oro and the colonies in the Gulf of Guinea plus supply of the necessary military and other assistance required for the war.

Hitler turned down that offer because the price was too high. In the interim Spain dickered

Retirement Isn't Just Fishing, Fun for Aged, Studies Reveal

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 27 (U.P.)—Those future retirement days may not just be fishing and fun. In fact, you may even have to be taught how to relax and enjoy all that leisure time.

The experts say the wealthier you are, the less receptive you'll be to taking things easy. They've got figures to prove that all those plans of traveling, visiting with the grandchildren and just plain enjoying life don't pan out.

They came up with some startling facts Tuesday at the convention of the Gerontological Society, attended by medical and social scientists studying diseases and problems of the ever increasing numbers of older Americans.

About 75 per cent of business executives don't want to retire, said Harold R. Hall, a Wellesley Hill, Mass., business consultant.

Hall—a former Harvard professor—learned in interviews with some 500 top-drawee executives that it isn't

money but work that keeps the successful man happy.

"He explained the typical giant want to leave their associates give up the prestige and power of their position, and most of all—be benched from the 'team' with which they worked for so many years."

He and other speakers suggested that companies prepare their personnel for retirement by setting-up conditioning programs a few years in advance to show them how to spend their leisure time.

Retirement to many wealthy people, Hall said, is disastrous and they procrastinate in planning for it. They think: "The company won't do this to me." It does.

Dr. J. R. Bunsel and Louis Gare of the New York mayor's advisory committee for the aged, declared many people can't enjoy their retirement income because they compare it to previous earnings.
